15 further explained that they would have had to comply
16 with the terms of the agreement and demonstrate they
17 complied with the criminal probation.

18 Mr. Anderson noted the individual would have the
19 ability for the Board to issue a full unrestricted
20 license, along with the removal of probationary
21 status, as long as they complied with criminal
22 probation and the agreement and the Board would also
23 have the ability to ask for a hearing for any sort of
24 issues.

25 Mr. Anderson further explained that the

1 individual has been on suspension for almost 2 years
2 and a 4-year probation period under the criminal
3 courts and has around 16 monitoring reports to
4 demonstrate they have been complying with all of the
5 requirements of practice. He stated any violations
6 or failure to comply would be a notification
7 requirement from the monitor and then that would be a
8 violation of the agreement and discipline would be
9 imposed in the form of the suspension.

10 Dr. Ripchinski requested clarity as to whether
11 there would be an automatic review by the Board to
12 ensure full compliance before reissuance of any
13 unrestricted license at the end of the probationary
14 period.

15 Mr. Anderson explained that all probation
16 monitoring reports go to the probation compliance
17 officer during the course of the probation, so there
18 is monitoring throughout the course of the probation
19 to make sure that everything is being done in that
20 fashion. He further explained that the individual
21 has to submit a petition requesting the Board remove
22 them from probationary status at the end of the
23 period of probation and is where the Board would have
24 the ability to review everything that has been done
25 to make that decision.

1 Mr. Anderson also mentioned that any violations
2 that occurred during the course of the probation is a
3 notification that comes to prosecution for the
4 potential filing of the petition for appropriate
5 relief, which would result in the suspension of the
6 license.

11 [Donald M. Yealy, M.D., Vice Chair, thanked Chair

12 Woodland and multiple members of the Board who

13 attended the Federation of State Medical Boards

14 (FSMB) Meeting in Minneapolis to represent the

15 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and to learn and bring

16 back new insights and information. He mentioned

17 there was excellent participation by Board members,

18 leadership, and acquisition of insights about

19 activities that are happening around the country that

20 could make their Board even more effective.

21 Vice Chair Yealy noted Chair Woodland presented

22 Board activities during the pandemic and how they

23 adapted to the new circumstances and able to continue

24 on with an efficient approach.

25 Mr. Dillon commented that it was an excellent

1 educational program, where all of the individual
2 representatives in the states had an opportunity to
3 weigh in on all FSMB recommendations and policies.
4 He noted it to be a great opportunity to meet
5 colleagues from around the country and other public
6 members.

7 Mr. Eisenhauer mentioned that the Commonwealth of
8 Pennsylvania was very well represented with Dr.
9 Woodland, not only in his official position on the
10 Board, and his presentation was very well received
11 and reflected very positively on the Board's approach
12 to the cases they handle.

13 Vice Chair Yealy informed everyone of multiple
14 open positions on the State Board of Medicine. He
15 addressed the importance of having a Board that is
16 full based on its structure and mandates and
17 represents everybody they serve, including those
18 seeking licensure and the people they serve across
19 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

20 Vice Chair Yealy encouraged anyone who may know
21 someone who could fill either one of the physicians
22 or the nonphysician roles on the Board of Medicine to
23 forward that information to the Board. He noted the
24 Board is looking for excellence in all different
25 forms to make sure they represent professionals and

1 the people of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from
2 all different types of backgrounds to help make the
3 best possible decisions.

4 Vice Chair Yealy recognized National Emergency
5 Medical Services (EMS) Week. He stated emergency
6 medical services providers actually interface with
7 people, oftentimes when it is most critical in
8 changing the trajectory of health or recovery. He
9 thanked all of the EMS professionals and encouraged
10 everyone to support them as much as possible.

11 Vice Chair Yealy commented that there would not
12 be the level of care and recovery from acute illness
13 and injury that exists all across the United States
14 if it were not for those professionals.

15 Vice Chair Yealy addressed wellness and safety
16 issues of licensees and healthcare professionals. He
17 noted *The Philadelphia Inquirer* had an article on the
18 front page today about safety concerns with
19 healthcare professionals. He mentioned that both
20 verbal and physical assaults have been changing and
21 the Board is engaged with the executive and
22 legislative branches to find solutions. He noted the
23 importance of keeping people safe and allowing the
24 people providing the care to be the best versions of
25 themselves.

1 Vice Chair Yealy stated the Board of Medicine has
2 sponsored numerous things that focus on tools to help
3 all licensees be the best version of themselves. He
4 noted the importance of continuing discussions with
5 local institutions and local communities and welcomed
6 any ideas. He stated the Board does not create
7 legislation but can often be influential and help
8 guide as steps are taken to resolve issues.

9 Vice Chair Yealy addressed material Chair
10 Woodland wanted to share with the Board. He
11 discussed fitness and maintenance of health before
12 illness strikes, where efforts and resources can be
13 the most impactful. He mentioned that the
14 opportunity is heightened in older citizens in the
15 community, where activity and other health
16 maintenance activities can be quite effective in
17 either maintaining health or preventing illness.

18 Vice Chair Yealy stated mental health and
19 behavioral health issues are dominant, particularly
20 in the young and very old, where there is more of a
21 sense of isolation and crises. He addressed long
22 wait times to see a professional and noted people are
23 focusing on the issue also at the national level.

24 Vice Chair Yealy addressed women's health and
25 women in childbearing ages, along with children,

1 noting they are not at levels that would be expected
2 from the capability and capacities that exist across
3 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and across the
4 United States. He mentioned that the Board is open
5 to finding ways to improve this issue. He noted the
6 Board looks very carefully and cautiously at any
7 commentary activities with the legislation and with
8 individual licensees when that crops up.

9 Vice Chair Yealy addressed the human
10 immunodeficiency virus (HIV), noting it to be an
11 infection and a constellation of illnesses that has
12 changed and is now easily managed but not without
13 consequences. He mentioned being in a much better
14 place today but noted the importance of being aware
15 of testing, treatment options, and counseling for not
16 only direct consequences of HIV but also indirect
17 consequences.]
