6 9:00 a.m. the Board entered into executive session  
7 with Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the  
8 purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations and  
9 to receive advice of counsel on the matters upon which  
10 the Board shall later vote. The Board returned to  
11 open session at 9:50 a.m.]

13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State  
14 Board of Massage Therapy was held on Tuesday,  
15 September 22, 2020. Becky D. Caufman, LMT, Chair,  
16 called the meeting to order at 10:07 a.m.

18 Roll Call

19 [Chair Caufman requested a roll call of Board  
20 members.]

21 \*\*\*

22 Report of Board Prosecution

23 [Garrett A. Rine, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented  
24 the Consent Agreement for Case No. 19-72-009304.]

25 \*\*\*

1 MR. DAVIS:

2                   Number 7 on the agenda. Based on the  
3                   Board's discussions in executive  
4                   session, I believe the Chair would  
5                   accept a motion to deny the Consent  
6                   Agreement at Case No. 19-72-009304 as  
7                   too lenient.

8 MS. PORAMBO:

9                   I make a motion.

10 MS. BAUGHMAN:

11                   I second it.

12 CHAIR CAUFMAN:

13                   All those opposed, please state your  
14                   name and state the opposition.

15 [The motion carried. Becca Caufman recused herself  
16 from deliberations and voting on the motion.]

18 [Monty J. Batson, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented  
19 the Consent Agreements for Case No. 18-72-000240, Case  
20 No. 18-72-003592, Case No. 18-72-005882, Case No. 19-  
21 72-001590, and Case No. 19-72-008376.]

22   \*\*\*

23 Approval of minutes of the August 5, 2020 meeting

24 CHAIR CAUFMAN:

25                   We are going to look at the approval of

1 the Board draft minutes from August 5,  
2 2020 meeting.

3 [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.]

4 CHAIR CAUFMAN:

5 Are there any other corrections or  
6 additions to the draft minutes from the  
7 August 5 meeting?

8 None seen. I need a motion from  
9 the floor to accept the minutes with the  
10 correction.

11 DR. WALLER:

12 So moved.

13 CHAIR CAUFMAN:

14 Ellyn Jo, first. I need a second.

15 MS. PORAMBO:

16 Second.

17 CHAIR CAUFMAN:

18 Nancy seconds. All those in favor, say  
19 aye. If you opposed, please state your  
20 name. Any abstentions, state your name.

21 [The motion carried unanimously.]

22 \*\*\*

23 Report of Board Regulatory Counsel

24 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a  
25 regulatory status report for the Board's review. He

1 stated the Board currently has four active regulatory  
2 packages. He mentioned the Board voted to promulgate  
3 the child abuse reporting requirements at the last  
4 meeting and he will let the Board know when that  
5 regulation moves forward.

6 Mr. Davis referred to the annex for 16A-726  
7 regarding massage therapy practice in salons. He  
8 mentioned the regulatory committee meeting following  
9 the June 1 meeting, after which amendments had been  
10 made. He also noted discussion regarding what massage  
11 therapy services cosmetologists could perform and what  
12 massage therapy services estheticians could perform,  
13 as per the Cosmo statute.

14 Mr. Davis stated that services a massage  
15 therapist could perform out in the open, not in the  
16 massage therapy room has to be established. He  
17 commented that the act, which is under the Cosmetology  
18 Act, states "no physical barriers separating the areas  
19 used for massage therapy from the areas used for  
20 cosmetology or esthetics shall be required when a  
21 massage therapist performs massage services that a  
22 cosmetologist or esthetician is authorized to perform,  
23 63 P.S. § 151.3(a)(3)(i)." He stated the regulation  
24 then said what those two professions could perform but  
25 proposed new verbiage due to confusion. The proposed

1 regulation now reads, "No physical barriers  
2 separating the areas used for massage therapy from the  
3 areas used for cosmetology or esthetics are required  
4 when a massage therapist performs massage services  
5 that a cosmetologist or esthetician is authorized to  
6 perform, to include the massaging of the scalp, face,  
7 arms or hands, or the upper part of the body and  
8 massaging the hands of an individual or massaging the  
9 lower arms of an individual up to the individual's  
10 elbow, massaging the feet of an individual or the  
11 lower legs of an individual up to the individual's  
12 knee, or a combination of these acts."

13 Mr. Davis referred to changes in the proposed  
14 annex after the prior discussion. He noted the  
15 proposed regulation's citing of Proposed Cosmo Reg  
16 Section 7.150, saying it had a different number in the  
17 earlier version and 7.150 is now the number for the  
18 proposed cosmetology regulation. He also changed a  
19 section to read "the Act" that previously said "the  
20 Massage Therapy Act," as there is no reason to say the  
21 full name of the act in the massage therapy (MT)  
22 regulations.

