21 Surveyors, and Geologists was held on Friday, October  
22 8, 2021. James Szalankiewicz, PE, PLS, President,  
23 called the meeting to order at 10:50 a.m.

25 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed

1 everyone that the meeting was being recorded, and  
2 those who continued to participate were giving their  
3 consent to be recorded.

4 Mr. Fritz also noted the Board met in Executive  
5 Session prior to open session for the purpose of  
6 conducting quasi-judicial deliberations regarding the  
7 agenda.]

10 [A roll call of Board members was taken by Mr. Fritz.]

12 Approval of minutes of the May 17, 2021 meeting

13 PRESIDENT SZALANKIEWICZ:

14 Hopefully, people had a chance to review

16 or perhaps a motion to approve?

21 PRESIDENT SZALANKIEWICZ:

2 [President Szalankiewicz requested members of the  
3 public introduce themselves.]

5 Report of Board President

6 [James J. Szalankiewicz, PE, PLS, President, thanked  
7 the administrator, counsel, and administrative staff  
8 for providing Board information and working together  
9 to help make the transition as smooth as possible for  
10 the past 18 months under such adverse conditions.]

11 \*\*\*

12 [Robert P. Kudlawiec, PE, addressed his attendance at  
13 the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and  
14 Surveying (NCEES) Meeting on behalf of the state of  
15 Pennsylvania. He reported all motions before the  
16 states were accepted and passed by large margins. He  
17 mentioned prior Board discussion concerning Motion 20,  
18 noting it passed 68 to 38 percent. He noted the split  
19 vote would no longer be accepted and passed by 92 to 8  
20 percent. He reported the regional meeting will be in  
21 April and national meeting in California in August.

22 President Szalankiewicz thanked Mr. Kudlawiec for  
23 representing the Board well.

24 Mr. Stanton also mentioned attending the virtual  
25 NCEES Meetings. He noted prior Board discussion

1 regarding adding a plumbing exam option to the NCEES  
2 mechanical exam. He commented that the NCEES  
3 education group is going to review and investigate  
4 adding a plumbing exam or plumbing questions to the  
5 mechanical portion of the exam. He stated the  
6 American Society of Plumbing Engineers received  
7 support from 10 boards and will be going to the  
8 committees to investigate.

9 Mr. Szalankiewicz also thanked Mr. Stanton for  
10 his personal time and effort.

11 Mr. McNally mentioned the National Association of  
12 State Boards of Geology (ASBOG) Meeting at the end of  
13 October. He also noted the ASBOG Council of Examiners  
14 Meetings are usually in the spring.]

15 MR. MCNALLY:

16 For the meeting coming up, I plan on  
17 attending the annual meeting and parts  
18 of the Council of Examiners, and we try  
19 to be representatives as much as  
20 possible.

21 I would like to ask for a motion  
22 for approval to attend the meeting so  
23 that we can continue our involvement as  
24 representatives of the commonwealth with  
25 this national organization.

1                   If I have someone who is willing to  
2                   make that motion, I'd appreciate it.

3 MR. BRINKASH:

4                   I'll make that motion as stated by Mr.  
5                   McNally.

6 MR. KUDLAWIEC:

7                   Second.

8 PRESIDENT SZALANKIEWICZ:

13 Report of Commissioner

14 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of  
15 Professional and Occupational Affairs, commented that  
16 the meeting was supposed to be an in-person Board  
17 meeting but informed everyone that many of the waivers  
18 and regulatory suspensions set to expire on September  
19 30 were extended until March 31, 2022, including the  
20 physical presence requirement.

21                   Commissioner Johnson also thanked Board counsel  
22 and the Board administrator for their work, along with  
23 the Board for their patience.

24                   Commissioner Johnson addressed physical travel  
25 and suggested Board members exercise both virtual and

1 physical options where available. He noted physical  
2 travel has been reinstated to the pre-COVID two-member  
3 policy. He encouraged Board members to participate in  
4 regional and national opportunities virtually.

5 Commissioner Johnson addressed wall certificates,  
6 noting they were stopped administratively a few years  
7 back but that the policy is being reexamined  
8 internally. He stated there would be some  
9 announcements shortly, probably within the next 30  
10 days or so with respect to that development.

