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[Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 10:00 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session with C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial

9 deliberations on matters pending before the Board and 10 to receive the advice of Counsel. The Board returned

11 to open session at 10:30 a.m.]

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The regularly scheduled meeting of the State
Board of Landscape Architects was held on Thursday,
June 16, 2022. Dina Klavon, RLA, Secretary,
Professional Member, called the meeting to order at
10:54 a.m. and informed everyone that Chairman Morgan

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is on vacation.

[C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the Board met in Executive Session prior to open session and conducted quasi-judicial deliberations.

Mr. Fritz also noted the meeting was being recorded, and those who continued to participate were giving their consent to be recorded.]

1 2 Roll Call 3 [A roll call of Board members was taken by Secretary 4 Klavon.] \* \* \* 5 Introduction of Attendees 6 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided an introduction of those in attendance.] 10 Appointment - Prosecution Division Annual Report 11 Presentation [Carolyn A. DeLaurentis, Esquire, Deputy Chief 12 Counsel, Prosecution Division, presented to the Board 13 14 to provide a summary of the prosecution division's 15 workload during 2021. Ms. DeLaurentis informed the Board that 4 cases 16 17 were opened and 10 cases closed in 2021 as of January 18 1, 2022. She reported 8 cases remain open for the 19 State Board of Landscape Architects. 20 Ms. DeLaurentis discussed enforcement actions, 21 noting 2 cases resulted in discipline in 2021 with 22 both of those cases resulting in fines. She also 23 reported 3 warning letters in 2021. 24 Ms. DeLaurentis addressed the prosecutorial 25 division numbers as a whole, noting zero COVID

complaints against Landscape Architects. She noted one complaint COVID complaint may result in more than one case being opened. She reported 1,223 cases were opened regarding COVID complaints in 2020 and 543 in 2021. She stated COVID complaints have significantly decreased but that complaints are still treated as priority and managed.

Ms. DeLaurentis reported 18,363 cases were opened in 2021, which was an increase from 2020 at 13,393 and believed 2021 to be a record. She thanked the administrative assistants for processing so many files. She reported 15,994 cases were closed in 2021, which is an increase from 2020 at 13,274. She noted 15,141 open cases as of January 1, 2022.

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Ms. DeLaurentis stated the cases do not include charities, corporations, or the Pennsylvania State Athletic Commission. She thanked prosecution, counsel attorneys, and the Board for their combined effort in protecting the health and safety of the public and the integrity of the profession.

Mr. Rauso asked how many Landscape Architecture Board actions were related to continuing education violations.

Mr. Michalowski stated the vast majority have been fines, and there are not many public complaints

1 for landscape architects. He reported a few lapsed

- 17 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel,
- 18 referred to the proposed annex and preamble for 16A-
- 19 6121 regarding Act 41. He explained that the annex
- 20 is proposed language for the regulations and the
- 21 Board would see and vote on any changes or final
- 22 | language as it moves forward. He also mentioned that
- 23 the preamble is an explanation of why the Board was
- 24 doing what it was doing.
- 25 Mr. Fritz stated Act 41 is a relatively new act

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that allows a different avenue for licensees who are
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   licensed in another state to apply for licensure in
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   Pennsylvania. He explained that an applicant is able
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   to apply for an Act 41 provisional license if their
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   license is in good standing in another state and if
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   the requirements in the state are substantially
   equivalent to Pennsylvania. He noted that some
   licensees may be required to take continuing
   education.
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        Mr. Fritz further explained that a provisional
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   license is good for a maximum of 12 months with an
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   additional extension permitted under certain
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   situations requested by the licensee and approved by
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   the Board. He mentioned that any required continuing
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   education could be completed within 12 months and
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   would flip to a full license if completed earlier.]
