5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State
6 Board of Medicine was held on Tuesday, May 19, 2020
7 via teleconference. Keith E. Loiselle, Chairman,
8 Public Member, called the meeting to order at 9:02
9 a.m.

10 ***

11 [Chairman Loiselle thanked everyone for their patience
12 and assistance with dealing remotely and virtually
13 with the COVID-19 crisis. The Board continues its
14 work to mitigate the effects of the virus. The
15 public's support and understanding are very important.

16 Chairman Loiselle thanked Governor Wolfe,
17 Secretary of State Kathy Boockvar, Secretary of Health
18 Dr. Rachel Levine, and Acting Commissioner K. Kalonji
19 Johnson, Board Administrator Suzanne Zerbe, Bureau
20 staff, and IT personnel for their significant work in
21 this crisis.

22 Chairman Loiselle noted for the record, that even
23 though this meeting was being conducted via a
24 conference call, it would still carry with it the same
25 force and effect as if conducted under normal

1 circumstances. He noted changes to policies pursuant
2 to orders from Governor Wolf and Secretary Levine to
3 move more quickly to approve licensees in light of the
4 COVID-19 situation. Precautions are being taken in
5 granting the approval of licenses.]

6 ***

7 Approval of minutes of the April 14, 2020 meeting

8 CHAIRMAN LOISELLE:

9 May I have a motion to approve the April
10 Minutes, please?

11 DR. WOODLAND:

12 So moved.

13 DR. VALIGORSKY:

14 Second.

15 CHAIRMAN LOISELLE:

16 Dr. Woodland moves. Dr. Valigorsky
17 seconds. All in favor, say aye. Any
18 opposed?

19 [The motion carried unanimously.]

20 ***

21 [Chairman Loiselles asked everyone to mute their
22 phones. However, whenever someone spoke, for the
23 benefit of the stenographer, to please state their
24 names and then speak.]

25 ***

1 Roll Call

2 [Chairman Loiselles requested the roll call of Board
3 members and those in attendance.]

4 ***

5 [Chairman Loiselles recognized and commended Dr. Domen
6 for his appointment to the Ethics and Professionalism
7 Committee at the Federation of State Medical Boards.]

8 ***

9 [Chairman Loiselles requested the identification of all
10 participants in the teleconference meeting. He then
11 reminded all to mute and turn off all electronic
12 devices.]

13 Board Counsel reminded all participants that the
14 meeting was being recorded. Acting Commissioner
15 Johnson reviewed the agenda format for the
16 teleconference meeting.]

17 ***

18 Report of Prosecutorial Division

19 [Adam Williams, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented a

1 Report of Acting Commissioner

2 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of
3 Professional and Occupational Affairs, thanked the
4 Board members for their time and flexibility in
5 adapting to the new schedule. He directed all public
6 attendees to the website of the State Board of
7 Medicine for continued updates on the COVID-19-related
8 restrictions on regulatory provisions. He also noted
9 recent sessions for medical trainees and the
10 Governor's Executive Order providing for expanded
11 social conduct for health-related practitioners under
12 the direction and guidance of physicians and
13 osteopathic physicians, such as in long-term care
14 facilities and hospitals.

15 Acting Commissioner Johnson encouraged all to
16 continue visiting the COVID-19 page, as well as the
17 phase reopening pages. He noted 24 counties in the
18 yellow phase and the applied restrictions based on
19 locations in the Commonwealth and travel.

20 Acting Commissioner Johnson thanked the Board for
21 their continued support and work with opening
22 communications with stakeholders on the
23 Administration's position. He thanked the
24 stakeholders for their efforts as well.]

25

1 Report of Board Vice Chairman - No Report

2

3 Report of Committee on Health Related Professionals
4 [John M. Mitchell, L.P., C.C.P., Vice Chairman,
5 thanked the Board, Board Counsel, and Acting
6 Commissioner Johnson for their actions on behalf of
7 the perfusionists in Pennsylvania by extending the
8 term for the temporary-graduate license. He
9 anticipated approval of the perfusionists' regulation
10 once the meetings resume normal format. Shana Walter,
11 Esquire, Board Counsel, announced the intention to
12 continue discussion related to Board regulations at
13 the June meeting.]

14

15 Report of Committee on Licensure Qualifications
16 [Mark B. Woodland, M.D., thanked all for their
17 contributions in light of the COVID-19 crisis. He
18 noted almost 10% of COVID-19 positives are from
19 health-care professionals, signifying these
20 professionals being in the frontline. This Board and
21 the Department of Health have been responsive to those
22 situations.

