        Mr. Smith presented the 2023 Prosecution
23
   Division's Annual Report for the State Board of
24
   Dentistry. He reported around 35,000 active
25
   licensees with 565 opened cases in 2023 and around
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1 451 cases in 2022. He noted 552 open cases and 449 2 closed cases. He stated the average number of days 3 to close a case from the time the complaint is 4 received until disposition was 355 days in 2023 and 5 429 days in 2022. He also reported the most common discipline in 2023 was mostly fines, noting Act 48 6 7 fines are typically citations and do not come into play often with their Board. He reported 10 stayed suspensions and 11 suspensions in 2023 and seemed to 10 be the most common form of discipline for the Board.

Mr. Smith addressed cases where there was no discipline and referred to "prosecution not warranted" under Z02. He also noted 74 warning letters under Z18.

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Dr. Funari asked how many cases are presented before the Board because a large number of cases are handled administratively as opposed to the Board actually reviewing the case and acting.

Mr. Smith stated one case may show up more than once and counted twice, especially with discipline cases, where a case may show up under suspension but also under fines. He noted that it is difficult to say how many are being presented to the Board based on the numbers because of way it is calculated.

- 12 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a
- 13 Regulatory Report for the Board's review.
- Mr. Rouse offered a preamble for 16A-4621
  regarding the anesthesia update. He thanked Chair
  Sullivan and the Regulatory Committee for their
  assistance and the regulatory community for their
- 18 discussions regarding the annex.
- Mr. Rouse reported the botulinum toxin regulation 20 is on hold.
  - Mr. Rouse informed Board members that he would have the preamble for the general revisions at the next Board meeting. He mentioned mobile vans is on hold and licensure by endorsement is still being reviewed. He noted the State Board of Nursing has a

regulatory package currently in process for opioid education, and the Board would be using that as a template.

Mr. Rouse referred to the anesthesia update preamble, noting it discusses all of the amendments, additions, and deletions. He also noted it provides the statutory authority for the Board to promulgate the regulations and gives some background on the standard of care evolving over the past 19 years. He stated the preamble notes the fact that the regulations are being updated because the guidance had been updated.

Mr. Rouse stated the preamble also notes why the Board wants to amend the regulations to include a dental hygienist nitrous oxide monitoring permit, along with the requirements for training and supervision of monitoring of permit holders.

Mr. Rouse noted the preamble also states that the Board believes the amendment is consistent with the statutory authority under 63 P.S. § 122(d) to adopt regulations provided for the general supervision and practice of dental hygienists. He mentioned the preamble also goes through each of the sections that were amended and explains the amendments, including the guidance that had been changed supporting the

amendments. He suggested having further Board discussion at the next Board meeting on the anesthesia update preamble and general revisions preamble.

- Dr. Funari commented that Pennsylvania lacks sufficient licensed individuals to conduct a survey of cone-beam computed tomography (CBCT) in the state on an annual basis. He reported receiving phone calls from dentists and surgeons asking who can inspect their CBCTs. He noted the regulation is out there, but they had to go to Delaware to find someone. He stated people are in noncompliance because the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is essentially nonresponsive.
  - Dr. Funari also stated anybody who operates a CBCT has to be specifically trained in that operation. He noted dental assistants are operating those but that it is not part of training for their radiological certificate. He mentioned that the information and test may need to upgraded to include CBCTs in order to be complying.
  - Dr. Funari referred to § 221.64(a)(5), in addition to the requirements of § 221.16 related to training, competency, and continuing education, the CBCT X-ray system shall only be operated by an

1 individual who has been specifically trained in its
2 operation.

Dr. Jaspan mentioned they should also look into Panorex and cephalometric X-rays because an assistant is only certified for intraoral radiography.

Dr. Groody commented that there is no certification, and the dentist is on the hook to make sure they are trained. She noted they could take the Dental Assisting National Board (DANB) Radiation Health and Safety (RHS) Exam, but the Board no longer regulates that and is on the onus of the licensed dentist to ensure that.

Dr. Funari stated most of the training occurs when the machine is installed and personnel who are present are trained, noting turnover personnel do not have specific training by a qualified individual.

Acting Commissioner Claggett requested an email concerning the issue be sent to him so he could share the information with the director of policy and DEP.

