2 Report of Board Administrator
3 [Kristel Hennessy Hemler, Board Administrator,
4 addressed the response from licensees regarding
5 emails for the professional development hours of
6 continuing education. She noted sending an email as
7 a renewal reminder and compliance of obtaining the 24
8 professional development hours of continuing
9 education. She reported that the email notifying
10 licensees to upload those certificates directly to
11 their renewal application was retracted. She stated
12 a second email was sent and also provided a statement
13 to the public that no uploads are required for the
14 renewal application.

15 Ms. Hennessy Hemler noted receiving concerning
16 emails from licensees not aware of their professional
17 development hour, and it is required for licensure
18 and to maintain their licensure.

19 Ms. Hennessy Hemler emphasized that it is a
20 requirement that everybody complete their 24
21 professional development hours of continuing
22 education, and it must have been completed from
23 October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2023, for upcoming
24 renewals. She noted 12 hours could be carryover from
25 the previous renewal period for anyone who exceeded

1 the 24 hours.

2 Ms. Hennessy Hemler also informed everyone that
3 anyone who is active retired is exempt of the
4 professional development hours, along with anyone
5 licensed between October 1, 2021 to September 30,
6 2023. She also noted anyone who has an approved
7 exemption from the Board for medical reasons,
8 extenuating circumstances, or any type of illness or
9 physical disability would be exempt from the
10 professional development hours, but an exemption or
11 extension would have to be approved.]

15 [Todd P. Kriner, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted four
16 outstanding discipline cases, noting two consent
17 agreements on the agenda.]

20 [Todd P. Kriner, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed
21 Board members that there are currently no regulatory
22 issues.]

23

24 Appointment - Introduction

25 [Michael McDonald, Policy Director, Department of

1 State, introduced himself and provided a brief
2 history of his professional background. He informed
3 everyone that the policy office works closely with
4 all of the licensing boards and commissions to review
5 and draft policy initiatives, along with reviewing
6 legislation.

7 Mr. McDonald noted the policy office staff works
8 closely with Board Counsel to review and draft
9 regulations and other strategies and policies the
10 Board would like to implement. He mentioned also
11 working with contacts in the governor's office and
12 the secretary of the commonwealth to implement their
13 policy agenda. He offered to be a resource for the
14 Board concerning research and questions on other
15 jurisdictions.

16 Mr. McDonald thanked Board members for their
17 service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

18 President McNally thanked Mr. McDonald for the
19 presentation and welcomed him to the new position.
20 He asked Mr. McDonald to discuss the procedures or
21 policy if there were an issue the Board wanted to
22 develop.

23 Mr. McDonald offered to provide contact
24 information, noting he works closely with Acting
25 Commissioner Claggett and other members of the Bureau

1 of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA)
2 staff, along with legal counsel and could be reached
3 through them.

4 Mr. McDonald will assist with ideas that may be
5 beneficial to implement concerning requirements for
6 licensees and what is happening in other
7 jurisdictions. He noted having contacts in advocate
8 organizations and contacts on government-sponsored
9 research boards who could provide information and
10 make recommendations as to whether something would be
11 a good policy and analyze the risks and cost.]

13 Matters for Discussion - Act 41

14 [Martin F. Helmke, PhD, PG, Professional Member,
15 addressed the need for qualified professional
16 geologists in the state of Pennsylvania. He
17 commented that the Board works hard to review
18 applications in an efficient and rigorous manner.

19 President McNally noted the development of some
20 actions to streamline and make sure that those
21 requests and applications are done expeditiously and
22 thoroughly.]

24 Matters for Discussion - Recognition of Career

25 Milestone Years of Service

1 [Joseph T. McNally, PG, President, requested Ms.
2 Hennessy Hemler provide some background to see who
3 might fit the different categories for recognition,
4 especially long-serving individuals.

5 Ms. Hennessy Hemler informed Board members of
6 correspondence from one of their licensees who has
7 been licensed for over 50 years and was just curious
8 because he was not recognized. She noted it could be
9 something the Board could do in the future for
10 licensees who have hit milestones and recognize them
11 at a board meetings or some other way.

12 President McNally mentioned someone suggesting
13 the individual receive a letter acknowledging their
14 50 years of experience.

15 Acting Commissioner Claggett commented that
16 recognition may not be the best course of action
17 because someone may be missed.

18 President McNally also commented that some
19 individuals have continuous service and some may have
20 many years since first being licensed but may not be
21 continuous and into a bit of a gray area. He noted
22 it not to be the time to entertain individual
23 recognition even though their years of service are
24 certainly appreciated and not consistent with other
25 boards in general.]

22 Appointment - Pennsylvania Insurance Department -

23 Pennie Health Insurance Presentation

24 [Judith Wechter, Outreach Coordinator, Pennie, stated

25 Pennie is a marketplace connecting Pennsylvanians to

1 health coverage. She informed everyone the Pennie
2 was signed in 2019 transitioning away from the
3 federal platform of HealthCare.gov to a state-based
4 insurance exchange. She noted the vote was
5 bipartisan and unanimous by both chambers that set up
6 a state-based exchange to take local control for
7 operations and customer service.

8 Ms. Wechter explained that the legislators wanted
9 to ensure an affordable, stable, and accessible
10 marketplace for Pennsylvanians to have a pathway to
11 coverage and choice with pricing and premiums within
12 the budget for middle-class Americans. She mentioned
13 that the savings were used to launch a reinsurance
14 market which basically mitigates risk and makes sure
15 commercial carriers on the marketplace can price
16 their products accordingly.

