6 Board of Medicine was held on Tuesday, December 15,
7 2020. Mark B. Woodland, M.S., M.D., Chair, called the
8 meeting to order at 10:44 a.m.

9 ***

10 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at
11 9:00 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session
12 with Dana M. Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, and
13 Shana M. Walter, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the
14 purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on
15 a number of matters currently pending before the Board
16 and to receive the advice of counsel. The Board
17 returned to open session at 10:30 a.m.]

18 ***

19 [Chair Woodland requested that all electronic devices
20 be muted.]

21 ***

22 [Theodore Stauffer, Executive Secretary, Bureau of
23 Professional and Occupational Affairs, noted the
24 meeting was being recorded, and those who remained on
25 the line were consenting to being recorded.]

2 [Members of the Board, Bureau Personnel and Audience
3 were identified.]

4 ***

5 [Nazanin Silver, M.D. was welcomed as the Board's
6 newest member.]

7 ***

8 Report of Prosecution Division

9 [Adam Morris, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented a

7 Approval of minutes of the October 27, 2020 meeting
8 CHAIR WOODLAND:

9 Do I have a motion to approve?

10 DR. YEALY:

11 So moved.

12 MR. EISENHAUER:

13 Second.

14 CHAIR WOODLAND:

15 All in favor? Anybody not in favor?

16 [The motion carried unanimously.]

17 ***

18 Report of Commissioner

19 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of
20 Professional and Occupational Affairs, had no formal
21 report but welcomed the new Medical Board officers.
22 He expressed his readiness to work with everyone. He
23 wished all a safe and healthy holiday.

24 Commissioner Johnson noted that changes were
25 coming to the PALS system in the New Year. He

1 reminded licensees to submit renewals before December
2 31, 2020.]

3

4 Report of Department of Health

5 [Mary Pat Howard, M.S., RN-BC, Executive Assistant of
6 Quality Assurance, on behalf of Rachel Levine, M.D.,
7 Department of Health, reported that the Department of
8 Health was working hard to move forward with everyday
9 issues. With regard to the COVID pandemic, there were
10 672 people on ventilators, 1,227 in an intensive care
11 unit, and recently 10,684 new cases for a statewide
12 total of 499,764.

13 Ms. Howard indicated that the number of people
14 who had recovered from COVID had decreased to 58
15 percent. She noted 55 new deaths and 129 new deaths
16 were recently reported, with total deaths at 12,620.
17 Ms. Howard noted that many counties were at 5 percent
18 or lower but could certainly surge back up.

19 She stated Pennsylvania, as a whole, had been
20 allocated 97,500 doses of the COVID vaccine to 87
21 hospitals. Philadelphia will receive 13,650 doses.
22 The interim plan for vaccinations was posted on the
23 Department of Health website for review.

24 Ms. Howard indicated that Secretary Levine
25 requested that information on gender, race, and

1 ethnicity be collected as vaccines are given.]

2 ***

3 Report of Committee on Health-Related Professionals
4 [Donald M. Yealy, M.D., on behalf of Walter
5 Eisenhower, PA-C, reported that a meeting was held to
6 discuss committee structure and what topics might be
7 available. Otherwise, there was no other activity.]

8 ***

9 Report of Committee on Legislation/Policy Development
10 and Review
11 [Ronald Domen, M.D., indicated no meeting was held and
12 had no report.]

13 ***

14 Report of Committee on Licensure Qualifications
15 [Chair Woodland will include a report regarding this
16 matter as part of his Chair report.]

17 ***

18 Report of Board Vice-Chair
19 [Ronald Domen, M.D., Vice Chair, welcomed new member
20 Dr. Nazanin Silver.]

21 ***

22 Report of Board Chair
23 [Mark B. Woodland, M.S., M.D., Chair, congratulated
24 Dr. Yealy who recently received a lifetime/career
25 achievement award from Drexel University College of

1 Medicine. Chair Woodland extended "greetings" from
2 past Chair Loiselle, who was recovering from COVID.
3 Former Chair Loiselle wanted to express his
4 appreciation for the cake sent by the Board and for
5 nominating him for the FSMB John H. Clark, MD
6 Leadership Award.

7 Chair Woodland reminded members of the State
8 Board of Medicine's role, which includes two aspects,
9 the State Board of Medicine's practice of medicine
10 through the licensure, registration and certification
11 of members of the medical profession in the
12 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Secondly, the Board
13 periodically views the character of the instruction
14 and the facilities by each of the medical colleges and
15 other medical treating facilities offering medical
16 treatment in accordance with the laws of the
17 Commonwealth that the Board needs to take some
18 direction.

