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3 Report of Regulatory Counsel

4 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed the

5 | Board that proposed regulation 16A-725 regarding

6 massage therapists in cosmetology salons has moved

7 ahead since September. He informed the Board that he

8 | provided Regulatory Counsel with a proposed version

9 containing administrative amendments requested by

10 Regulatory Counsel on October 15, 2021. He noted 16A-

11 | 725 will move forward if Regulatory Counsel approves

12 those changes.

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Mr. Davis addressed the general revisions regulation, noting that it was his opinion that the current version requires considerable discussion and possibly revision. He suggested having a virtual meeting of the Regulatory Committee to specifically discuss the general revisions regulation before the next meeting on February 15, 2022, and Board members agreed to have a meeting on January 28, 2022.

Chair Caufman commented that Act 41 and a few other things have impacted the general revisions regulation and agreed that it needed to be revisited and thanked Mr. Davis for his support.

25 Mr. Davis noted there will be something posted to

the Board website announcing the time of the Reg

Committee meeting as well as a link, along with some

materials with regard to what will be discussed in

accordance with the Sunshine Act. He welcomed the

public to join the regulatory meeting.]

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Appointment - Mai Lin Petrine, Director of Legal and Regulatory Affairs

[Mai Lin Petrine, Director of Legal and Regulatory
Affairs, Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards
(FSMTB), presented to the Board to provide an overview
of programs and services that FSMTB can provide to
support the Board.

Ms. Petrine stated that FSMTB originated in 2005 with a group of regulators from seven different states who noticed a need for a national licensing exam and a national database of massage therapist licensing information with a goal to create an organization to facilitate the development of tools to support consumer protection and massage regulation.

Ms. Petrine stated FSMTB was made up of member boards, who have a vote at the annual meeting in directing policy, electing the board of directors, promulgating resolutions, and other task forces. She commented that FSMTB is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit

organization comprised of 45 member boards and agencies that dictates what FSMTB can do.

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Ms. Petrine addressed FSMTB's goal to facilitate professional mobility and simplify and standardize the licensing process. She noted FSMTB represents member boards in matters consistent with the scope of the bylaws. She gave a "shout-out" to Chair Caufman for chairing the Policy Committee with respect to vetting and providing the proposed amendments for the members to consider.

Ms. Petrine provided an overview of all of the different things FSMTB offers. She noted the signature program of FSMTB is the Massage & Bodywork Licensing Examination (MBLEx), which was developed through a job task analysis. She noted FSMTB is about to launch another job task analysis and encouraged Board members to look in their mailboxes.

Ms. Petrine addressed member support, noting FSMTB provides assistance in revising rules and obtaining best practices or comparative information from other states with respect to a particular issue or topic.

Ms. Petrine discussed the launch of the Massage
Therapy Licensing Database (MTLD, a/k/a "MaTiLDa") for
MBLEx results and disciplinary and demographic

information from state boards that are participating.

She noted it was FSMTB's goal to utilize this tool to facilitate information sharing.

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Ms. Petrine stated that FSMBT provides a vetting of schools with respect to the eligibility of their students to take the MBLEx to massage regulatory boards. She noted one of the challenges in massage therapy regulation is the lack of consensus on massage education. She mentioned FSMTB has developed an education policy to promote a standard benchmark as to who should be eligible to sit for the exam.

Ms. Petrine addressed the massage therapy
licensing compact initiative that launched this past
May in conjunction with the Council for State
Governments. She commented that FSMTB along with the
Commission on Massage Therapy Accreditation (COMTA)
received a grant from the Department of Defense for
the Council for State Governments to facilitate the
development of a compact.

Ms. Petrine noted that the compact respects the federalism principle and basically creates an agreement between the states that are members of the compact to accept or license individuals from other states. She noted the goal right now is for the draft compact language to be presented for public comment

and notice in early spring 2022.

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Ms. Petrine provided an example of a screenshot from the Massage Therapy Licensing Database (MTLD), which will be a critical element of the compact. She noted every compact that has been enacted has a national database system that facilitates mobility as well as consistency and uniformity in discipline decisions.

Ms. Petrine addressed events FSMTB provides for member boards, including the 2022 FSMTB Annual Meeting in Charlotte, NC, October 18-20. She discussed a service called a Member Board Executive (MBE) Summit.

Ms. Petrine noted a program FSMTB offers called Regulatory Education and Competence Hub (REACH), which is a collection of online courses developed at FSMTB based on the recommendations from their membership. She provided an example of courses offered. She mentioned being in discussions and working with other member boards to develop courses specific to their needs.

Ms. Petrine noted launching the Continuing Education (CE) Registry, which is a registry of continuing education that meets CE standards developed by the License Renewal Committee of FSMTB.

Ms. Petrine announced FSMTB would like to promote

its communication and outreach with member boards and developed a series of membership events that will launch in January 2022. She noted the events will be on the second Wednesday of each month at 1:00 p.m. EST with the first one starting on January 12, 2022, and provided an overview of some of the topics.

Ms. Petrine informed the Board that further information could be obtained on the Massage Therapy Licensing Compact at the Council for State Governments website.

Ms. Petrine encouraged the Board to reach out to FSMBT with any questions or inquiries and provided contact information.

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Chair Caufman commented that the membership virtual events are amazing and encouraged everyone to volunteer, noting people who are not current Board members are able to facilitate volunteerism, too.

Chair Caufman thanked Ms. Petrine for the presentation and commented on how FSMTB has grown with the development of MTLD, which is now a very well-researched database. She encouraged everybody to join the very first membership virtual event titled the "Regulatory Role and the Fundamentals" on January 12.

Ms. Petrine thanked Chair Caufman for all of her work for FSMTB.]
