1 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed 2 Act 35 of 22 regarding temporary licensure for 3 military applicants. He noted prior Board discussion 4 at the last meeting regarding expediting licensure 5 for veterans. He referred to § 3303(b)(1)(ii), where 6 a licensing board may issue a temporary license to a 7 military applicant who complies with the licensing 8 board's requirements for temporary licensure for a 9 limited period of time at the discretion of the 10 licensing board while the military applicant 11 completes additional requirements for licensure in 12 this commonwealth. He noted Act 35 applies to all 13 the licensing boards under the Bureau of Professional 14 and Occupational Affairs (BPOA). Mr. Davis discussed 15 requirements for licensure and stated that 16 veterinarians and certified veterinary technicians 17 (CVTs) have to go to school and pass the national 18 He asked whether the Board wanted to waive exam. 19 anything to allow a military applicant to be licensed 20 quicker. The Board had no suggustions.

Chair Garg asked how Act 35 applies to the Board since they do not issue temporary licenses.

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Mr. Davis explained that it comes directly out of Act 35 to expedite licensure for veterans, service members, and spouses of services members if a board

feels that a particular applicant would benefit from temporary licensure under Act 35.

Chair Garg referred to the wording "usual procedures" for temporary licensure, noting the Board does not have any usual procedures for temporary licensure and asked whether they would grant a temporary license even though they have not granted temporary licenses anytime in the recent past or just be as expedient as possible about issuing a license given the fact that their requirements are pretty straightforward.

Mr. Davis stated Act 35 is just another tool in their toolbox when it comes to possibly getting someone working sooner. He mentioned that Ms. Roberts would expedite applications that would potentially benefit via Act 35 for licensure and, if need be, bring it before the Board or possibly the applications committee.

Acting Commissioner Claggett stated most cases would not come before the Board because applicants that identify themselves as a veteran, service member, or spouse of a service member and would receive an expedited process.

Mr. Davis also mentioned any applications sent to the applications committee may ultimately be ratified