19 Chair Woodland commented that after last month's
20 meeting, the State Board of Medicine supported the
21 efforts of the Commonwealth in the COVID litigation
22 process and posted its comments on the website. He
23 noted that the Board needed to be proactive with
24 regard to those issues, and the State Medicine Board
25 needed to support correct information regarding the

1 vaccine.

2 Chair Woodland also raised the issue of medical
3 provider well-being as a major issue moving forward
4 with regard to licensure and qualifications as well as
5 recognizing what the Board may be able to do to help
6 with medical provider well-being.

7 He commented that suicide was the tenth leading
8 cause of death in the United States, and physicians
9 were two times the rate of the general population.

10 Chair Woodland asked that the Board concentrate
11 on medical provider diversity, including racial
12 diversity, and what it does to the health of the
13 Commonwealth.

14 He indicated that January 23rd is Maternal Health
15 Awareness Day, and noted that the color of someone's
16 skin raises the potential for maternal mortality by
17 four times over a white person. He asked the Board to
18 be cognizant of gender and ethnicity. He, as Chair,
19 would be cognizant of using appropriate pronouns where
20 applicable and making sure the minutes represent the
21 Board equally in a way that is respectful.]

22 ***

23 Report of Board Counsel

24 [Dana Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the
25 Board discussed Consent Agreements presented during

1 Executive Session as well as Agenda Item Nos. 21
2 through 29.]

3 ***

4 Regulatory Status Report

5 [Dana Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred Board
6 members to Act 41 of 2018. She indicated that a draft
7 annex sent out for exposure comment was returned, and
8 she drafted the Preamble and the Regulatory Analysis
9 Form (RAF) for the Board's review. Ms. Wucinski
10 explained that once approved by the Board and her
11 office, then the proposed rulemaking process would
12 commence.]

13 MS. WUCINSKI:

14 Today I am requesting a vote to proceed
15 with the proposed rulemaking if everyone
16 is okay with the draft.

17 DR. YEALY:

18 I'll move.

19 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON:

20 Second.

21 CHAIR WOODLAND:

22 And is there any discussion on this? Is
23 there anybody that is opposed to this
24 proposed rulemaking going forward?
25 Hearing none, seeing none, this goes

1 forward. Thank you very much.

2 [The motion carried unanimously.]

3 ***

4 For the Board's Information - Discussion

5 Current Committee List

6 [Chair Woodland noted that right after Executive
7 Session, the Board reviewed the committee list and
8 decided on some modifications.

9 With regard to the Probable Cause Screening
10 Committee, Dr. Valigorsky is Chair and Dr. Domen is a
11 primary. Dr. Silver was proposed as an alternate with
12 Mary Pat Howard.

13 With regard to the Committee on Allied Health-
14 Related Professionals, Dr. Woodland took himself off
15 as Co-Chair, and Mr. Eisenhauer is now Co-Chair with
16 Dr. Yealy and Dr. Valigorsky and Mr. Dillon remain as
17 Public Members on the committee. There was discussion
18 with regard to the elimination of the Subcommittee for
19 Physician Assistant Application Review because the
20 Committee on Health-Related Professionals handles
21 those issues.

22 With regard to the Committee on Legislation/
23 Policy Development and Review, Mary Pat Howard Co-
24 Chairs with Dr. Domen, and Dr. Valigorsky and Dr.
25 Yealy also sit on the committee. Mr. Dillon was added

1 as a public member.

2 With regard to the Committee on Licensure
3 Qualifications, Dr. Yealy and Mr. Dillon are Co-
4 Chairs, and Dr. Domen, Mary Pat Howard and Mr.
5 Eisenhower are also members. Chair Woodland removed
6 himself from the committee.]

7 CHAIR WOODLAND:

8 Can I have a motion to approve the
9 Committees as indicated?

10 DR. SILVER:

11 Yes.

12 DR. DOMEN:

13 Second.

14 CHAIR WOODLAND:

15 Does anybody disagree with the committee
16 structure? Hearing none and seeing none,
17 I will move that forward.

19 Board Meeting Dates

20 Upcoming 2021 Medical Board Meeting Dates

21 [Chair Woodland asked Board members to review the
22 Board meeting dates scheduled for February 2, March 9,
23 April 13, May 25, June 22, July 27, September 14,
24 October 26 and December 14. Board members were in
25 agreement with those dates.]

