2 requirement for Pennsylvania osteopathic manipulative
3 treatment (OMT) was waived as part of COVID-19
4 waivers but is scheduled to expire on October 31,
5 2022.]

10 Pennsylvania OMT requirement while the
11 regulations are proceeding through the
12 review process for this regulation.

8 2022-02 was signed as a result of the continuing
9 harmful trend of attacking the rights and
10 opportunities of LGBTQIA+ persons in the Commonwealth
11 and across the country that negatively affects the
12 community, especially children and young adults with
13 a negative physical and mental health outcome, self-
14 harm, and suicidal ideation.

15 Ms. Walter informed Board members that the
16 Executive Order has several directives in different
17 agencies under the governor's jurisdiction, including
18 the Department of State, specifically subsections
19 (a), (b), (d), and (i). She read the
20 responsibilities that apply to the Department of
21 State in subsections (a), (b), (d), and (i) and
22 encourage everyone to review Executive Order 2022-
23 02.]

24 MS. WALTER:

25 We could do a vote to endorse Executive

1 Order 2022-02. The vote would be to
2 follow the directives of the Executive
3 Order to the best of the Board's
4 ability.

9 everyone that the renewal period ending October 31,
10 2022, would be extended until November 30, 2022, due
11 to issues with the Pennsylvania Licensing System
12 (PALS) over the last three weeks.]

14 Report of Department of Health - No Report

15 ***

16 Report of Board Administrator

17 [Nichole Wray, Board Administrator, also noted the
18 deadline to renew has been extended from October 31,
19 2022 to November 30, 2022. She stated the extension
20 would apply to physician and surgeon, volunteer
21 physician and surgeon, physician assistant,
22 acupuncturist, and physician acupuncturist. She
23 reported roughly 50 to 60 percent have renewed as of
24 yesterday.

25 Ms. Wray encouraged everyone to verify they have

1 submitted their renewals and reminded everyone to
2 make sure they are getting their child abuse
3 continuing education and that the education provider
4 is delivering verification directly to the Board.

5 Ms. Wray informed everyone that they cannot use
6 the same child abuse for the initial application and
7 reactivation and none of the continuing medical
8 education (CME) from any kind of reactivation could
9 be used as outlined in the regulation.

10 Ms. Wray noted the renewals are currently being
11 generated for genetic counselors, athletic trainers,
12 perfusionists, and respiratory therapists who need to
13 renew by December 31, 2022. She mentioned that these
14 renewals should be available no later than 60 days
15 prior to the expiration date and these licensees
16 should receive a notification over the next couple of
17 weeks.

18 Chairman Swallow asked whether receiving an
19 electronic confirmation is good enough or whether
20 they should also go back to the dashboard.

21 Ms. Wray stated that it is a good idea to go back
22 to the dashboard to make sure the expiration date
23 updated to October 31, 2024. She explained that the
24 confirmation shows it has been submitted, however
25 someone with outstanding child abuse continuing

1 education may receive a confirmation for the renewal
2 submission but it may not have fully processed on the
3 Board's end because of the missing child abuse CE.

4 Dr. Zawisza asked how a licensee would know
5 before the 60-day window that the child abuse has
6 gone through and been approved.

7 Ms. Wray stated that she did not know of any
8 other way outside of contacting the Board but would
9 look into whether it was something visible on the
10 licensee's dashboard. She also mentioned the licensee
11 contacting the education provider to make sure they
12 received their information and all of the information
13 on file matches what is on file with the Board.

14 Dr. Zawisza asked whether the questions on the
15 renewal survey could be reexamined or updated if the
16 question has been answered on prior renewals.

17 Acting Commissioner Claggett offered to take that
18 back to the Department of Health (DOH).

19 Dr. Bulger commented that the survey is
20 completely informational and has nothing to do with
21 them as Board members and is the state receiving
22 survey information.

23 Acting Commissioner Claggett noted Dr. Bulger to
24 be correct and that there are updates all of the time
25 on some of the surveys and questions could be

1 changed.

2 Dr. Bulger commented that his understanding of
3 the survey is that it does not tie back to the
4 licensee and is used for broader information.

5 Acting Commissioner Claggett noted that not to be
6 his understanding but would follow up with the
7 Board.]

11 reproductive health care providers, for their support


