Brinkash, PLS, referred to the request 25 received from the Pennsylvania College of Technology,

where they are trying develop a 10-credit program to accommodate the 4-year Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering provided for in their registration law.

Mr. Brinkash noted that Penn College of
Technology is doing away with their 2-year associate
degree program and trying to help the surveying
profession by adding a 10-credit course. He explained
that Penn College has a survey I course, surveying II
course, geographic information system and
photogrammetry course, and the fourth course would be
a computer applications for civil engineers and
surveying course totaling 12 credits.

Mr. Brinkash stated the registration law requires a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering with at least 10 credits in surveying, and Penn College wants to make sure the credits are going to be accepted by the Board.

Mr. Brinkash commented that the computer applications for civil engineers and surveying course is acceptable because of the crossover in their registration law of professional practice, where licensed professional engineers and licensed professional land surveyors have a common area of professional practice in their registration law. He stated the four courses would be acceptable for 10

credits, along with the civil engineering degree.

Mr. Brinkash mentioned speaking with a personal friend and educator at Penn College and agreed. He applauded their attempt in trying to subsidize a big void by doing away with the associate degree program.

Mr. Brinkash noted NCEES encouraged the Board to work with the universities in developing the programs and asked for the Board's help and suggestions on how to make this happen.

President Szalankiewicz addressed the Penn State
University Mont Alto and Wilkes-Barre campuses, noting
the Wilkes-Barre campus has a very limited number of
land surveyors taking the course at this time because
the youth does not seem to be interested.

President Szalankiewicz believed the move would be a precedent-setting move and could see this happening to other civil engineering programs. He mentioned that this is getting ahead of the curve on a solution and thanked Mr. Brinkash and Ms. Bronshtein for handling it so thoroughly.

John G. Fuehrer II, Chair, Education Committee,
Pennsylvania Society of Land Surveyors, mentioned
being interested in the adjudication case, noting no
details were discussed.

Mr. Fuehrer offered to help, noting Wilkes-Barre

1 was thinking about dropping their 2-year program and 2 the importance of education.

Mr. Brinkash commented that the four courses are all part of an Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET)-approved program. He suggested the addition of a boundary law course in surveying, but their law not specific on what courses they need to accept.

Mr. Brinkash commented that the void is going to hurt the surveying profession, and the Board has to help and support the universities and their programs.

President Szalankiewicz agreed with Mr. Brinkash, noting the associate degree program at Penn State Mont Alto had an elementary boundary law course and was a subject that should be included in the list.

Mr. Fritz stated the Board could form a committee to reach out to local colleges.]

- 1 [Michelle Witmer, Bureau of Finance and Operations,
- 2 Department of State, informed the Board that the
- 3 Bureau of Finance and Operations (BFO) looked at the
- 4 licensee population on a biennial basis from a revenue
- 5 standpoint. She compared FY15-16 to FY17-18, noting a
- 6 decrease of 509 licensees, FY17-18 to FY19-20 another
- 7 decrease of 1,143 licensees, and FY19-20 to FY21-22 an
- 8 increase of 310 licensees. She reported a total
- 9 licensee count of 31,522 as of this morning.
- 10 Ms. Witmer noted a fee increase went into effect
- 11 with the September 2019 renewal. She reported on the
- 12 revenue total.
- Ms. Witmer reported on expenses for FY19-20, FY20-
- 14 21, and on the date of the report. She mentioned that
- 15 the fee increase was starting to bring the Board back
- 16 into the black this year. She stated the budget will
- 17 be kept at \$1,204,000, noting the projected balance.
- 18 Ms. Witmer reported on Board member expenses for
- 19 FY19-20, FY21-22, and the current figure. She noted
- 20 BFO would continue the \$43,000 budget, pointing out
- 21 any money not used would go back to the Board for
- 22 other expenses.
- 23 President Szalankiewicz commented that the travel
- 24 expenses would be increasing a little bit with
- 25 returning to in-person meetings because many Board
