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6 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,

B and informed Board members that Ms. Wolfgang has been

14 Ms. Pachter Schulder noted the Board approved the

15 | Continued Competency and Licensure by Endorsement

16 regulation, 16A-5143, in June and was with Regulatory

17 Counsel.

18 Ms. Pachter Schulder informed Board members that

19 | 16A-5146 regarding the Opioid Prescription and

20 Education and Organ Donation Education regulation

21 | would be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin

22 | tomorrow and trigger the 30-day public comment

23 period. She contacted the organ donation

24 organizations to advise them of a possible six to

25 eight month timeframe, noting they were not sure how

long it would take to produce the manuals.

Ms. Pachter Schulder addressed 16A-5145 regarding CRNA Licensure and was in the process of making revisions based on Ms. Wolfgang's comments. She mentioned there were questions regarding the fee, which would be reviewed by the Board.

Ms. Pachter Schulder noted 16A-5147 regarding the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC) would dovetail into the presentation about partial implementation of the NLC. She mentioned that the NLC had been partially implemented in Pennsylvania on September 5th, meaning that registered nurses and practical nurses who hold a multistate license from another state may practice in Pennsylvania and do not need to register in this state in order to practice if they hold a multistate license.

Ms. Pachter Schulder stated the Board sent an email to all licensees advising them of partial implementation, and there is a section on the Board's web page devoted to the NLC. She also mentioned upcoming NCSBN webinars regarding the Compact would now be available, along with information concerning health systems and schools.

Ms. Pachter Schulder addressed NCSBN's e-Notify, where employers could provide to NCSBN the names and

license numbers of their employees and then NCSBN could send a notice of the status of the license to the employer and licensee. She mentioned that nursing education programs may also use e-Notify.

Ms. Pachter Schulder noted, based upon discussions with the Department of Health (DOH), that hospitals must request a waiver from the DOH if DOH regulations require a nurse license issued under the Professional Nursing Law or under the Practical Nurse Law.

Ms. Pachter Schulder mentioned the Board also had conversations with the Department of Education,
Department of Health and Human Services, Department of Aging, Department of Corrections, and Veterans
Affairs to make sure there are not any concerns. She explained that they have to address the language in their regulations or would not be able to use licensees who have a multistate license to fill positions.

Ms. Pachter Schulder stated full implementation cannot occur because the Board still does not have the authority to receive the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) background checks. She explained that once it is approved by the FBI, then the legislature would have to adopt the approved

language. Thereafter, the Bureau/Department may request regulatory authority so temporary regulations could be promulgated implanting full implementation.

Ms. Pachter Schulder explained that the first piece is the FBI background check, the second piece is the temporary regulations, and the third piece is technology. She noted the Board was working with its vendor to build the system to allow for full implementation.

Ms. Pachter Schulder stated anyone who wanted to obtain a CRNP, CNS, or Certified Nurse Midwife certification at the current time would have to hold a Pennsylvania RN license because an RN license is a prerequisite in order to obtain certification. She reported that the licensure system was not yet set up to allow the Board to recognize a multistate license thereby permitting a multistate RN to apply for certification as a CRNP.

Ms. Pachter Schulder stated the Compact identified in the legislation is for registered and practical nurses only. She noted the Advanced Practice Compact has not been adopted by the legislature or even implemented by NCSBN because currently there is not a minimum number of states to participate.

Ms. Pachter Schulder addressed issues with legislation concerning nurse midwives, noting that the Consensus Model includes nurse midwives as APRNs, but in Pennsylvania they are certified by the State Boards of Medicine or Osteopathic Medicine.

Ms. Pachter Schulder addressed how close they are to resolving the issue with the FBI. She explained that language was sent to the FBI in June 2022, and the FBI does not have a timeframe; for example, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) has 30 days to respond.

Ms. Pachter Schulder noted NCSBN informed the Board that there is federal legislation for the States Handling Access to Reciprocity for Employment (SHARE) Act that had been introduced but did not believe that would be enacted this session. She mentioned that not being able to get a multistate license from Pennsylvania is not in the Board's hands or the Department's hands.

Ms. Pachter Schulder addressed 16A-66 regarding the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA) regulation about Crimes Directly Related to the Profession. She informed Board members that Ms. DeLaurentis and Mr. McDonald would be discussing those regulations within the next couple of

[Bridget E. Vincent, MSN, CRNP, APN-BC, CCRN, requested information regarding the Compact license and telemedicine CRNPs.

Ms. Pachter Schulder explained that telemedicine works whether someone is physically with a patient or telemedicine. She explained that registered and practical nurses from out of state with a multistate license can practice in Pennsylvania via both modalities. She noted that Pennsylvania was not issuing multistate registered and practical nurse licenses yet, and CRNPs are not going to be issued multistate licenses because there is no legislation enacting the CRNP Compact yet.

Ms. Pachter Schulder further explained that someone could practice telemedicine within a state as long as they are licensed within that state, but

Pennsylvania nurses who want to practice telemedicine
for patients in other states would need to contact
those states to find out their requirements.

Ms. Pachter Schulder mentioned that Advanced Practice Committee Meetings were held in the past, where stakeholders from a variety of groups would discuss their legislative agenda with the Board. She asked whether the Board wished to schedule an Advanced Practice Committee Meeting for the November meeting, and the Board agreed.]

