What is Mcare?

- The Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error Fund, also known as Mcare, is a patient compensation fund that was created by Act 13 of 2002 ("Mcare Act").
- Mcare is the successor to the Medical Professional Liability Catastrophe Loss Fund, which was established by Act 111 of 1975.
- Mcare serves the Commonwealth health care provider community by providing coverage and injured persons by paying medical malpractice claims. Mcare is comprised of three units; coverage, claims and compliance.



What is Mcare?

- Pennsylvania physicians, certified nurse midwives, hospitals, birth centers, primary health centers and nursing homes (health care providers) are required to have medical malpractice insurance coverage of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- Coverage must be provided by insurer/self-insurer who is licensed or approved to provide coverage by the Pennsylvania Insurance Department.
- If the health care provider practices 50% or more in Pennsylvania, the first \$500,000 of coverage is provided by an insurer, self-insurer or RRG (referred to as primary coverage).



What is Mcare?

- Upon the report of primary coverage and the payment of an assessment,
 Mcare provides statutory excess coverage of \$500,000 above the primary coverage of \$500,000.
- Last year, Mcare paid \$172.3 Million in claims.
- Mcare is a pay as you go system that is fully funded by the health care providers' assessments.



How do I find an insurer on PID's website?

The licensing division of the Pennsylvania Insurance Department ("PID") routinely updates its lists of insurers.

It is important to note that these lists include <u>all</u> insurance companies in those categories, not just medical malpractice insurers.

To see the primary coverage information insurers are able to report to Mcare, refer to the latest Form e-216 (shown below):

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


- Form e-216 serves as both a coverage reporting form and an accounting form.
 Electronic submission of the Excel Form e-216 is the preferred method for primary insurers and self-insurers to report basic insurance coverage to Mcare.
- It is completed by approved primary insurers. Health care providers do not complete Form e-216.
- Form e-216 is routinely updated when an insurer is added.
- An insurer will reach out to Mcare asking to be added.
- Mcare will verify they are approved by verifying their name and NAIC # on the appropriate PID website listing.



- The current year's e-216, as well as any applicable prior year's e-216 will be updated based on information provided to Mcare by the insurer.
- If the insurer is not on any of the listings, a copy of an approval letter is needed or they will be directed to contact the appropriate PID staff.

The Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error Fund ("Mcare") was created by Act 13 of 2002 ("Mcare Act"), and signed into law on March 20, 2002. Mcare is the successor to the Medical Professional Liability Catastrophe Loss Fund, better known as the "CAT Fund" which originally was established by section 701(e) of the Health Care Services

Reporting

Since Mcare periodically makes improvements to Form e-216, downloading a new Form e-216 each time will ensure you are using the most current version.

This form is to be used by basic professional liability insurance carriers and approved self-insurers for summarizing assessment collected, payable and refundable. A healthcare provider may not complete this form except for an approved self-insured healthcare provider.




Click on the dropdown list that says "Please Select Primary Carrier".



This is the most-recent listing of insurers that are able to report primary coverage to Mcare.



Example of a Form e-216 with primary coverage information:



- The Mcare assessment is a percentage of the <u>Pennsylvania Professional Liability</u> <u>Joint Underwriting Association</u> ("JUA") rates as approved by the Pennsylvania Insurance Department.
- For 2023, Mcare's assessment rate is 19%.