23 Mr. Davis stated the Cosmetology Board is doing  
24 something very similar and will soon be releasing  
25 their annex to interested parties and stakeholders.

1 He commented that as long as the Cosmetology Board is  
2 comfortable with their annex and the MT Board is  
3 comfortable with their annex, the next step is to  
4 issue an internal memo to the Bureau of Professional  
5 and Occupational Affairs (BPOA), policy office, and a  
6 few others to review it as to whether they are okay  
7 with it.

8 Mr. Davis noted being in direct contact with  
9 Cosmetology Board counsel and is coordinating this  
10 memo at the same time because the statute suggests the  
11 Cosmetology reg and MT reg be jointly promulgated.

12 Mr. Davis referred to 16A-727 regarding licensure  
13 by endorsement under Act 41. He noted he drafted the  
14 preamble for the Board's review, and said he will be  
15 asking for the Board to vote, which will allow the reg  
16 to be promulgated through the regulatory review  
17 process. He noted the need to still complete the  
18 Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF), which is a form for  
19 the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC).

20 Mr. Davis stated the Massage & Bodywork Licensing  
21 Examination (MBLEx) is apparently the "last exam  
22 standing" when it comes to what is available for  
23 perspective massage therapists in the Commonwealth of  
24 Pennsylvania, explaining that all the other  
25 examinations listed in the Board's regulations have



1 been discontinued. He commented that all references  
2 to the National Certification Examination for  
3 Therapeutic Massage (NCETM), the National  
4 Certification Examination for Therapeutic Massage &  
5 Bodywork (NCETMB), including the National Examination  
6 for State Licensure (NESL) option were to be deleted  
7 from the regulations via the Board's General Revisions  
8 Regulation package. However, he found that while  
9 drafting the annex and preamble for the Board's Act 41  
10 regulation, he found that it made more sense to simply  
11 delete all references to the now-defunct examinations  
12 in the Act 41 regulation, rather than the General  
13 Revisions Regulation.

14 Mr. Davis removed the language deleting those  
15 exams from the General Revisions regulation and  
16 inserted that same language into the proposed Act 41  
17 regulation so when the licensure by endorsement under  
18 Act 41 regulation is published as final, it will also  
19 delete the references. He commented that he added  
20 language to the Act 41 regulation's preamble to  
21 explain what the Board is trying to accomplish.]

23 MR. DAVIS:

24 I am going to ask for a motion to allow  
25 Board counsel to promulgate the annex

1 and preamble for 16A-727 licensure by  
2 endorsement under Act 41 through the  
3 regulatory process.

4 MS. PORAMBO:

5 I'll make a motion.

6 CHAIR CAUFMAN:

7 Nancy so moved. Second, please.

8 MS. BAUGHMAN:

9 I'll second.

10 CHAIR CAUFMAN:

11 Camille seconds. All those in favor?  
12 All those opposed, please state your  
13 name. Any abstentions, please state  
14 your name.

15 [The motion carried unanimously.]

16 \*\*\*

17 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred to  
18 proposed regulation 16A-725 regarding general  
19 revisions. He noted working on the general revisions  
20 and provided a draft of the preamble. He noted that  
21 this is the first time the Board has seen the  
22 Preamble, however a RAF has to be drafted. He stated  
23 the General Revisions regulation is different than the  
24 other two massage therapy regulations he is currently  
25 working on, because the other two are statutorily

1 mandated. It is for that reason the draft regulations  
2 for massage therapists in salons, and for licensure by  
3 endorsement under the Act 41, are moving more quickly  
4 though the regulatory process.

5 Mr. Davis noted many moving parts to the preamble  
6 and guaranteed it will be changed by the time it is in  
7 the PA Bulletin.]

9 Report of Commissioner - No Report

11 Report of Board Counsel

12 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, mentioned  
13 working closely with Mr. Batson on developing a  
14 schedule of criminal offenses related to Act 53. He  
15 provided an overview of Act 53, which requires  
16 occupational licensure boards and commissions to apply  
17 one common set of rules when considering whether to  
18 deny, suspend, or revoke a license on the basis of a  
19 criminal conviction.

20 Mr. Davis stated Act 53 will amend the Criminal  
21 History Records Information Act (CHRIA) to require the  
22 Board only withhold a license for convictions which  
23 are directly related to the practice of the  
24 occupation. He noted the Board will consider the  
25 nature of the offense, amount of time passed since the

1 conviction, evidence of the applicant's fitness to  
2 practice the occupation, and other relevant factors  
3 prior to withholding a license.