17 Ms. Wechter explained that Pennie is the official
18 health insurance marketplace for Pennsylvanians for
19 affordable health insurance and the only source for
20 financial assistance to reduce the cost of care. She
21 noted that over 607,000 individuals across
22 Pennsylvania are uninsured.

23 Ms. Wechter addressed Pennie's no wrong door
24 policy for anyone who is not sure whether they are
25 eligible for Medicaid or the Children's Health

1 Insurance Program (CHIP), where Pennie would hand
2 that off to the Department of Human Services (DHS) if
3 they were eligible.

4 Ms. Wechter noted Pennie is the commercial
5 marketplace for health and dental insurance for
6 Pennsylvanians and the only source for financial
7 assistance to reduce the cost of coverage and the
8 premium. She explained that the financial assistance
9 comes in the form of a tax credit based on household
10 size and income.

11 Ms. Wechter addressed cost-sharing reductions to
12 reduce the cost of care, where reductions in the cost
13 of care come from a silver plan that individuals can
14 enroll in that provides reductions to copays,
15 deductibles, coinsurance, and out of pocket. She
16 noted there are gold, silver, and bronze plans,
17 emphasizing the silver plan for all the commercial
18 carriers on the marketplace is benchmark.

19 Ms. Wechter stated one out of four Pennie
20 customers pay less than \$1 a day, 14 percent pay less
21 than a dollar a month, and 40 percent pay less than
22 \$75 a month. She reported 46 percent of individuals
23 who enrolled in 2023 saw a monthly premium of \$50 or
24 less.

25 Ms. Wechter mentioned that Pennie is not the

1 insurance but is the marketplace where commercial
2 carriers have their plan with open enrollment from
3 November 1 through January 15. She noted that
4 anything out of open enrollment is referred to as a
5 special enrollment period and is from January 1
6 through December 31 for a qualifying life event and
7 provided a list of life events.

8 Ms. Wechter addressed the special enrollment
9 period with a 60-day window for individuals going
10 through a financial redetermination for medical
11 assistance known as the unwinding of continuous
12 coverage.

13 Ms. Wechter addressed the Path to Pennie, which
14 is a collaboration between the Pennsylvania
15 Department of Revenue and Pennie, where an individual
16 could indicate when filing income taxes that they or
17 someone in their family is not covered or uninsured
18 and fill out Form REV-1882. She noted the
19 legislation is about creating a pathway to ensure
20 that all Pennsylvanians have a way to get protected
21 and get connected to health coverage.

22 Ms. Wechter also addressed the unwinding of
23 continuous coverage for Medical Assistance and the
24 expiration of the public health emergency. She
25 reported 3.7 million individuals in Pennsylvania use

1 medical assistance and would be going through a
2 financial redetermination process but automatically
3 transferred to Pennie if found ineligible.]

4

5 [Judith Wechter experienced technical difficulties.
6 Acting Commissioner Claggett noted that the rest of
7 the presentation would be available to Board members
8 in the shared drive.]

9

10 Miscellaneous

11 [Joseph T. McNally, PG, President, requested Board
12 member attendance at the National Association of
13 State Boards of Geology (ASBOG) Council of Examiners
14 Meeting October 24-28 in Spokane, WA. He mentioned
15 that Martin Helmke has become very involved with the
16 association over the last year, noting Pennsylvania
17 is being actively represented in both the association
18 and at the meeting.]

13 Miscellaneous - Correspondence

14 [Kristel Hennessy Hemler, Board Administrator,
15 referred to correspondence received from the American
16 Nuclear Society (ANS) concerning discontinuance of
17 the Nuclear Professional Engineer Examination by the
18 National Council of Examiners for Engineering and
19 Surveying (NCEES) for the Board's discussion.

20 President McNally stated the Engineering Board
21 members may have a little bit more insight into this
22 to be sure that this continued for education and
23 discipline. He noted that there were a number of
24 exemptions for federal employees who did not have to
25 take the exam.

1 Mr. Kriner reviewed the regulations and found
2 that it is one of the engineering disciplines
3 identified for Pennsylvania and did not think there
4 was any discussion about changing requirements or
5 minimizing Pennsylvania's support of that engineering
6 discipline. He believed NCEES was asking for
7 continued support and to not minimize their support.

8 Mr. Brinkash explained that it was announced that
9 NCEES was looking for experts in the field to do the
10 exam whether they were members or not.

11 Mr. Kudlawiec also believed NCEES was looking for
12 experts to assist in preparing the examination.

13 Mr. Kudlawiec addressed seeking mining and/or
14 mineral processing engineers for study. He noted
15 receiving an inquiry from NCEES and participating in
16 the survey/study on the Board's behalf.

17 President McNally referred to correspondence from
18 Baljinder Brar regarding the I-95 bridge collapse
19 focusing on activities being completed with
20 suggestions for consideration by bridge engineers.

21 Baljinder Brar, PE, California Department of
22 Transportation, requested the Board's help
23 implementing policies in the engineering community.
24 He stated U.S. highway is feeding Canada and Mexico
25 and requested the Board correspond with the

1 department to help them be more active and help the
2 study. He addressed accidents that cost lives,
3 noting the importance of being involved in the study
4 and having more alertness and implementation to help
5 save more lives.

6 President McNally thanked Mr. Brar for sharing
7 the information with the Board and joining the
8 meeting. He suggested forwarding the information to
9 other engineering societies and disciplines within
10 the state for other people to reach out for this
11 educational opportunity if it has not already been
12 done.]