Dr. Lugo commented that somebody from the public who absolutely has no training can walk in from the street and operate a CBCT and not be registered with any state body. He expressed the importance of the Board continuing to work on registering dental assistants like other states because everything else

could be incorporated in the registration that is not covered by exams that are outdated or by big practices. He mentioned that it is the largest workforce in Pennsylvania in dentistry; and they do not have it registered, certified, or anything else and is putting the public at risk.

Dr. Groody addressed page 6 of the annex of the general revisions regarding expanded function dental assistant eligibility for the exam. She referred to (c), a candidate who applies outside the two-year window will be deemed ineligible to sit for the EFDA written exam. She suggested the addition of "and clinical exam" there. She also referred to (d), the additional requirement. She mentioned that it does not make sense and wanted to make sure they are covering all bases before they move it through.

Mr. Rouse noted the Board would be discussing the preamble at the next Board meeting and could have further discussion on that as well.]

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Report of Board Counsel - Miscellaneous

[Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a presentation regarding the Sunshine Act. He explained that the purpose of the Sunshine Act is the right of the public to be present at all meetings of

- agencies and to witness the deliberations, policy
  formation, and decision-making vital to the
  enhancement and proper functioning of the democratic
  process. He noted the importance of the public being
  able to discuss regulations and help create new
  regulations.
  - Mr. Rouse stated meetings must be open to the public when deliberations or official action takes place. He provided the definition of agency, deliberation, and official action.

- Mr. Rouse addressed public notice, including publication of the place, date, and time of the public meeting. He noted it is not required in a case of an emergency meeting or conference. He discussed the additions of Act 65 of 2021.
- Mr. Rouse discussed the recording of votes and requirement of minutes for all open meetings. He mentioned that the only applicable exceptions to the open meeting requirement are Executive Sessions and conferences.
- Mr. Rouse explained that legal challenges to the Sunshine Act have to be filed within 30 days of the date of the meeting or discovery of any action in which the Sunshine Act was violated and discussed penalties for violating the Sunshine Act.

Mr. Rouse stated all Board business has to be conducted in open meetings, and Board members should not discuss agency business, especially Executive Session matters, outside of an official Board meeting. He noted committee meetings discussing regulations and policies should take place in open meetings with appropriate public notice. He mentioned that administrative functions are not subject to open meeting requirements.

Mr. Rouse addressed mandatory recusals, where a Board member may have a prosecutorial role or a direct personal or financial interest in the outcome of the matter. He addressed "strongly suggested" recusals, where there is a personal affection for someone involved in the matter or outside knowledge of the matter, which prevents a board member from making a fair and unbiased determination.

Mr. Rouse noted that discretionary recusals are when a Board member cannot hear and dispose of the case or participate in a decision on a subject fairly and without prejudice. He encouraged Board members to ask counsel if they have any questions about whether to recuse.

Mr. Rouse explained the difference between recusal and abstention, noting abstention means

someone is withholding their vote but does not affect quorum requirements. He noted someone is unable to vote with recusal, which can affect the quorum.

Mr. Rouse addressed conflict of interest, where no member of any professional examining and licensing board shall at the same time be an officer or agent of any statewide association or organization representing the profession or occupation subject to board action.

Mr. Rouse noted public members of a licensing board or commission designated as a representative of the public at large shall be a private citizen and not be a member of any profession or occupation which is regulated or licensed by the board, commission, BPOA, or be related to or part of the immediate family of any member of the profession or occupation to be licensed or regulated. He mentioned they may not hold any appointed or elected public office issued within the Commonwealth or any state or United States government during their term.

Dr. Arndt asked whether a retired dentist without a license could be a public member as long as they do not belong to the American Dental Association and Pennsylvania Dental Association.

Mr. Rouse explained that the person would still

be affiliated with a profession that is licensed when
they are a retired dentist.

Mr. Rouse mentioned that Ms. Murray provided documents, including a comparison of state statutes and regulations addressing the requirements for teledentistry and policy guidance. He noted the documents would be helpful if the statute passes and is signed into law because the Board would have to draft regulations.

Dr. Funari mentioned having experience with telemedicine and offered legal statements required for patient records.]
