renewal increase since 2007 or a new license
application fee increase since 2000. He stated the
renewal fees go into effect June 1, 2023, and
application fees go into effect July 1, 2023. The
Board has already seen this annex for the regulation.

- Mr. Fritz addressed comments submitted by the Independent Regulatory Review Commission, noting he did not see anything that would need to be changed in the annex, and he would be dealing with most of the concerns with the Bureau of Finance and Operations (BFO). He informed the Board that IRRC is concerned with where they came up with the numbers and why certain fees are being increased.
- Mr. Fritz noted that BFO projected the Board will be going into a deficit at the end of the next fiscal year, but IRRC was concerned as to why there was such an increase in expenses for legal costs and expenses in general.
- Mr. Fritz addressed the legal cost increase, noting 516 open cases in 2018 with a jump to 1,829 cases in 2019. He explained that the Pennsylvania Justice Network (JNET) now notifies them of any licensee with a criminal arrest or conviction. He explained that the number of cases increased because they are now opening files they would have not heard

18 about in the past. 1 Mr. Fritz reported 887 cases have already been 2 3 opened as of the beginning of September, and the Board is busier now than in the past. * * * 5 6 MR.
