- 19 [Mary Pat Howard, M.S., RN-BC, Executive Advisor of
- 20 Quality Assurance, provided a COVID-19 update from
- 21 | yesterday's data. She noted COVID-19 cases were up
- 22 from the day before at 2,076 with 185 people on
- 23 ventilators. She reported a total death count of
- 24 27,914. She stated the delta variant is being watched
- 25 closely, and people who are fully vaccinated are

protected.

She mentioned the Department of Health is transitioning to small clinics, providers, and mobile clinics to address vaccine hesitancy. She mentioned grants and doing a lot of provider outreach so physicians can encourage patients. She also mentioned trying to increase provider awareness about the use of monoclonal antibodies to help patients with COVID and keep them out of the hospital. She noted a map of locations of where people can receive monoclonal antibodies on the Department of Health (DOH) website.

Ms. Howard noted breakthrough cases, but the majority of people who are hospitalized and dying of COVID-19 are those who are unvaccinated. She reported 97 percent of individuals who are hospitalized are unvaccinated and 99 percent of COVID-19 deaths are from people who are unvaccinated in Pennsylvania.

Ms. Howard reported 63.8 percent of Pennsylvania adults are fully vaccinated and 79.5 percent have at least one dose, ranking Pennsylvania ninth in the nation with 67 percent of the population with at least the first dose.

Ms. Howard noted mitigation orders were lifted on May 31 and masking orders on June 28.

25 Chairman Litman questioned whether there has been

- 1 any actual documentation of the breakthrough cases and 2 if the strain is known.
- Ms. Howard explained that the Department of

  Health is working on tracing those to see what they

  are now.
- Chairman Litman reported the lambda variant
  apparently is gaining traction. He commented that one
  of his vaccinated staff was hospitalized for a day and
  another was on a seven-day furlough because of
  positivity.
