22 acupuncturist, and physician acupuncturist. She

23 reported roughly 50 to 60 percent have renewed as of

24 yesterday.

25 Ms. Wray encouraged everyone to verify they have

submitted their renewals and reminded everyone to make sure they are getting their child abuse continuing education and that the education provider is delivering verification directly to the Board.

Ms. Wray informed everyone that they cannot use the same child abuse for the initial application and reactivation and none of the continuing medical education (CME) from any kind of reactivation could be used as outlined in the regulation.

Ms. Wray noted the renewals are currently being generated for genetic counselors, athletic trainers, perfusionists, and respiratory therapists who need to renew by December 31, 2022. She mentioned that these renewals should be available no later than 60 days prior to the expiration date and these licensees should receive a notification over the next couple of weeks.

Chairman Swallow asked whether receiving an electronic confirmation is good enough or whether they should also go back to the dashboard.

Ms. Wray stated that it is a good idea to go back to the dashboard to make sure the expiration date updated to October 31, 2024. She explained that the confirmation shows it has been submitted, however someone with outstanding child abuse continuing

education may receive a confirmation for the renewal submission but it may not have fully processed on the Board's end because of the missing child abuse CE.

Dr. Zawisza asked how a licensee would know before the 60-day window that the child abuse has gone through and been approved.

Ms. Wray stated that she did not know of any other way outside of contacting the Board but would look into whether it was something visible on the licensee's dashboard. She also mentioned the licensee contacting the education provider to make sure they received their information and all of the information on file matches what is on file with the Board.

Dr. Zawisza asked whether the questions on the renewal survey could be reexamined or updated if the question has been answered on prior renewals.

Acting Commissioner Claggett offered to take that back to the Department of Health (DOH).

Dr. Bulger commented that the survey is completely informational and has nothing to do with them as Board members and is the state receiving survey information.

Acting Commissioner Claggett noted Dr. Bulger to be correct and that there are updates all of the time on some of the surveys and questions could be

1 changed.
