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**SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH RELEASES
STATE BOARD OF NURSING ACTIONS (1ST Quarter 2006)**

Harrisburg (May 4, 2006) – Secretary of the Commonwealth Pedro A. Cortes and Basil L. Merenda, Commissioner of the Department's of Professional and Occupational Affairs, today announced 84 disciplinary actions taken by the following State Board of Nursing in the first quarter of 2006.

Actions were taken against individuals or firms in the following counties: Allegheny (6 actions); Armstrong (1 action); Beaver (2 actions); Berks (3 actions); Bucks (3 actions); Butler (3 actions); Cambria (1 action); Chester (1 action); Clearfield (1 action); Clinton (1 action); Delaware (1 action); Fayette (1 action); Franklin (1 action); Indiana (1 action); Jefferson (1 action); Lackawanna (1 action); Lancaster (6 actions); Lawrence (1 action); Lebanon (1 action); Luzerne (2 actions); McKean (1 action); Monroe (1 action); Montgomery (7 actions); Northampton (1 action); Philadelphia (5 actions); Schuylkill (1 action); Washington (3 actions); Westmoreland (2 actions); and York (2 actions). A total of 22 actions involved Pennsylvania licensees with out-of-state addresses.

The State Board of Nursing released the following Disciplinary Actions:

Machelle Ashworth, license no. PN-101020-L, of Ellwood City, Lawrence County, was suspended by the Lawrence County Court of Common Pleas of Lawrence County on September 8, 2005. The court issued the suspension, which was effective immediately, under section 4355 of the Domestic Relations Code. (11-01-05)

Cynthia Raymond, L.P.N., license no. PN-051678-L, of Boyertown, Berks County, was suspended for no less than three years, retroactive to November 14, 2005. Ms. Raymond is unable to practice practical nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients because of her addiction to alcohol or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (11-17-05)

Julie A. Bennett, license no. PN259477L, of Westover, Clearfield County, was suspended by the Clearfield County Court of Common Pleas on October 17, 2005. The court issued the suspension, which was effective immediately, under section 4355 of the Domestic Relations Code. (11-21-05)

Robert Michael Ernst, license no. RN-252525-L, of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, was actively suspended for at least three years, retroactive to September 19, 2005. Mr. Ernst violated the terms and conditions of his Voluntary Recovery Program Agreement. (11-22-05)

Elizabeth Fassel Shaner, license no. PN-261637, of King of Prussia, Montgomery County, was suspended. Ms. Shaner committed fraud or deceit in the practice of practical nursing, misappropriated drugs from her employer, and is addicted to narcotic drugs. (12-05-05)

Patricia Clark Weiss, R.N., license no. RN-336182-L, of Glassboro, NJ, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years, retroactive to April 25, 2005. Ms. Clark is unable to practice professional nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of addiction to alcohol or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (12-05-05)

Cynthia L. Smith, license no. PN-065300-L, of Washington, Washington County, had a civil penalty of \$825 imposed based on findings that she practiced practical nursing for 11 months while her license was lapsed. (12-05-05)

Brian A. McCarthy, TLRN-021737, of Cheyenne, WY, had his temporary practice permit rescinded and was issued an order to cease the practice of professional nursing. (12-06-05)

Catherine J. Wooley, license no. RN-528515-L, of Beaver Falls, Beaver County, was automatically suspended following her guilty plea to felonies in violation of the Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act ("Drug Act"). (12-06-05)

Darlene A. Maurer, L.P.N., license no. PN-040866-L, of Hatboro, Montgomery County, was suspended for no less than three years. Ms. Maurer is unable to practice practical nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients because of her addiction to alcohol or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (12-14-05)

Michael Sweeney, license no. RN-207248-L, of Elkins Park, Montgomery County, had his professional nursing license reinstated and placed on probation for three years. (12-15-05)