11 Commissioner Johnson commented that the  
12 department will be piloting the return of wall  
13 licenses on a limited basis to certain boards, and  
14 based on the results of that pilot program, wall  
15 licenses will be expanded back to the original number  
16 of boards that were receiving those in the past.]

18 Report of Board Administrator

19 [Jeannie Bronshtein, Board Administrator, reported a  
20 nearly 90 percent license renewal rate as of the close  
21 on September 30, 2021. She also mentioned a few  
22 reactivations have been submitted and is expecting  
23 that percentage to go up a few points.

24 Ms. Bronshtein noted that the fall geology exams  
25 took place a week ago, and the last paper-and-pencil



1 Principles and Practice of Engineering (PE) exam will  
2 be given in two weeks. She mentioned NCEES has  
3 stepped up their transition to computer-based testing  
4 for the civil engineer disciplines due to the  
5 pandemic.

6 Ms. Bronshtein noted, next spring, they will join  
7 the rest of the disciplines as computer-based testing  
8 (CBT) exams with several testing windows throughout  
9 the year. She mentioned it alleviates the  
10 registration deadlines and the stress for the  
11 applicants as well as the staff. She believed that  
12 the 16-hour two-component structural exam will remain  
13 paper and pencil until 2024.

14 Ms. Bronshtein thanked everyone who helped in the  
15 successful completion of the revised state-specific  
16 exam. She noted the last phase is taking place right  
17 now and being completed by Pearson VUE with an  
18 expected publish date of January 1.

19 President Szalankiewicz further explained that  
20 the Board thought it was inadequate when Pearson VUE  
21 took over the previous state exam. He commented that  
22 people, such as Mike Brinkash and some other  
23 volunteers and Ms. Bronshtein, put a lot of time and  
24 work into making the exam what it should be and  
25 thanked them for their efforts.

1 Mr. Brinkash personally thanked Ms. Bronshtein  
2 for her persistence in pursuing that with Pearson VUE.  
3 He noted that shooting for January sounds like an  
4 excellent plan, where it seems like it is going to  
5 finally happen.

6 President Szalankiewicz thanked Commissioner  
7 Johnson and his staff, along with Ms. Bronshtein for  
8 the effort she put forth and wonder job they did  
9 working together.

10 Commissioner Johnson attested to Ms. Bronshtein's  
11 persistence and weekly updates, noting an immeasurable  
12 number of hours went into that project, and she should  
13 be commended.]

17 Mr. Fritz referred to 16A-4712 regarding the  
18 digital seal regulation, noting there will be  
19 discussion on the updated regulation probably at the  
20 next Board meeting. He wanted everyone to be aware  
21 that that the regulation is moving, and there is  
22 reason to be optimistic. He also noted working on the  
23 Architect Board and Landscape Architect Board  
24 regulations.

25 Mr. Brinkash thanked Mr. Fritz for providing a

1 Status of Cases Report at each meeting to be able to  
2 see the progress.

3 Mr. Fritz provided an update regarding Act 41,  
4 noting it to be moving very quickly. He reported no  
5 comments from the Independent Regulatory Review  
6 Commission or the Governor's Office. He is hoping the  
7 regulation will be on the Independent Regulatory  
8 Review Commission's November Agenda for approval and  
9 completed at that point.]

of research for the past few years as well as the rest

of the Board members.]

21 PRESIDENT SZALANKIEWICZ:

22

I'd like to have a motion for the State

23

Registration Board of Professional

24

Engineers, Land Surveyors, and

25

Geologists to endorse House Bill 609 as

1                   it now exists moving forward.

2 MR. BRINKASH:

3                   So moved.

4 MR. KUDLAWIEC:

5                   Second.

6 PRESIDENT SZALANKIEWICZ:

7                   Those in favor of House Bill 609?

8                   Opposed?

9 [The motion carried unanimously.]

10   \*\*\*

11 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted  
12 House Bill 1801 was also introduced and is related to  
13 House Bill 609 but focuses directly on the engineer-  
14 in-training (EIT) certificate under Section 4.2(c)(1).]