2 Old Business/New Business

3 Approval of Proposed 2022 Board Meeting Dates

4 MS. ZERBE:

5 We'll need a motion to approve the 2022
6 dates.

7 DR. YEALY:

8 I make a motion to approve them.

9 [There was no second to the motion.]

10

11 HB2976 - Anesthesiology Assistants

12 [Dana Wucinski, Board Counsel, noted this matter was
13 placed on the agenda just as an FYI. She explained
14 that this bill would create a license for certified
15 anesthesiologist assistants as they currently have no
16 legislative ability to practice in Pennsylvania. She
17 indicated that they are master's level, non physician
18 anesthesia providers who work side by side with
19 anesthesiologists. Ms. Wucinski noted, per House Bill
20 memorandum, there were 17 other jurisdictions,
21 including the Territory of Guam, whom recognize the
22 ability of the anesthesiologist assistant to practice.
23 She noted this bill was referred to the House
24 Professional Licensure on November 30, 2020.

25 There was discussion regarding the difference

1 between a nurse anesthetist and an anesthesiology
2 assistant. It was noted the difference between the
3 supervision agreement and the NA agreement should also
4 be addressed.

5 Commissioner Johnson appreciated the Board
6 placing comments and questions on the record and noted
7 that the House and Senate oversight committees do
8 review them.

9 Nancy Dunbar, M.D., a Pennsylvania physician,
10 thanked the Board for its work on behalf of physicians
11 and also for waiving the license renewal fees this
12 year. Dr. Dunbar asked the Board to consider a way to
13 improve communicating with physicians. Her comment
14 was tabled until the appropriate time on the agenda.

15 It was suggested that the Board contact the
16 Anesthesiology Association with regard to HB 2976.
17 Ms. Wucinski noted this information was taken from the
18 General Assembly website but would review the matter
19 further. Chair Woodland reviewed different websites
20 just to further educate himself.]

21

22 HB 64 - Continuing Education

23 [Shana Walter, Esquire, Board Counsel, indicated that
24 House Bill No. 64 was actually signed into law by the
25 Governor on November 25, 2020, and allows for the

1 ability to provide for carryover continuing education.
2 She asked the Board to comment on its thoughts
3 regarding carryover continuing education. She noted
4 the Board would need to discuss how much could be
5 carried over.

6 Dr. Yealy commented that it was reasonable but
7 with limits. Chair Woodland stated it was important
8 to recognize that continuing education is a process
9 which helps to keep providers up to date.

10 Counsel explained that if the Board is interested
11 in moving forward, then regulations can be drafted
12 that specifically provide for what can be carried over
13 and in what amount for each profession that has CE
14 requirements.

15 Commissioner Johnson commented that the
16 legislation already applies reasonable limits to the
17 scope of the carryover, but it is certainly within the
18 Board's discretion to look at more stringent measures
19 with regard to types of CE.]

20

21 Proposed Regulation Midwifery Modernization Act -
22 Removed from Agenda

23

24 Public Comments

25 [Chair Woodland addressed Dr. Dunbar's question

1 regarding improved communications with the
2 Commonwealth's physicians. Ms. Walter explained that
3 electronic prescribing guidelines are through the
4 Department of Health and discussed during Board
5 meetings. The fee waivers are also discussed at
6 previous board meetings. Suzanne Zerbe, Board
7 Administrator, explained that in the renewal
8 instructions it was noted that the Board did waive the
9 fee.

10 Commissioner Johnson noted that distribution of
11 the information was limited by resources to promote or
12 market every piece of news beyond posting links on the
13 Board's website and working with stakeholders to
14 spread the information. Persons interested in further
15 information were referred to the State Board of
16 Medicine website for information regarding the
17 authority of the Board, and more recently, how it has
18 responded to COVID.

19 Dr. Dunbar noted there was no easy link from the
20 Board of Medicine site as far as the minutes. One
21 would actually have to Google to find them. Dr.
22 Silver suggested further discussion regarding
23 improving the Board's website to make information more
24 readily accessible. Mr. Eisenhauer suggested a
25 meeting with Commissioner Johnson regarding the matter

1 and then reporting back to the Board at the next
2 meeting.]

3 ***

12 for Physician Assistant Application Review was
13 eliminated. Chair Woodland responded that the
14 subcommittee was actually for physician assistant

19 Ms. Wucinski commented that due to the current
20 declared state of emergency, the emergency clause
21 Board's regulations at section 18.163 allows for
22 physician assistants to practice ~~upon~~ per submission
23 of their written agreements to the Board. Any delay in
24 processing of physician assistant written agreements
25 is due to the emergency situation and not due to the

1 subcommittee.]
