Ms. Wucinski noted General Revisions regulations
16A-4628 was reviewed and edited by Board Counsel, Ms.
Lutz, and Ms. Burns, Board Administrator. She stated,
if these updates were satisfactory to the Board, Ms.

Alice Hart Hughes, Esquire, Public Member,

She reviewed the Board's decision at 3 its last meeting to adopt the proposed Annex substituting medically deprived areas with Dental Health Professionals shortage area. Ms. Wucinski requested a vote on approving the final Annex as amended.] \* \* \* [Andrew S. Matta, D.M.D., Board Member, returned to 10 the meeting at 9:26 a.m.] 11 [Shawn M. Casey, D.M.D., Board Member, referenced the 12 13 shortage area data in the document. He questioned how often the data would change. Ms. Wucinski stated the 14 15 data changed frequently; however, it did not know the 16 exact number. She indicated there was an entire 17 Department of Health dedicated to the shortage areas 18 based on current statistics. He questioned whether 19 there was a Certificate in Need. Ms. Wucinski 20 answered not in Pennsylvania. She stated Pennsylvania 21 was no longer a Certificate of Need State. Ms. 22 Wucinski discussed the requirement to redraft the 23 legislation. 24 Dr. Casey questioned the need for additional tools

25 besides this reference and the changing of the data.

1 Ms. Wucinski stated the data did not change often. She announced there was an entire Department of Health 3 dedicated to these service areas based on current statistics. Mr. Casey believed the data was variable and questioned the availability of other tools or methods.

Ms. Wucinski referenced the website for Pennsylvania Department of Health. She referenced the website where the shortage areas were visible by county. Ms. Wucinski indicated the data calculated was part of the Federal infrastructure. She believed it would be around in the long term. Ms. Wucinski requested the Board vote on approval of the Annex as amended.

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Dr. Funari announced that he had been approached 16 by a company called Virtueent. This company proposed to bring a dental hygienist into a corporate workplace, provide a dental exam, and direct patients to a dentist. Dr. Funari stated, under the Board's proposed guidelines, this would not be permitted. Ms. 21 Wucinski stated this was correct. She encouraged a complaint be filed on the website or a phone call be placed to the Board for these violations of the Board's quidelines.]

Kalonji Johnson, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of 16 17 18 Professional and Occupational Affairs, entered the 19 20 Meeting at 9:34 a.m.] 21 22 Report of Board Chairperson [John D. Erhard, III, D.D.S., Chairperson, announced 23 24 the Act 41 Committee approved the requested licensure. 25 He received a letter from a dentist requesting if the 26 Board had considered waving courses (CE) that required 27 in-person attendance during this particular period. 28 Chairman Erhard suggested the Board could go to

broadcast or written courses for this year. Mr. Lugo
indicated premature yet due to the uncertainty of how
long this pandemic would last. Chairman Erhard
indicated the CDC exam made some minor changes
considering the Covid-19 situation. The mannequin
exams, which required candidates to use all the
precautions with masks and gloves, was being waiver
due to the shortage. Candidates can continue with the
exam in scrubs without masks, et cetera.

Chairman Erhard informed the Board there was a need for more examiners as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. No exams had yet been cancelled. He stated the organization was making efforts to go forward with everything as scheduled. Chairman Erhard noted one examination being cancelled due to not being able to obtain gloves and masks in the state of Maryland.]

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[Arlene G. Seid, M.D., MPH, Department of Health, presented an update for the Department of Health. Dr. Seid stated on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the novel coronavirus outbreak a global health emergency. On March 11, 2020, the Covid-19 virus was declared a pandemic. Dr. Seid reviewed Pennsylvania's response to the pandemic with all closings of schools ordered by the Governor.

She reviewed the international and national level positive cases for the virus. Dr. Seid stated

Pennsylvania was fortunate to have in-state testing.

She informed the Board there were draft guidelines for Dental-related issue to Covid-19 that should be out soon.

Dr. Lugo questioned whether the Dental Guidelines included guidelines for procedure or patient protection. Dr. Seid stated the guidelines were still not finalized. She indicated Dr. Mozaffarian was heading the coordination of these guidelines.

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Chairman Erhard requested Dr. Mozaffarian to comment. Dr. Mozaffarian stated the CDC acknowledged the specific aerosol procedures in Dentistry. She drafted a document that was being reviewed by Infectious Disease in the Department of Health. Dr. Mozaffarian suggested the best resource would be the CDC section under EMS, specifically the aerosol generating procedure.

Dr. Lugo mentioned his biggest concern with making certain that Dental Professionals understand they are in the biggest high-risk category for the Covid-19.

Dr. Lugo stated the Personal Protective Equipment should be a respirator and a mask. Dr. Lugo indicated the Department of Health could point Dentist

1 Professionals for the right protective equipment. Dr. Mozaffarian was contacted Dr. Levine herself and acknowledged the Dental field as one of the highest risk professions.

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Dr. Seid referred to an article that covers office and other protective equipment for dentistry. Lugo suggested providing these resources to Dentists and Dental owners to understand protection in the workplace. Dr. Lugo strongly suggested disseminating this information as soon as possible to ensure proper protection is being enforced in Dental offices.

Chairman Erhard suggested sending emails to all Dentists in Pennsylvania referencing the resources for the public.

K. Kalonji Johnson, Acting Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs, questioned whether the plan was to create a document or to maintain a living repository of the document changes with an Annex site. Dr. Mozaffarian indicated currently it was a foundational document that should 21 not need to be changed again. She announced was leaving it to the Infectious Disease Experts and Epidemiologist to make the judgement call upon their review of the document.

Acting Commissioner Johnson suggested if this is a

document, he would offer that the Bureau could move the document. Acting Commissioner Johnson assured the Board that everyone in the foundation would be emailed the document.

The Board discussed the live webinar option for  ${\sf CE}$ .

Dr. Lugo suggested, in lieu of the current situation, any travels to conferences for Board Members be cancelled until further notice. Acting Commissioner Johnson confirmed that state travel was restricted for Commonwealth employees, which the Board Members would fall into this category.]
