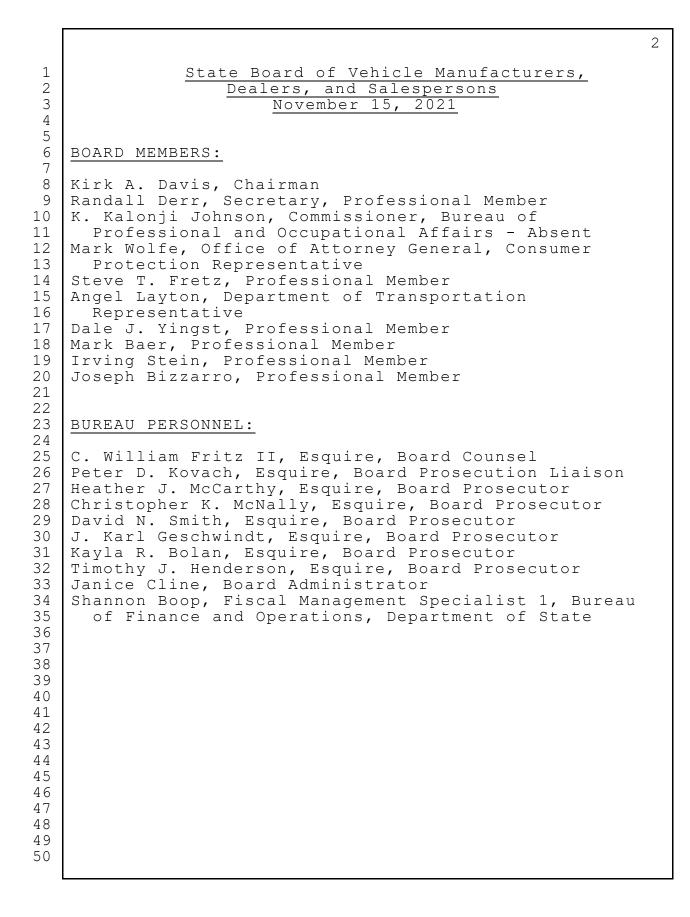

William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, for 8 the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial 9 10 deliberations. The Board returned to open session at 11 10:29 a.m.] \* \* \* 12 13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 14 Board of Vehicle Manufacturers, Dealers, and 15 Salespersons was held on Monday, November 15, 2021. Kirk K. Davis, Chairman, Professional Member, called 16 17 the meeting to order at 10:29 a.m. \* \* \* 18 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted 19 20 the Board met in Executive Session prior to open 21 session and conducted quasi-judicial deliberations. 22 Mr. Fritz also noted the meeting was being 23 recorded, and those who continued to participate were 24 giving their consent to be recorded.] 25 \* \* \*

Approval of minutes of the September 27, 2021 meeting 1 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: 2 3 I am asking for approval of last month's 4 meeting minutes. 5 Do we have a motion? 6 MR. STEIN: 7 So moved. 8 MR. DERR: 9 Second. 10 CHAIRMAN DAVIS: 11 Roll call. 12 13 Wolfe, aye; Stein, aye; Derr, aye; 14 Layton, aye; Yingst, aye; Fretz, aye; 15 Davis, aye. 16 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 17 18 Appointment - Bureau of Finance and Operations Annual 19 Budget Presentation 20 [Shannon Boop, Fiscal Management Specialist 1, Bureau 21 of Finance and Operations, Department of State, 22 addressed licensee population from a revenue 23 standpoint. She noted 36,907 licenses at the time of 24 the report, which increased at the present time to 25 37,036. She also noted from FY17-19, licenses

1 decreased by 1,222 with another decrease of 2,933 from 2 FY19-21.

3 Ms. Boop addressed revenue by source. She noted 4 the biennial total. She stated 93% of revenue came 5 from renewals and applications.

6 Ms. Boop provided a categorical breakdown of 7 expenses. She noted expenses for FY19-20, FY20-21, 8 and the current FY21-22 budget and expenses as of 9 November 4, 2021. She noted the current expenses 10 figure.

