Dr. Funari commented that the presence of pornographic material on their office computer raises the question as to whether or not they are following federal guidelines on protected health information and whether it would be appropriate for remedial education on what is required to meet federal guidelines on protecting health information of patients.

Ms. Hughes asked whether the Bureau of Enforcement and Investigation (BEI) make any determination about concern for the privacy of protected information in this kind of case where office computers are being used for nefarious activity.

Mr. Jarabeck explained that prosecution does not have access to patient records unless they have a patient release or court order. He noted that records could be stored on one individual computer or by different methods. Prosecution and BEI does not have the ability to ask how their record storage works.

Ms. Hughes commented that they are in an emerging area of litigation and potential ethics violations regarding how they maintain the privacy of clients in the instance of Board members and the individuals they

oversee. She mentioned that the Board may want to discuss and plan for potential regulatory changes that might be coming in the future.

Dr. Lugo noted it might be a good idea to revise and update regulations now that there is digitalization and federal requirements and guidelines for keeping records private.

Ms. Sizemore commented that the United States

Department of Health and Human Services Office for

Civil Rights is the primary enforcement entity for

concerns about privacy and proper security of

electronic records. She also noted the Pennsylvania

Office of Attorney General has enforcement authority

under statutes and regulations, and the prosecution

division is free to make those referrals as they would

deem appropriate.

Dr. Funari stated the original complaint related to pornography visible on the computer and did not involve infection control, but because the initial complaint was being investigated, violations of federal infection control regulations were found.

Dr. Funari mentioned that one of the primary tenets of Health Insurance Portability Accountability Act (HIPAA) is that private patient information is not visible to third parties. He noted the screen was

Dr. Arndt noted the committee is also looking at civil penalties introduced in 2015, where the committee discussed the need for consistency with other regulation updates being contemplated or recommended. He mentioned the next step would be for Board Counsel to draft updates consistent with current requirements and refer back to the committee for review. He stated the committee would then review proposed revisions prior to the November 2022 meeting and present those to the full Board in November 2022 if approved.

Dr. Arndt addressed general revisions introduced in 2020. He noted the committee agreed to retain the general revisions package language requiring clinical examinations for expanded function dental assistant (EFDA) certification and the committee agreed to table discussion of the recommendations of the EFDA Committee until Chair Groody is in attendance.

Dr. Arndt informed everyone that the next Legislation and Regulatory Committee Meeting is scheduled for September 26, 2022.

Mr. Rouse referred to Regulation 16A-4630 regarding schedule of civil penalties, noting a copy was provided to all Board members for review at the committee meeting on August 26, 2022, and no changes were made at that time.

Mr. Rouse addressed the annex for Regulation 16A-4630 regarding the schedule of civil penalties. He noted prior Board discussion many years ago and committee discussion on August 26, 2022, where the committee discussed civil penalties for failure to maintain current cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certification and recommended a civil penalty of \$100 for a first offense if corrected within 60 days and formal action for second or subsequent offenses.

Mr. Rouse noted practicing on a lapsed license or certificate for a first offense of a dentist would be \$200 per month but not to exceed \$1000 and formal action over 12 months; dental hygienists, \$100 per month and not to exceed \$1000 and formal action over 12 months; expanded function dental assistants, \$50 per month and formal action over 12 months and for a second or subsequent offense.

Mr. Rouse noted the civil penalty for a dental hygienist administering local anesthesia without the current permit would be \$100 per month but not to

exceed \$1,000, formal action over 12 months, and formal action for second or subsequent offenses.

Mr. Rouse noted dental hygienists practicing as a public health dental hygiene practitioner without a current certificate would be a civil penalty of \$100 per month not to exceed \$1,000, and formal action over 12 months and for second or subsequent offenses.

Mr. Rouse noted a dentist administering or supervising the administration of general anesthesia of nitrous oxide-oxygen analgesia without a current permit would be subject to a civil penalty of \$200 per month not to exceed \$1,000 and formal action over 12 months and for second or subsequent offenses.

Mr. Rouse noted failure of an unrestricted permit holder to possess current certification in advanced cardiovascular life support (ACLS) for adult patients or pediatric advanced life support (PALS) for pediatric patients would be \$100 for the first offense if corrected within 60 days and formal action for second or subsequent offenses.
