3 \* \* \* 1 2 State Board of Podiatry 3 February 17, 2021 \* \* \* 4 5 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 6 10:00 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session 7 with Todd Kriner, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on 8 9 matters listed under the Report of Prosecutors and the 10 Report of Board Counsel. The Board returned to open 11 session at 10:30 a.m.] \* \* \* 12 13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 14 Board of Podiatry was held on Wednesday, February 17, 15 2021. Robert B. Weber, D.P.M., J.D., M.B.A., Chairman, called the meeting to order at 11:08 a.m. 16 \* \* \* 17 18 Approval of minutes of the December 16, 2020 meeting 19 CHAIRMAN WEBER: 20 The next item is approval of the minutes 21 from December 16, 2020. 22 Do I have a motion to accept the 23 minutes? 24 MS. HALUSZCZAK: 25 Motion to accept the minutes.

4 DR. PARIS: 1 I'll second. 2 3 CHAIRMAN WEBER: All in favor? Any nays? 4 5 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 6 7 [Theodore Stauffer, Executive Secretary, Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, noted the 8 meeting was being recorded, and those who remained on 9 10 the line were giving their consent to be recorded.] \* \* \* 11 Roll Call 12 13 [A roll call of Board members was taken by Mr. Hollinger.] 14 \* \* \* 15 16 Appointment - Carolyn A. DeLaurentis, Esquire, Deputy 17 Chief Counsel, Prosecution Division Presentation 18 [Carolyn A. DeLaurentis, Esquire, Deputy Chief 19 Counsel, Prosecution Division, provided highlights of 20 the prosecution division's work during the past year. 21 She commended staff for all of their hard work to make 2.2 telework successful. She noted all decisions were 23 made thoughtfully and with the safety of all in mind. 24 Ms. DeLaurentis stated the Board prosecutors made 25 every effort to monitor the restrictions, waivers,

1 policies, and new procedures specific to the practice 2 in each profession regarding challenges imposed on 3 licensees by the COVID-19 pandemic.

4 Ms. DeLaurentis noted the Pennsylvania Licensing 5 System (PALS) to be a lifeline. She stated the Bureau 6 of Enforcement and Investigation (BEI) worked closely 7 with prosecution to continue investigations and figure 8 out the best methods during statewide shutdowns and 9 stay-at-home orders. She also noted the Professional 10 Compliance Office continued opening cases and 11 processing files, and legal assistants had been 12 working a hybrid schedule to ensure mailings and 13 filings were completed.

14 Ms. DeLaurentis commented that the Board, Board 15 staff, and counsel all have adapted to virtual Board 16 meetings and prosecution will continue to work with everyone to ensure efficient and effective 17 18 presentation and resolution of cases. She mentioned 19 2020 was a year filled with challenges, but the 20 prosecution division led by the incredible senior staff rose to the challenge and will continue to do so 21 in 2021. 2.2

Ms. DeLaurentis informed the Board that 59 cases were opened in 2020 and 43 in 2019 with 58 cases closed in 2020 for the Board of Podiatry. She noted

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67 open cases as of January 1, 2021. She thanked
Timothy Smith for his assistance providing information
for 2020.

Ms. DeLaurentis addressed enforcement actions with 2 total cases that resulted in discipline in 2020 for the Board of Podiatry. She reported 3 warning letters and 2 revocations or voluntary surrender cases in 2020.

9 Ms. DeLaurentis discussed 2020 overall 10 prosecution as a whole. She noted 44 immediate 11 temporary suspensions in 2020. She mentioned 8 of the 12 1,223 opened COVID-19 cases are for the Board of 13 Podiatry. She reported the total number of open cases 14 as of January 1, 2021, was 12,250 and the total number 15 of cases opened overall in 2020 was 13,394, which is 16 down from 2019 at 16,295. She noted 13,274 files were 17 closed in 2020.

Ms. DeLaurentis noted most general COVID complaints involved violations of the Governor's orders, secretary of health orders, and CDC guidelines.] Report of Prosecutors [Christopher K. McNally, Esquire, Board Prosecution
