        Ms. Roberts explained that the Board cannot

        Ms. Bass asked why the Board does not have access
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to prescription monitoring in Pennsylvania. stated it is vital to have prescription monitoring because of diversion of controlled substances. noted people use their animals when drug-seeking and believed it is important that veterinarians are pulling a prescription monitoring program (PMP) on a pet owner to make sure they are not drug-seeking on behalf of their pet.

Ms. Bass also mentioned the importance of veterinarians having individual access to review their own Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) number and what is being filled under their number.

Chair Garg did not believe veterinarians have access to that information and had no idea that practitioners could actually directly access that information. He stated it was not a matter that would come through the Board.

Dr. Horbal is involved with many national organizations and believed Dr. Garg was correct. She did not believe prescription monitoring was something veterinarians can typically access.

Ms. Bass noted that she is surprised Pennsylvania does not have access to prescription monitoring. She noted that veterinarians as a prescriber could also see what is being filled under their DEA as well and

is a vital tool to prevent diversion.

Chair Garg did not disagree but that information as a whole would not come under the purview of the State Board of Veterinary Medicine. He commented that he did not know whether or not one of the other boards would be able to grant veterinarians access to that or whether it was a matter that would have to come through the legislature.

Mr. Kriner read a question that was raised in the chat asking whether the continuing education (CE) opportunity would be open to attorneys as well.

Ms. Bass explained that the training is not certified continuing education and was open to anyone who wants to attend.

Chair Garg informed Ms. Bass that she would be able to go ahead through DEA to organize a presentation and offer CE as a part of that. He noted the Board administrator could talk with her after the meeting about how to go about that. He mentioned that participation may be greater if people know they are going to get a couple of hours of continuing education (CE).

Dr. Horbal mentioned that there would probably be a willingness from the associations to have Ms. Bass at their conferences, which would build a bigger

audience. She noted there are multiple national conferences and usually three Pennsylvania-specific conferences every year with the PVMA.

Chair Garg informed Ms. Bass that PVMA is always looking for content and would be willing to have her present. He also mentioned that she would also not have to worry about the details of CE and credit because PVMA would take care of that.

Ms. Kehoe asked whether a Health Insurance
Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) class
would be required for them to be able to see medical
history records.

Ms. Bass explained that authorization through the state is required, and they would have to sign off on all of the different disclosures.

Ms. Bass informed Board members that the DEA is willing to assist veterinarians with their questions and have a partnership with the Board.]
