- 2 [Cynthia L. Potter, PT, DPT, Chairperson, addressed
- 3 | her and Ms. Grzybek's virtual attendance at the
- 4 | Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT)
- 5 | Board liaison vote dinner and their discussions with
- 6 Stacy Price, the Board liaison from Georgia.
- 7 Additionally, she mentioned that Ms. Wolfe and Ms.
- 8 Grzybek attended FSBPT Board member training.
- 9 Ms. Wolfe reported that she received much
- 10 information, and it opened her eyes to different
- 11 barriers and challenges other states were facing due
- 12 to the pandemic.
- 13 Ms. Grzybek stated it opened her eyes, making her
- 14 realize there was work be done as a Board to stay in
- 15 line with colleagues and members of the Federation.
- 16 Chair Potter provided an update on FSBPT's Exam,
- 17 | Licensure, and Disciplinary Database (ELDD). She
- 18 mentioned the star rating process, where the
- 19 | federation provides feedback to jurisdictions
- 20 regarding their participation and input of data into
- 21 the ELDD. She noted the Federation did away with the
- 22 star rating system as of February 2021 because of
- 23 diminishing return.
- 24 Chair Potter stated the federation started to see
- 25 | a leveling off and decided it was time to look at ELDD

from a different perspective with the goal to still
have a robust input from jurisdictions and increased
participation by the jurisdictions in getting data
into that system. She noted it became a burden on the
FSBPT staff to routinely mine that data and input it
themselves.

Chair Potter stated the Compact legislation has passed and many of the goals related to the ELDD are requirements of each state participating in the Compact. She mentioned that Pennsylvania is far off with a number of the areas related to the ELDD participation. She noted Board Counsel did a great job last meeting of reviewing the language of the PT Compact and spent a lot of time figuring out what is needed to comply with the Compact.

Chair Potter addressed the data systems and input of information, noting it to be a major barrier for Pennsylvania to provide information on a timely basis. She noted the importance of entering licensure and disciplinary data from the states and being able to use that FSBPT identification number (ID) routinely in our system.

Chair Potter mentioned that a lot of states have automated processes that input the data and would require changes to their system. She stated grants

are available from the Federation to assist jurisdictions with improving their systems. She noted the importance of ensuring compliance and tying in the information to be able to issue Compact privileges.

Ms. Grzybek addressed discussions with the FSBPT liaison regarding grant money to assist with system changes and questioned whether it would be permitted to further investigate and access such funding to try to bring the system up to speed.

Ms. Grzybek encouraged the administrative processes to get everything in order to have everything in place for licensees, noting it to be a huge problem for public protection as this moves forward if it is not in place. She offered to provide assistance in her role to help facilitate such matters, also noting the need for dedicated staff support.

Commissioner Johnson noted the need for discussion with legal counsel regarding the availability of the grant money and whether or not there were legal considerations. He mentioned the need for discussion with individuals at the commission regarding information technology (IT) requirements and would provide an update by the next meeting for further discussion on proceeding.

Chair Potter questioned whether there were issues from a legal standpoint regarding using the FSBPT ID. She noted it to be problematic for people to use Social Security Numbers as the identifier, so the goal is to use the FSBPT identifier number through the process for all jurisdictions so the scores are matched and to ensure the same individual in all cases. She noted one of the requirements is to have that identifier number saved and shared within the licensure databases.

Mr. Davis noted the need for further discussion with other people regarding the issue. He mentioned the possibility of developing a system or program that would allow for an automatic upload from the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS), where there would need to be a way to tie that number to the Social Security Number in the accounts. He mentioned being unsure from a technological standpoint.

Mr. Davis added that the PT Compact legislation has passed and everything will be done to make sure the Board complies with all of the requirements of the Compact.]

Ms. Iavarone addressed utilizing Scorebuilders, the TherapyEd book, and PEAT along with studying with a classmate on the cardiopulmonary section.

Dr. Campbell encouraged Ms. Iavarone to dive into not just the right answer but what the right answer is and why the other three answers are wrong when she takes the practice tests. She stated most of the questions were musculoskeletal and neuromuscular and give the most opportunity for growth. She mentioned a six-time lifetime limit to take the exam and to not take the exam if she were not ready.]

[Cynthia L. Potter, PT, DPT, Chairperson addressed questions regarding waivers and how that may affect students taking the exam early. She noted the need to monitor those waivers because everything would return to the regulations that existed before the waivers were put in place unless the legislature acts to continue some of those.

Ms. Grzybek questioned what would happen if a

student has already applied to take the exam under the waiver and the waiver expires before they have the opportunity to take the exam because she did not think it would be permitted. She also questioned how the individual would know it was inappropriate if the waiver expired.

Commissioner Johnson recommended taking those questions to the General Assembly because they have the obligation to terminate or extend the waivers. He commented that the current 21-day extension carries over to the middle of next month.

Commissioner Johnson was unaware of any catchall provision in the regulations or the practice act that would allow the Board to be able exercise that level of discretion and assumed they do not, which is why the waiver was important.

Commissioner Johnson noted questions were provided to the General Assembly and encouraged Board members in their personal capacities to reach out to the statewide associations to encourage them to advocate and lobby the legislature.

Chair Potter addressed multiple vacancies on the Board and suggested members reach out to anyone interested and urge them to approach their senators.]

- 4 addressed 16A-6518 regarding child abuse reporting.
- 5 | He noted IRRC received the final-form regulation
- 6 package on April 26, 2021, and is scheduled for
- 7 consideration and action at the IRRC public meeting on
- 8 June 17, 2021.
- 9 Mr. Davis addressed 16A-6522 regarding early exam
- 10 and continuing education (CE) for clinical
- 11 instruction, noting he sent the regulatory package to
- 12 regulatory counsel in early February. He mentioned
- 13 the review should be pretty quick once regulatory
- 14 counsel attends to it and then after review by the
- 15 Office of General Counsel (OGC) and the Attorney
- 16 General's Office (AG), it would be published in the
- 17 | Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 18 Mr. Davis addressed a scam alert, where persons
- 19 pretending to be from one of the health-related boards
- 20 are contacting licensees by phone and mail concerning
- 21 the status of their license. He reported scammers
- 22 were threatening license suspension for failure to act
- 23 and falsely claiming involvement with the Federal
- 24 Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the Drug Enforcement
- 25 Administration (DEA).

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Mr. Davis stated scammers are known to
