Ms. Fowler commented that there is a reference to practice monitoring or corrective measure in the language of the Consent Agreement, noting it does not specify the corrective measures and requested more information.

Mr. Henderson explained that the practice monitoring or corrective actions are a sanction available under Section 4.1(b)(3) and (6) of the Dental Law, where it basically operates as a sanction under the act and is going to be reported to the National Practitioner Databank.

Mr. Henderson stated they would be able to initiate action by a Petition for Appropriate Relief for violations of the conditions and terms of the agreement as done in other circumstances. He further explained that the corrective measures include an evaluator on a quarterly basis to evaluate the respondents and their practice activities and the remedial education under the subsection.

Mr. Henderson stated evaluators would be submitting reports to the Bureau of Enforcement and Investigation for their review to determine whether their infection control practices are being followed.

Ms. Fowler referred to Case No. 22-46-001111, noting it says practice monitoring or corrective

1 action and asked whether that was an option available 2 to the individual.

Mr. Henderson explained that practice monitoring is included in the corrective measures and actions and would be subject to that.

Dr. Funari asked whether the practice monitoring is going to occur in their new practice locations, including Texas.

Mr. Henderson explained that the corrective measures do not apply to respondent five because he is in Texas and has no plans on returning to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and noted it would be an unnecessary expense on the Board to monitor any practices in the jurisdiction of Texas.

Mr. Henderson commented that the respondent, being disconnected or separated from the practice for nearly three years, has accepted responsibility for the conduct that was done three years ago and believes that it is reasonable under the circumstances and also based on the Board precedent.

Dr. Funari asked whether any consideration was given to direct action against the license, such as suspension or probation.

Mr. Henderson noted the answer would be yes in this case, where they try to subject them to practice

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Report of Board Counsel - Regulations

10 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a

11 Regulatory Report regarding the status of

Mr. Rouse also referred to the Botox Statement of Policy, noting prior Board discussion concerning tabling the matter. He mentioned that Dr. Funari provided research on that matter, but the Board

19 wanted to work on more priority regulations first and

20 come back to that at a later time.

Mr. Rouse noted there has to be an amendment to

23 a regulation that a number of the health boards are

24 going to revise, noting someone from the State Board

25 of Nursing is further along on this regulation. He

mentioned that he would be looking at their regulatory package for continuity in the volunteer license and come back to the Board on that matter.

Mr. Rouse addressed general revisions, noting there was a Regulatory Committee Meeting on February 10th and is hoping the Board votes in terms of whether to release an exposure draft to the stakeholders for written comments.

Mr. Rouse noted prior discussion at several regulatory committee meetings regarding mobile vans, where the committee discussed tabling that until spring or summer to again concentrate on priority regulations. He stated the Board voted to adopt the civil penalties annex in November and that licensure by endorsement is currently with regulatory counsel.

Mr. Rouse mentioned the Board combined the expanded function dental assistant (EFDA) general revisions regulation into the regular general revisions and would be discussing today. He noted other health boards are going to have a similar amendment for the opioid education curriculum regulation and would again be waiting to look at the State Board of Nursing's proposed regulatory package before bringing that before the board.

Chairman Casey asked Mr. Rouse to explain to

Board members and the audience the exposure draft process and how stakeholders could provide input.

Mr. Rouse referred to Regulation 16A-4621 regarding anesthesia, stating that the regulatory committee has worked extremely hard on the anesthesia update and thanked Dr. Funari and Dr. Sullivan for their research and hard work putting the package together, along with adding a monitoring permit for dental hygienists in order to monitor the administration of nitrous oxide.

Mr. Rouse explained that the purpose of reviewing the annex is to determine whether the board wants to release the annex to the stakeholders as an email from the resource account for regulatory counsel, where all of the stakeholders would be able to see what the board has drafted and make written comments that would come back to Board Counsel to be presented to the Board for discussion.

Mr. Rouse referred to the anesthesia annex, noting the regulatory committee was reviewing whether or not they could even create the annex that included a permit for monitoring of anesthesia by a dental hygienist. He provided the Board with statutory citations that were used in order for the Board to create regulations on local anesthesia permits for a

dental hygienist and used that as the basis of actually having a monitoring permit.

Mr. Rouse explained that they included a section regarding fees in the local anesthesia permit and referred to § 33.3 fees, noting no amount for the dental hygienist nitrous oxide monitoring permit and thought the Board may want the cost of that permit to be the same as the dental hygienist local anesthesia permit. He mentioned the current amount for the dental hygienist local anesthesia permit is \$50 but would increase to \$55 on July 1, 2025, and \$60 on July 1, 2027.

Dr. Funari commented that any fee would need to consider the administrative time and costs associated with reviewing the application and on renewal during the monitoring of the continuing education. He believed the fee would probably be higher than what is proposed but was open to reasonable suggestions.

Mr. Rouse further explained that this permit would only be for dental hygienists and that certain doctors would be able to be the supervising dentist; a dentist who had at least a Restricted Permit II in order to supervise a dental hygienist who has a monitoring permit. The supervising dentist would be responsible throughout the entire procedure.

Ms. Fowler asked what would distinguish the higher fee for a monitoring permit from the other permits available to dental hygienists, including the public health dental hygiene practitioner (PHDHP) and the local anesthesia, because they all have administrative costs.

Mr. Rouse explained that they do not know how many permits would be issued because they do not currently have that type of permit, which is why Mr. Rouse suggested using a permit they already have numbers for right now.

Dr. Funari agreed with Mr. Rouse because they need to have a starting point, noting the fees are reviewed basically on an annual basis. He mentioned that there is no dedicated program for somebody to be qualified within the first year and there would be time to look at it.]