15           Mr. Fritz mentioned that the section is also  
16 included in House Bill 609 but pulls out the section  
17 requiring four years of the progressive experience  
18 needing to occur after the issuance of the EIT  
19 certificate. He stated it will allow the Board to  
20 look at all experience of an applicant at that point  
21 before and after the issuance of a certificate.

22           President Szalankiewicz commented that there was  
23 extensive discussion over that in Executive Session  
24 and feels pretty confident the Board endorses that  
25 also.

1 Mr. Brinkash stated House Bill 609 is at its  
2 third attempt before legislators for approval and has  
3 been going on for approximately six years. He noted  
4 the case was born out of the violations that the state  
5 charged Davey Resource Group (DRG) with, primarily so  
6 they would add a surveyor's license, and provided a  
7 summary. He commented that people and lobbyists from  
8 DRG are endorsing that right now, which speaks highly  
9 of House Bill 609.

10 Mr. Brinkash asked whether the Board endorsing  
11 and supporting House Bill 609 could be channeled to  
12 the key people in the Senate so they are aware of the  
13 Board's actions.

14 President Szalankiewicz commented that any  
15 interested party may contact the Board to provide some  
16 guidance on where to go. He personally, as a Board  
17 member and as a professional engineer and professional  
18 land surveyor, highly endorses the bill and will do  
19 his best with local surveyors and engineers by letting  
20 their senators know what needs to be done.

21 President Szalankiewicz noted the importance of  
22 the Board's obligation to maintain that for the health  
23 and safety of the public and thanked Mr. Brinkash for  
24 all the effort putting the bill forth.

25 Commissioner Johnson commented that the Office of

1 Legislative Affairs and Office of Policy work in  
2 conjunction with colleagues in the General Assembly  
3 through the executive directors of the respective  
4 oversight committees in the House and Senate, all of  
5 whom are active in observing the virtual meetings.

6 Commissioner Johnson stated the correct  
7 processional channels within the department will be  
8 working to voice the Board's concerns, along with  
9 stating publically in public meetings to make sure  
10 that colleagues in the General Assembly are properly  
11 informed and notified of where the Board stands and  
12 their concerns on all legislative initiatives. He  
13 thanked the Board for making this part of a public  
14 record and reaching out to do that.

15 Mr. Brinkash thanked Commissioner Johnson for his  
16 support for the Board and praised him for his work,  
17 especially for his assistance with Pearson.

18 Mr. Brinkash asked the Pennsylvania Society of  
19 Professional Engineers (PSPE) and Pennsylvania Society  
20 of Land Surveyors (PSLS) how they would share the  
21 board's decision with the legislature.

22 Commissioner Johnson mentioned working closely  
23 with stakeholders and professional associations that  
24 have an integral role in moving legislation along. He  
25 stated Steve Latanishen at the Office of

1 Intergovernmental Affairs works closely with many of  
2 the stakeholders to make sure the department's  
3 interests are fully expressed.

4 Commissioner Johnson also noted the stakeholders  
5 work tirelessly to advocate on behalf of the regulated  
6 community and presumably already working with the  
7 staff on the House Professional Licensure Committee to  
8 make sure the Board's concerns are voiced as well.

9 Jen Smeltz, Republican Executive Director, Senate  
10 Consumer Protection & Professional Licensure  
11 Committee, noted the bill is currently in committee.  
12 She mentioned that she appreciated the position the  
13 Board has taken and publically stating their stance on  
14 it. She stated the committee has looked at it  
15 multiple times, but it is a very technical bill.

16 Ms. Smeltz informed the Board that several groups  
17 currently oppose the bill, and the committee is trying  
18 to work through and understand all of the positions  
19 before moving the bill forward. She noted she would  
20 be happy to discuss the bill and suggested setting up  
21 a meeting.

22 Mr. Tabas offered to provide a fact finding sheet  
23 document for Ms. Smeltz' information.

24 Mr. Brinkash noted sharing the fact finding sheet  
25 document with Board members a few weeks ago but

1 offered to provide the information again.]
