14 Regulation Update - Regulations Status Summary
15 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,
16 informed the Board that the Fees regulation (16A-5142)
17 was under review by the Office of General Counsel,
18 Office of Budget, and Office of Policy. Ms. Pachter
19 Schulder projected publication of the regulations in
20 proposed form in late spring. There were no new
21 updates on the remaining pending regulations.]

22 ***

23 Legislative Update - Pennsylvania Update

24 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,
25 referred to Senate Bill 354 as signed by Governor Wolf

1 into Act 6 of 2018. Ms. Pachter Schulder discussed
2 significant provisions of Act 6 including expungement
3 of continuing education violations and practicing on a
4 lapsed licensed up to six months. Both categories of
5 offenses can be expunged following five years of non-
6 discipline.

7 Act 6 also requires that all criminal matters and
8 reciprocal discipline be reported within 30 days. Ms.
9 Pachter Schulder discussed that 21.29a, 21.156b and
10 21.723a require that reciprocal actions be reported to
11 the Board within 90 days and criminal charges and
12 convictions be reported within 30 days. The
13 Department's view is that because Act 6 follows the
14 regulatory amendments, all reciprocal and criminal
15 actions be reported within 30 days. She noted a
16 notice to be placed on the Board's website announcing
17 the 30 days reporting requirements. The last
18 significant provision in Act 6 is the inclusion of
19 immediate temporary suspensions for Boards that do not
20 have this provision within their Acts.

21 Ms. Pachter Schulder referred the Board to House
22 Bill 2092 related to the nurse staffing standards in
23 hospitals.]

25 [Ian J. Harlow, Commissioner of Professional and

1 Occupational Affairs, entered the meeting at 9:28
2 a.m.]

3 ***
4 Legislative Update (Continued)
5 [Ms. Pachter Schulder discussed Section 807-A in House
6 Bill 2092 regarding protections for professional
7 nurses including refusal of assignments and
8 retaliation. She mentioned that the Board receives
9 frequent inquiries/messages from licenses about extra
10 work time, practicing on patients without training,
11 and performing services outside of an individual's
12 capability or education as explanations for not
13 accepting an assignment.]

14 ***
15 Report of Commissioner
16 [Ian J. Harlow, Commissioner of Professional and
17 Occupational Affairs, updated the Board on Executive
18 Order 2017-03 and an upcoming Advisory Committee
19 Meeting. He stated St. Francis University was
20 assisting with the collection of data, which was
21 approximately 45 percent complete and on target for
22 the May 25, 2018 deadline. A report with statistical
23 and factual information will then be issued to the
24 Governor and each of the Boards. He noted that the
25 Advisory Committee determined it was not appropriate

1 to make recommendations for each of the licensing
2 Boards, but a report will be provided to each Board
3 for its input.

4 Commissioner Harlow stated the Pennsylvania
5 Licensing System (PALS) was approximately 85 percent
6 complete and 3.5 percent below projected expenditures.

7 All initial licensure applications will be moved to
8 PALS.

9 Commissioner Harlow explained the administrative
10 process for licensing operations being completed
11 through PALS. He encouraged the Board and associations
12 to provide feedback to his office or the Board
13 Administrator on the system.

14 Commissioner Harlow presented statistics
15 regarding PALS renewals, reporting that the Nursing
16 Board had 1,300 licensees successfully completing
17 their renewals out of 51,000 in a two-day period and
18 noting nine requests for help desk support.

19 Commissioner Harlow discussed answering calls
20 regarding PALS. He and Ms. Keiser have been working
21 to provide additional staff on the phones and to
22 obtain approval for another staff position. He
23 mentioned temporarily bringing on 20 Bureau-wide
24 annuitants to assist with the transition of PALS. Mr.
25 Harlow stated the basic processing time for

1 applications for the Board was less than 10 days.]

2 ***

3 [Ian J. Harlow, Commissioner of Professional and
4 Occupational Affairs, exited the meeting at 9:38 a.m.]

6 Legislative Update - Pennsylvania Update (Continued)
7 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,
8 continued with explaining the expungement process in
9 Act 6. The process would be handled administratively
10 by following the criteria as set forth specifically in
11 the statute subsequent to a licensee requesting an
12 expungement. The request for expungement may only be
13 approved one time. She stated there are no waivers,
14 provisions, or special considerations within the
15 limited terms in the act.

