   sent by the executive director of the Humane Society

   of Harrisburg, on behalf of the Board of Directors for
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the Federated Humane Societies of Pennsylvania, where

1 they felt the Department of Agriculture could handle
2 the initial inspection.

Mr. Davis also noted they mentioned § 31.108, where certificate holders must provide hard copies of controlled substance logs and invoices for each drug ordered every 60 days and suggested making it a retention requirement that mirrors the DEA and allows for inspection agents at that time. He also noted they questioned the need for an exhaust fan in the area for euthanasia and whether it is necessary and why.

Mr. Davis stated IRRC has until June 1, 2022, to submit their comments, and informed the community there will be discussion on the euthanasia regulation at the July 22 meeting.

Mr. Davis reported that he is currently drafting the preamble for the continuing education regulation. He mentioned the Board voted to promulgate the fees regulation at the March 18 meeting and is hopeful to have that completed for the next meeting.]

Mary Jane McNamee, V.M.D., Chair of the 21 22 Legislative and Regulatory Affairs Committee/Interim 23 Executive Director, Pennsylvania Veterinary Medical 2.4 Association, commented that PVMA position statements 25 are self-explanatory and offered to answer any

questions.

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Chair Garg commented that Board members have had the opportunity to read the statements. He addressed the veterinary nursing language, noting the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act establishes the State Board of Veterinary Medicine and empowers the Board to adopt reasonable rules and regulations governing the practice of veterinary medicine.

Chair Garg noted Section 3 of the Act defines "veterinary technology" and "certified veterinary technician," and Section 11 states that it is the responsibility of the Board to promulgate by regulation qualifications and requirements for the certification and regulation of veterinary technicians. He mentioned that the Board utilizes the language of the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act and the Act makes no mention of "veterinary nurse" or "veterinary nursing."

Chair Garg informed PVMA that the Board is going to continue to use the language contained within the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act and changing the language would be something that would be taken to the legislature to consider with regard to the act itself.

Chair Garg addressed PVMA's telemedicine position statement, in which the PVMA opines that a

veterinarian-client-patient relationship (VCPR) cannot be established through telemedicine. He referred to guidance provided to veterinary practices amid the COVID-19 pandemic and present on the Board's website that reads, "the necessity and importance of an inperson physical examination when establishing a VCPR cannot be overstated."

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Chair Garg reported not having much to offer regarding specific advice at this point but that the Board appreciated the position statements.

Dr. McNamee commented that the guidance, as read by Chair Garg and found on the Board's website, is in line with PVMA's position regarding telehealth and the establishment of the VCPR.

She referred to the veterinary nurse initiative, noting the Board is guiding them toward a legislative solution but that PVMA is just looking for some sort of acknowledgement that this is a pertinent issue for discussion and something the Board has considered and sees the value of what PVMA is proposing.

Chair Garg commented that amending the regulations to comport with the veterinary nurse initiative is something the Board has considered, but the Board will continue to use the language of the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act, and the Act

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1 references "veterinary technology" and "certified veterinary technicians."
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Mr. Davis stated the Board has discussed the VCPR via telemedicine issue, and the veterinary nurse initiative at several past meetings. He referenced the PVMA position statements and asked whether they were available on the PVMA website.

Dr. McNamee commented that they would be in the future.]
