Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred to 23 the Status of Regulations Report and noted four 24 active regulations. He noted the Board already 25 discussed comments received for 16A-5726 regarding

the euthanasia regulation. He informed Board members that he is still working on adjusting the annex based on the discussions at the last meeting and should have the amended annex for the November meeting.

Mr. Davis reported that he has been in direct contact with legal counsel from the Department of Agriculture and has begun to discuss the possibility of drafting a memorandum of understanding ("MOU") to allow agents of the Department of Agriculture to act as "agents of the Board" for purposes of inspections in relation to the euthanasia regulation.

Mr. Davis noted the proposed Act 41 (licensure by endorsement) was still under review with Senior Regulatory Counsel. He was still drafting the Regulatory Analysis Forms for the continuing education (CE) regulation and fees regulation.]

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Report of Board Counsel - Miscellaneous
[Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided the 2021 Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA) Annual Report for the Board's review.

He reported that in 2021, the Board reported 8,788 active licensees, 299 cases opened, 290 open cases at the time of the report, 267 cases closed, and the average age to close cases was 389 days.

Mr. Davis addressed the Pennsylvania Veterinary Medical Association (PVMA) Policy Statement on "Veterinary Nursing." He noted PVMA had suggested the Board adopt new terminology for certified veterinary technicians, so they may also be referred to as "veterinary nurses." He discussed being made aware of a growing movement within the veterinary community to make this happen.

Mr. Davis referred to the summer of 2022 edition of the *Keystone Veterinarian* magazine, which is an official quarterly publication of PVMA. He addressed the May 20 meeting, where several PVMA representatives were in attendance and presented the PVMA Position Statements regarding veterinary telehealth and veterinary nursing, which are currently available on the PVMA website.

Mr. Davis addressed a statement found in the Keystone Veterinarian magazine that read, "just as the Board of Veterinary Medicine recently updated the regulations to include the use of the title veterinary assistant to replace the previously used 'noncertified employee,' PVMA asks that language be added, clarifying the title 'registered veterinary nurse (RVN)' as equivalent to 'certified veterinary technician (CVT).'"

Mr. Davis stated PVMA is reiterating their request from May, at which time the Board said they would be using the terms found in the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act. He mentioned that PVMA has decided to try to parallel the situation with how the Board changed all references in the regulations from "noncertified employees" to "veterinary assistants." He noted the Board did do that and clarified that House Bill 1742 of 2001 was signed in December 2002 and became Act 1670 of 2002.

Act 1670 amended the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act, adding several definitions and deleting the definition for "animal health technician" at Section 3(11). It added Sections 3(12), 3(13), and 3(14), which are respectively definitions for "veterinary technology", "certified veterinary technician," and "veterinary assistant." He noted the terms veterinary technology, certified veterinary technician, and veterinary assistant were added by the Legislature, not the Board, to the practice act in 2002.

Mr. Davis stated the Board responded by drafting a new regulation, which was 16A-5715 which was published as final December 18, 2004. He mentioned that the main point of the regulation was with

relation to CVTs implanting electronic identification tags in animals but also noted it updated several provisions and changed all current references in the regulations that referenced "certified animal health technicians" to "certified veterinary technicians."

Mr. Davis mentioned that the Board did not update the regulations from "noncertified employees" to "veterinary assistants" in 2004 but the Board did add a second "e" to every reference of employee and kept all references to "noncertified employees" in the regulations.

Mr. Davis referred to 16A-5727, which is the regulation PVMA is discussing, and published as final on December 28, 2019. He commented that the main purpose of the regulation was to remove the 10-year automatic bar on certification for veterinary technicians convicted of a felony under the Controlled Substance, Drug, Device, and Cosmetic Act; however, it also amended nine separate sections of the regulation, updating and clarifying certain provisions. He noted that via 16A-5727, the Board changed all "noncertified employees" references to instead refer to "veterinary assistants," to mirror the language of the practice act in 2019.

Mr. Davis again referred to PVMA's statement in

the Keystone Veterinarian magazine in which the PVMA asks that language be added to the Board's regulations, clarifying that the title "registered veterinary nurse (RVN)" is equivalent to "certified veterinary technician (CVT)," and comparing this requested amendment to the Board's recent amendment to the Regulations in which the title "veterinary assistant" replaced the previously used title "non-certified employee."

He noted that in 2019 the Board did update the regulations, replacing the title "non-certified employee" with the title "veterinary assistant," but suggested it did so because the Legislature amended the practice act to include the title "veterinary assistant" - albeit the Board amended the regulations 17 years after the Legislature defined "veterinary assistant."

Mr. Davis strongly encouraged the Board to amend the regulations accordingly if the Legislature amends the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act to define "veterinary nurse" or "veterinary nursing," however he counseled the Board to continue to use the nomenclature found within the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act until that time, and reiterated that the practice act does not currently define "veterinary