16 Dr. O'Donnell questioned whether the Board would
17 be informed of a second offense. Ms. Pachter Schulder
18 explained the prosecuting attorneys would provide
19 information of a second offense and perhaps address
20 the matter similarly to a DUI expungement. She also
21 noted that there is no time limit for a request for
22 expungement.]

24 Dietitian-Nutritionist

25 [Jennifer Sporay, RDN-AP, CSO, LDN, CNSC, PA Academy

1 of Nutrition and Dietetics, was requested to update
2 the Board on a recent meeting of the Academy. Ms.
3 Sporay reported that the Academy is preparing a draft
4 Bill to update and expand its statute to include more
5 than just title protection.]

6 ***

7 IT & Communication Issues

8 [Suzanne Hendricks, BSBH, RN, LPN, met with Katelin
9 Lambert, Director of Operations, last Board meeting,
10 who will be reviewing specific eAgenda issues. She
11 also had not received any recent reports of Board
12 member problems.]

13 ***

14 Report of Board Members Who Attended a Meeting on
15 Behalf of the Board

16 [Chairperson Kmetz reported on attending the NCSBN
17 Standards Development Committee Meeting January 30-31,
18 2018, in Chicago. She recommended that the Board
19 withdraw membership in the American National Standards
20 Institute (ANSI), as the organization deals more with
21 manufacturing standards, not regulatory standards.

22 Chairperson Kmetz stated the charge of the
23 Standards Development Committee will be changing. The
24 role of the Committee will be to provide oversight of
25 the model roles and the model act, as well as

1 continuing to develop standards and interpretive
2 statements based on the model roles and model act.
3 Chairperson Kmetz noted that additional information
4 will become available after the Midyear Meeting.]

5

6 Report of Executive Secretary

7 [Laurette Keiser, MSN, RN, Executive Secretary, stated
8 the Board received the National Council Licensure
9 Examination-Registered Nurse (NCLEX-RN) draft for 2019
10 and a request for Board comment. The Board members
11 attending the Delegate Assembly will be requested to
12 vote on the draft, as well as the other delegates in
13 August.

14 Ms. Keiser stated the National Council was still
15 considering the Exam User category, which was brought
16 up at the last Delegate Assembly in relation to using
17 NURSYS for verifications. Updates will be provided as
18 they become available.

19 Ms. Keiser informed the Board that prescriptive
20 authority approval numbers will now have the prefix
21 Nurse Practitioner Prescriptive Authority (NPPA),
22 which is important in terms of renewals for Certified
23 Registered Nurse Practitioners (CRNPs). She also
24 discussed contacting the DEA, as well as the
25 Pennsylvania Coalition of Nurse Practitioners to

1 inform them of the addition of the prefix. A
2 notification has also been added to the website.

3 Ms. Keiser updated the Board that there are
4 amendments being made to the Probable Cause eAgenda.

5 Ms. Keiser referred to prior discussion related
6 to Board members visiting the Peter M. Winter
7 Institute for Simulation, Education, and Research
8 (WISER), in conjunction with the Board meeting. The
9 Commissioner suggested a select group of Board members
10 request approval to visit the Institute.

11 Dr. O'Donnell, as the Associate Director of the
12 Peter M. Winter Institute for Simulation, Education,
13 and Research, added that all Board members would be
14 welcomed and proposed a 2- to 4-hour interactive
15 learning experience for the Board members. Board
16 members, Board staff, and association representatives
17 voiced their interest in the visit. Dr. O'Donnell
18 noted that his supervisor at the institute, Dr. Paul
19 Phrampus, would be most willing to host the Board.]

21 [The Board recessed from 9:54 a.m. until 10:03 a.m.]

22 ***

23 Advanced Practice Nursing Committee Meeting

24 [Jodie Szlachta, CRNA, PhD, President of the

25 Pennsylvania Association of Nurse Anesthetists, and

1 Derek Reckard, President-Elect, discussed two bills
2 affecting nurse anesthetists: The CRNA Designation
3 Bill, Senate Bill 274, regarding title protection,
4 passed in the Senate by Senator John R. Gordner and
5 currently in the House Professional Licensure
6 Committee chaired by Representative Mark Mustio; and
7 House Bill 719, a companion bill introduced by
8 Representative Bryan Cutler, also in the House
9 Professional Licensure Committee with House
10 Representative Mustio as Chairman.