4 Mr. Davis noted that Act 53 sets forth a two-  
5 stage analysis of the criminal convictions of an  
6 applicant. He stated the Board will have to develop a  
7 list of crimes that directly relate to the occupation  
8 or profession, which is the schedule of criminal  
9 convictions.

10 Mr. Davis noted that if an applicant has a  
11 criminal record, which includes a conviction of one of  
12 the crimes on the list, there will be a rebuttable  
13 presumption that granting licensure to the applicant  
14 will pose a substantial risk to the health and safety  
15 of the applicant's clients, public, and substantial  
16 risk of further criminal conviction. He stated the  
17 applicant will be allowed the opportunity to rebut  
18 this presumption by showing evidence of rehabilitation  
19 as specified in Act 53.

20 Mr. Davis informed the Board that the  
21 Commissioner's Office is reviewing the draft lists and  
22 a BPOA representative will discuss the list with the  
23 Board in an upcoming meeting, and the Board will be  
24 asked to provide input. He commented that the  
25 December meeting may be moved to November due to the

1 need for discussion of the list and someone from BPOA  
2 to talk about it.

3 Mr. Davis mentioned that the list created with  
4 the assistance of Mr. Batson was based on criminal  
5 convictions the Board has traditionally seen as a bar  
6 to licensure and/or criminal convictions directly  
7 relating to the practice of massage therapy. He  
8 stated the list is going to go through a myriad of  
9 reviews and then come before the Board to decide  
10 whether or not the criminal convictions are directly  
11 related to massage therapy.]

12 \*\*\*

13 Adjudication and Order

14 MR. DAVIS:

15 Number 6 on the agenda is Case No. 19-  
16 72-013511. It is an application matter  
17 for an individual named Lili Zhu. The  
18 Board reviewed her application at the  
19 last meeting.

20 They directed me to draft an order  
21 denying the application, and we had a  
22 very frank discussion in executive  
23 session to discuss what I was to put in  
24 the order. I have since put that into  
25 the order; however, one thing we did not

1 specifically talk about at the last  
2 meeting in executive session is whether  
3 or not to say that the license was  
4 denied with prejudice.

5 I know in working with the Board  
6 for 2 years and having access to a lot  
7 of the old orders, this Board likes to  
8 deny with prejudice if we have reason to  
9 believe that there was fraud involved in  
10 the application process. Specifically,  
11 I was told to go back and discuss the  
12 fraud the Board found in this particular  
13 application, which is why I added the  
14 words denied with prejudice in the  
15 ultimate order that was signed and  
16 posted September 3; however, I wanted to  
17 bring it back before the Board so you  
18 could see the argument I made or at  
19 least the reasons that I wrote for the  
20 Board in denying the application in  
21 relation to the fraud on top of which I  
22 wanted the Board to ratify the order  
23 language with prejudice. Are there any  
24 questions based on that? Hearing none.

25 Based on the Board's discussions in

1 executive session, I believe the Chair  
2 would accept a motion to ratify the  
3 September 3, 2020 order in this matter,  
4 which is Case No. 19-72-013511.

5 CHAIR CAUFMAN:

6 Motion from the floor?

7 MS. CHAMBERLAIN:

8 I make a motion.

9 DR. WALLER:

10 I'll second.

11 CHAIR CAUFMAN:

12 All those in favor, please say aye. All

18 Report of Board Administrator

19 [Christina Townley, Board Administrator, updated the  
20 Board regarding the Federation of State Massage  
21 Therapy Boards membership renewal, where renewal forms  
22 have been submitted, payment for dues are being  
23 processed, and FSMTB has been notified.

24 Ms. Townley noted working with Mr. Davis to  
25 complete the FSMTB Member Board Survey, which was sent

1 to FSMTB as well.

2 Ms. Townley reported 9,182 licensees.

3 Chair Caufman informed the Board that FSMTB will  
4 not be having a live annual meeting but are going to  
5 be voting on new executive board members. She  
6 reported registering to be the delegate for the state  
7 of Pennsylvania because of the September 18 deadline.

8 Mr. Davis suggested ratifying the Chair's  
9 decision for the Chair to be the delegate in this  
10 matter.]

11 \*\*\*

12 MR. DAVIS:

13 I believe the Chair would accept a  
14 motion to ratify the Chair's decision to  
15 appoint herself as the delegate in  
16 relation to the FSMTB matter she has

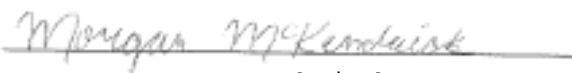
