22 Report of Board Counsel - Legislative Report 23 [Ariel E. O'Malley, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed 24 the Senate Bill 81, which would amend the Pharmacy 25 Act to allow the emergency medical services (EMS) to

1 leave behind naloxone; it has been re-reported and 2 submitted as of June 22.

Ms. O'Malley noted House Bill 817 and House Bill 818 are coupled together regarding the education for the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) registrations for pharmacies and was resubmitted to the Rules Committee on June 14.

Ms. O'Malley noted Senate Bill 696 dealing with the Pharmaceutical Transparency Act was introduced on May 15.

Ms. O'Malley noted House Bill 1295, which would allow for the submission of written impact statements for the Board during hearings, was introduced on June 1 and referred to the Professional Licensure Committee. She mentioned that some amendments were made and passed in the House on June 20.

Ms. O'Malley stated House Bill 1364 was introduced on June 12 and would allow for the issuance of advisory opinions from their department, where a person who acts in good faith on an advisory opinion would be protected not only from Board disciplinary action but also provided shelter from criminal and civil penalties.]

She noted the Board has certain courses that applicants must choose from and complete before being authorized to retest. noted the Board currently includes in the list for the PA MPJE exam PPA's MPJE Prep and Review along with asking them to pass the practice exam, but PPA now has a third program available that is more comprehensive; PPA has provided information on all three available programs. She noted the information was presented to the Board to decide whether to change the PA MPJE review program or use a combination of different programs.

Chair Talbott noted the Board discussed the programs during Executive Session and the new PPA program is an 8-hour federal and state program that provides a certificate at the end of completion. She mentioned that the old program does not necessarily provide a certificate of completion. She noted the MPJE practice test is available in addition to the program.]