11 Dr. Szlachta informed the Board that Pennsylvania
12 has the most nurse anesthesia educational programs in
13 the United States. She also discussed challenges for
14 military nurse anesthetists. Dr. O'Donnell discussed
15 practices for CRNAs within the military designated as
16 licensed independent providers.

17 Dr. Szlachta also discussed House Bill 789, a
18 provision and supervision bill introduced by
19 Representative Jim Christiana, and Senate Bill 960, a
20 companion bill introduced by Senator Tom Killion,
21 requiring nurse anesthetists who work in a hospital to
22 be supervised by a physician. She stated this bill
23 was not supported by studies reflecting safety or
24 outcome measures of CRNA practice, as well as being
25 contrary to State Board of Nursing regulations and the

1 2010 Institute of Medicine (IOM) Report that prompts
2 the use of all APRNs to full scope of practice.

3 Dr. Szlachta next discussed that CRNAs are
4 reviewing their protocols regarding obtaining informed
5 consent in light of the June 2017 Pennsylvania Supreme
6 Court decision in *Shinal vs. Toms*, wherein the Court
7 ruled that physicians may not delegate to others their
8 obligation to provide sufficient information in order
9 to obtain a patient's informed consent.

10 Dr. Szlachta discussed legislation being
11 supported by health organizations regarding CRNAs and
12 CRNPs obtaining informed consents. Ms. Marshall
13 stated The Hospital and Healthsystem Association of
14 Pennsylvania (HAP) was working with the Pennsylvania
15 Medical Society to draft language for an amendment to
16 the MCARE Act to address this issue. There was
17 discussion regarding including supervision language to
18 reflect the practice between physicians and nurse
19 anesthetists.

20 Dr. Szlachta referred to a ketamine workgroup
21 convened by Dr. Arlene Seid to establish guidelines
22 for the use of ketamine in non-anesthetic
23 circumstances. She noted that the group will be
24 addressing the identification of appropriate
25 facilities, required monitoring, safety concerns and

1 protocols, and required personnel or care team to both
2 administer and/or be present during the administration
3 of ketamine by bolus or infusion.

4 Dr. O'Donnell further explained that ketamine as
5 a sedative-hypnotic IV anesthetic could be used for
6 induction of general anesthesia as well as a variety
7 of sedation, as well as a substitute for opioids due
8 to the opioid crisis.

9 Ms. Marshall mentioned that HAP convened an
10 Advanced Practice Professionals group in 2013 and some
11 of the work from that group resulted in an Advanced
12 Practice Professional's guidebook on the utilization
13 in a hospital setting. Ms. Marshall plans to
14 reconvene that group to not only update that guidebook
15 but also consider developing an Advanced Practice
16 Professionals Conference.

17 Ms. Pachter Schulder requested an update with
18 regard to the status of midwives on an advanced
19 practice standing. Ms. Vincent suggested organizing a
20 meeting of midwives, anesthesiologists, and CRNPs to
21 discuss advanced practice.

22 Jessica Poole, DNAP, MSN, CRNA, Pennsylvania
23 Association of Nurse Anesthetists, pointed out that
24 CRNAs in Pennsylvania attempting to volunteer for
25 disaster relief were being denied or sent to the

1 facilities to work as registered nurses at the
2 bedside, not able to administer anesthesia.

3 Chairperson Kmetz thanked Dr. O'Donnell for
4 arranging this appointment.]

5 ***

6 For Your Information

7 [Chairperson Kmetz noted house projects. She also
8 noted the Institute of Regulatory (IRE) Summary from
9 Dr. Petula, as well as the IRE Conference presentation
10 and videos available on the National Council of State
11 Boards of Nursing website.

12 Ms. Hertzler will be visiting Honduras with
13 Hershey Penn State medical students, nurses, doctors,
14 and nonmedical family members in order to organize
15 medical brigades to address malnourished children. The
16 children and their families will be taken to the
17 Honduras Feeding Clinic. The parents will be trained
18 on nutritional foods and cooking.

19 Ms. Hertzler also stated medications will be
20 taken into the villages in Honduras to treat people.]
