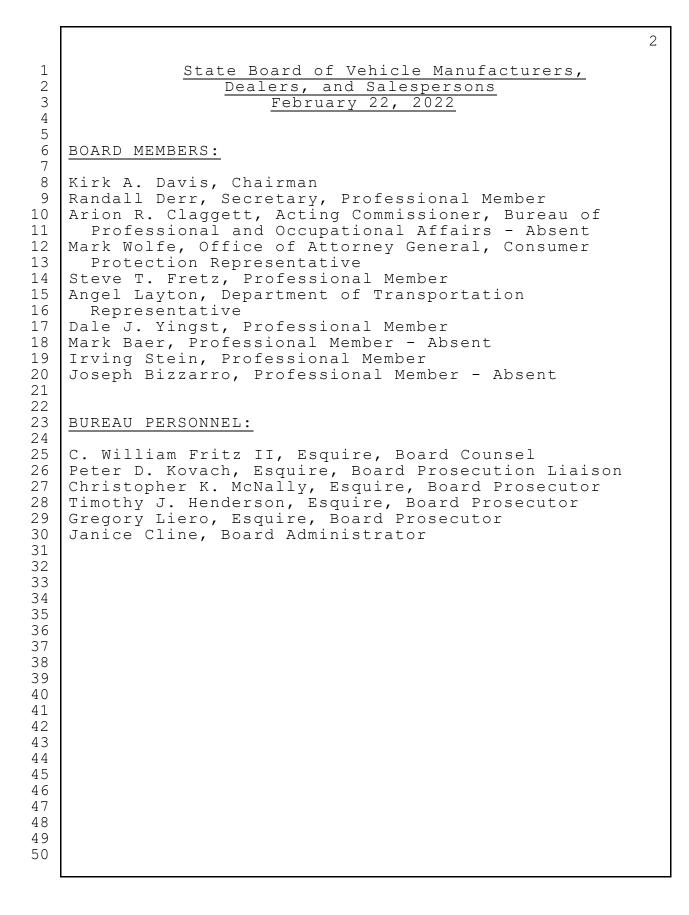

Davis, Chairman, Professional Member, 20 addressed the proposed legislation legalizing 21 recreational use of marijuana. He mentioned that 1 of 22 the top 10 issues for dealers in 2021 into 2022 was 23 legislation regarding how marijuana use will affect 24 dealership policies. 25 Chairman Davis mentioned dealers not wanting

somebody under the influence of alcohol in their 1 2 dealerships and this would be similar if recreational 3 marijuana is legalized. He suggested Board members 4 talk to their congressmen in terms of individual 5 policies within their dealerships. 6 Chairman Davis noted everybody should have 7 received an email regarding filling out the Financial 8 Disclosure forms but to contact Ms. Cline if anyone 9 has any questions.] 10 * * * 11 Report of Acting Commissioner - No Report * * * 12 13 Report of Board Administrator - No Report 14 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred 15 to 2022 and 2023 meeting dates and reminded Board 16 members to inform Ms. Cline of any meetings they would 17 not be attending. Mr. Fritz also reminded Board members to watch 18 19 their terms and to contact their legislators if they 20 wish to be reappointed. He noted the department is trying to fill vacant Board seats.] 21 * * * 22 23 Adjournment 24 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: 25 Motion to adjourn.