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Report of Board Members Who Attended a Meeting on

Behalf of the Board

Linda L. Kmetz, PhD, RN, Chair, informed everyone

6 that five Board members attended NCSBN Annual Meeting

7 in Chicago. She stated the Next Generation National

Council Licensure Examination (NGN) for RNs and PNs

9 has launched, and quarterly results thus far are

10 good. She noted they did an analysis pre-COVID and

11 post-COVID, took out all COVID data, and the results

12 are right where they were in terms of results when

13 COVID ended.

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Chair Kmetz mentioned that it is something to keep in mind as schools come before the Board because they are right where they need to be, and tests would not be made more difficult. She mentioned that only 18 items are NGN and 130+ are regular items.

Chair Kmetz addressed artificial intelligence, noting that it is just a matter of time before everyone is taking the National Council Licensure Examination® NCLEX®) at home.

Dr. Hunsberger mentioned being told that the hope is within years to implement NCLEX® at home with the use of artificial intelligence (AI). He noted the

same company is already trying it with the nurse aide exam.

Ms. Pachter Schulder commented that technology is increasing and that the Board might want to explore at-home English language proficiency examinations again. She noted Ms. House provided initial data and that the Board may want to ask her to see how many states accept the at-home version of the test. She commented that NCSBN was still working on their position, but there may have been movement.

It was noted that the at-home English language proficiency exam was part of what started NCSBN considering AI because it was made so quickly and did not account for difficulties. NCSBN previously found security issues with at-home exams that were not addressed. The Board questioned whether technology was advanced to the point where there could be a safe and secure at-home version of the NCLEX® with monitoring.

Ms. Pachter Schulder noted Ms. House would further check into the at-home version of English language proficiency exams and asked Board Administrator Miller to place that on the next agenda, along with the advanced practice stakeholder group report.

Ms. House stated it had been approximately a year since she reviewed the test and offered to provide information at the next meeting.

Ms. Pachter Schulder stated the Board has a list on its website of approved English language proficiency exams and has made a decision not to allow the at-home version of those tests based upon NCSBN's recommendations regarding security when people take the test at home versus at a testing site.

Acting Commissioner Claggett asked how it would impact the Board if they go against NCSBN's recommendation. Ms. Pachter Schulder explained that the Board could go against NCSBN but listened on that point because it is based on psychometric data that NCSBN has undertaken in terms of whether the tests are secure.

Acting Commissioner Claggett commented that he is for allowing the exams at home and is looking forward to Ms. House's research.

Dr. Bucher thanked Acting Commissioner Claggett and the Commonwealth for supporting their attendance at the conference. He mentioned a motion was brought up to look at the APRN Compact but that it was defeated, so they would continue to move forward with

Ms. Miller encouraged everyone to review their answers on the renewal application before they hit submit. She mentioned the question about whether or not someone holds national certification as a CRNP or whether or not they completed their required continuing education comes after several legal questions to which most answers are no. She noted that many people continue to hit no on continuing education questions which turns an automated process into a manual process, which creates delays.

Ms. Miller also cautioned that using the scroll function on the mouse could flip answers from yes to no.

Ms. Miller told everyone to allow at least several days for the Child Abuse Continuing Education to match with their renewal profile in the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS). She noted that certificates uploaded by the individual cannot be accepted and that the information must come from the provider. She mentioned that they would have to contact their provider if the information has not been received after a few days.

Ms. Miller reported 44 prelicensure BSN nursing education programs, 27 Associate Degree, 14 Diploma,

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- Master's entry RN programs, and 57 Practical
  Nursing programs. She noted 115 CRNP programs that
  are divided on the basis of population, specialty,
  and degree, including 3 schools that offer a further
  specialty in Emergency for family nurse
  practitioners.
  - Ms. Miller mentioned that the numbers on their website have been updated for licensees after the April renewal closed, noting 240,222 RNs; 18,955 CRNPs; 277 CNSs; and 19,434 Prescriptive Authority Collaborative Agreements. She mentioned they would not see the effect to Practical Nurses until the renewal cycle in June 2024.

- Ms. Miller noted the transition was made in early July taking the nursing education functions in eppiccNURSE over into PALS but were still troubleshooting issues. She stated nursing education programs would be able to generate a list of their faculty and generate a list of their clinical agencies or clinical rotations.
- Ms. Pachter Schulder reminded everyone that a faculty member would not be listed on the reports at this time if the faculty member holds a multistate license rather than a Pennsylvania license.

transition from eppiccNURSE into PALS caused a

backlog of approvals for faculty, clinical rotation,

and clinical agencies, noting Practice Advisors and

Education Advisors worked very hard to get that up to

date. She mentioned that PALS has confusing language

regarding program directors and that the Advisors are

contacting program directors via Outlook email.

Ms. Miller addressed program proposals and did not believe that they have any program proposal that has not had feedback. She noted some were resubmitted based on feedback that was pending review by advisors. She mentioned that the feedback would be sent to programs within a few months.

Ms. Miller stated the curriculum changes received feedback within a couple weeks.

Ms. Miller discussed her attendance at the Pennsylvania Higher Education Nursing Schools Association (PHENSA) meeting, along with Ms. House, where updates were provided and questions were answered.]