11 Ms. Boop reviewed revenues and expenses for the current fiscal year, showing a negative balance. 12 She 13 mentioned that the Board was currently going through a 14 fee increase, which was in the regulatory review 15 process, where the Board is projected to increase the remaining budget over the next few renewals. 16 She noted the renewal fee increase in FY22-23 and again in 17 18 FY24-25, along with the application fee increase 19 beginning in FY22-23.

Ms. Boop provided a breakdown of Board member expenses, noting FY19-20 and FY21-22 budget and FY21-22 expenses as of November 4, 2021. She noted the current budget to be adequate, which was carried over to FY22-23.

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Ms. Boop noted that any excess revenue goes back

Report of Board Counsel - Discussion 1 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, stated 2 3 the Board had previously voted on a list of crimes to 4 include under Act 53 crimes directly related to the 5 profession and posted the list on the Board's website. 6 He requested the Board add defrauding secured creditors under Title 18 Pa.C.S. § 4110 to the list.] 7 8 MR. FRITZ: 9 The Board would entertain a motion to 10 add defrauding secured creditors to the list of Act 53 crimes. 11 12 Does anyone make a motion? MR. DERR: 13 14 So moved. 15 MR. 1 the Board that House Bill 1907 was recently introduced 2 and would change the current language in the act that 3 restricts the ability of electric vehicle 4 manufacturers from manufacturing electric vehicles and 5 selling them, owning dealerships, and selling them 6 directly to the public.

7 Mr. Fritz stated the current act restricts electric vehicle dealers from owning more than five 8 9 dealerships throughout the state, and it only applies 10 to electric vehicle manufacturers who were operating 11 in 2014 and prior. He noted the new bill being introduced would allow any electric vehicle 12 manufacturer to own an unlimited number of electric 13 14 vehicle dealerships that only sale solely their 15 electric vehicles.

Mr. Fritz mentioned that Board members could reach out to their legislators to see what their position is on the bill.

Mr. Stein completely opposed the bill, noting it was an end run for manufacturers to get around their current dealer body to make a retail profit and then lay off any warranty work or other work on an existing dealer body who has made a significant investment in bricks and mortar.

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Chairman Davis asked whether feedback is needed

1 on the bill.

2 Mr. Fritz was asked to prepare a bill analysis to 3 outline any changes the bill would make and to present 4 Board concerns. 5 Mr. Stein believed that individuals waive their 6 right to the Lemon Law when they purchase or lease a 7 Tesla. He commented that the existing dealer body would end up doing the warranty work and becomes the 8 bad guy if electronic manufacturers put that in their 9 10 agreements excluding them from any pushback from any 11 future litigation. 12 Chairman Davis mentioned that Tesla has an 13 arbitration agreement that is signed at the time of 14 purchase, so the Lemon Law is excluded from the 15 purchase. 16 Mr. Baer commented that an electric vehicle being different should not be the deciding factor. 17 18 Mr. Stein agreed, noting that something with any 19 kind of a warranty has a name, but if someone goes 20 online and buys an automobile, be it electric or anything else from ABC electric vehicle manufacturers, 21 22 all they have is a website, so where would someone go 23 if they were unhappy with the purchase. Mr. Baer commented that the manufacturer 2.4 25 currently deflects any consumer issues back to the

dealer who should be able to sell the car and do 1 2 everything from A to Z on it. 3 Mr. Fritz assured the Board that their concerns would be addressed and communicated to those asking.] 4 \* \* \* 5 6 Report of Board Chair - No Report 7 \* \* \* 8 Report of Commissioner - No Report 9 \* \* \* 10 Report of Board Administrator 11 [Kirk A. Davis, Chairman, Professional Member, noted 12 the remaining 2021 meeting date is December 7. He 13 requested Board members review the 2022 meeting dates 14 and report any conflicts in advance. 15 Chairman Davis addressed Board member terms, 16 stating that it was good to have members in the 17 industry, but public members outside of the industry 18 are also accepted. He mentioned that all of the 19 public seats are currently open and to inform the 20 Board of anybody interested in becoming a Board 21 member. 2.2 Mr. Davis emphasized that public Board member 23 seats cannot be anybody who has ever been in the 2.4 vehicle profession. 25 Mr. Davis suggested Mr. Fretz keep checking with