23 Dr. Woodland commented that COVID did not cure
24 cancer, stop opiate abuse disorder or other medical
25 diseases. He emphasized the need to take care of all

1 patients and make patients feel safe in the healthcare
2 facilities again. He discussed the responsibility to
3 learn more about COVID-19 and the Multisystem
4 Inflammatory Syndrome.

5 Dr. Woodland discussed a meeting of the Committee
6 on Licensure Qualifications. Many of the medical
7 schools were three months off of their learning
8 curriculum and have come together to put forth ways to
9 bring the learners back into the clinical facilities.
10 June 8, 2020, was designated as the first date for the
11 return. He also discussed new residents, returning
12 residents, and graduating residents obtaining a lot of
13 education about the pandemic, as well as the financial
14 issues related to the pandemic.

15 Dr. Woodland commented on being touched by the
16 graduation 2020 ceremonies on a local network and the
17 suicide of a high school senior. He recognized the
18 need to address mental health issues as well during
19 this crisis.

20 Ms. Walter noted the issuance of guidance on the
21 return of students by the Department of Education on
22 its website. Dr. Woodland recognized the Department
23 of Education and Department of Health guidelines for
24 medical students.]

25

1 Report of Department of Health
2 [Mary Pat Howard, Executive Assistant of Quality
3 Assurance, on behalf of Rachel Levine, M.D., Physician
4 General/Secretary of Health, discussed the efforts to
5 continually update the reports of COVID-19 in
6 Pennsylvania. As of noon on May 18, 2020, there were
7 63,056 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in all 67 counties
8 with a total of 4,505 deaths. The website is updated
9 every day at noon. Most cases of COVID-19 are in the
10 southeast portion of the state, including
11 Philadelphia. Many positives results are from nursing
12 homes and personal care homes across Pennsylvania,
13 which accounts for 15,737 cases in 561 facilities in
14 44 counties. 3,000 deaths were residents in nursing
15 homes.

16 Ms. Howard urged all to visit the website to view
17 the breakdown by counties. More cases were being seen
18 daily, but certainly have leveled off; hence, the
19 Governor granting the reopening of counties.

20 Ms. Howard, since the start of this crisis, the
21 state has pushed close to 5 million N-95 masks and
22 184,000 bottles of hand sanitizer. She reiterated Dr.
23 Woodland's discussion on mental health issues. The
24 Department of Health was applauded by the Board.

25 Chairman Loiselle questioned the ability to see

1 statistics related to the current active cases. Ms.
2 Howard replied that the raw number is also available
3 on the website. She discussed seeing more cases due
4 to the increase in testing. She noted many hospitals
5 are getting back to normal operations. Dr. Woodland
6 suggested a public service announcement regarding the
7 precautions taken and safety of the healthcare
8 facilities.

9 Chairman Loiselle reiterated the need to instill
10 confidence in the public to reengage in society. He
11 discussed misleading the public with only seeing the
12 total number of COVID-19 cases versus the total number
13 of active cases. He expressed his appreciation for
14 the work of the Governor and the Department of Health.

15 Ms. Howard reported, as a nation, 288,842 cases
16 have recovered from COVID. She will provide a
17 Pennsylvania number at a later time.]

18 ***

19 Report of Board Chair

20 [Keith E. Loiselle, Chairman, Public Member, noted the
21 anticipation of new members joining the Board. The
22 Board was currently short four members.

23 Chairman Loiselle discussed additional measures
24 by the Board to handle ongoing issues during this
25 crisis, such as the restrictions placed on the

1 education of medical students. He thanked the Acting
2 Commissioner and Board staff for their additional
3 work. Chairman Loiselle reiterated Dr. Woodland's
4 concern related to the treatment of other illnesses
5 and health conditions that need to be addressed.

6 Chairman Loiselle noted Allegheny County's
7 decision to not open public swimming pools in 2020.
8 He discussed its possible impact on the public.]

9

10 Report of Board Counsel

11 [Dana Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the
12 Board would be discussing the Consent Agreements
13 present, as well as Agenda Items 9 through 22, in
14 Executive Session.]

18 [Chairman Loiselle referred Board members to the 2020
19 and 2021 Board meeting dates for review. He stated
20 the next meeting is scheduled for June 23, 2020.]

25 the Board entered into Executive Session at 10:07 a.m.]

4 receive legal advice from Board Counsel. The Board
5 returned to open session at 11:44 a.m.]

7 [Chairman Loiselles stated a number of cases were
8 discussed. Some changes to the policy may allow
9 physicians to be relicensed for a variety of different
10 situations for the purpose of being prepared to treat
11 the anticipated need arising from the coronavirus
12 pandemic. It became evident to the Board that some
13 applications were brought before the Board to
14 ostensibly treat COVID. The Board will grant
15 relicensure based on acceptable intention.]