Karen S. Urzen, license nos. PN-066041-L and RN-518775-L, of St. Petersburg, Florida, was suspended for not less than three years. Ms. Urzen is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of dependence upon alcohol or other drugs. (12-15-05)

Melissa Haney, unlicensed, of Scranton, Lackawanna County, was denied licensure as a professional nurse by endorsement. Ms. Haney is unable to practice professional nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients. (12-20-05)

Darren Buchanan, unlicensed, of Moncton, NB, Canada, was denied licensure as a professional nurse by endorsement, based on findings he was disciplined by the proper

licensing authority of Texas. (12-20-05)

Debra D. DeLoe, unlicensed, of Mayville, NY, was denied licensure as a professional nurse by endorsement. Ms. DeLoe was disciplined by the proper licensing authority of New York. (12-20-05)

Joseph D. Mantini, license no. PN-250150-L, of Rochester Mills, Indiana County, had his practical nursing license suspended for three months, followed by one-year probation, based on his criminal convictions. (12-30-05)

Claire J. Nelson, R.N., license no. RN-235398-L, of Temple, Berks County, was suspended for no less than three years, retroactive to October 24, 2005. Ms. Nelson is unable to practice practical nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of addiction to alcohol or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (01-04-06)

Kayon Sinclair, license no. RN333011L, of Coral Springs, FL, was suspended by the Montgomery County Court of Common Pleas on December 21, 2005. The court issued the suspension, which was effective immediately, under section 4355 of the Domestic Relations Code. (01-04-06)

Tina L. Henry, license no. PN258555L, of Johnstown, Cambria County, was suspended by the Somerset County Court of Common Pleas on December 27, 2005. The court issued the suspension, which was effective immediately, under section 4355 of the Domestic Relations Code. (01-10-06)

Debra L. Lane, R.N., license no. RN-344134-L, of Glenside, Montgomery County, had her nursing license suspended for no less than three years, retroactive to July 28, 2005. Ms. Lane is unable to practice practical nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of addiction to alcohol or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (01-10-06)

Patricia Heinzman, license no. PN-053168-L, of Slippery Rock, Butler County, was suspended for up to one year, retroactive to December 16, 2005, following her guilty plea to possession of a controlled substance. (1-18-06)

Valinda Lea Ray, R.N., license no. RN-507201-L, of Swissvale, Allegheny County, had the stay of her suspension vacated for no less than three years, retroactive to December 6, 2005. Ms. Ray is unable to practice practical nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients because of her addiction to alcohol or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (01-18-06)

Rancita Siao tong, license no. RN-190563-L of Media, Delaware County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years with the suspension immediately stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Ms. Siao tong is unable to practice the profession with reasonable skill and safety to patients. (01-19-06)

Joseph P. Turner, license no. RN-341792-L of Meadowbrook, Montgomery County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years with the suspension immediately stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Mr. Turner is unable to practice the profession with reasonable skill and safety to patients. (01-19-06)

Julia M. Chorle, license no. RN218276L of Hilliards, Butler County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$3,000 and a public reprimand placed on her permanent board record. Ms. Chorle practiced as a professional nurse on an expired license. (01-19-20-06)

Julie Whittle Coverdale, license no. RN-294753-L, of Palmyra, New Jersey and St. Paul, Minnesota, was indefinitely suspended of her professional nursing license. Ms. Coverdale is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients because of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol, or mental impairment. Ms. Coverdale also had disciplinary action taken against her New Jersey nursing license. (01-19,20-06)

Melissa Gomes, license no. PN-255820-L of Bradford, McKean County, was suspended for a period of one year. Ms. Gomes falsified or knowingly made incorrect entries into the patient's records or related documents. (1-19&20-06)

Douglas J. Hunter, R.N., license no. RN-529395-L of Windber, Somerset County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years and six months. Mr. Hunter failed to practice with reasonable skill and safety because of immoral or unprofessional conduct. (01-19&20-06)

Sharyn Janes, RN, license no. RN-275882-L, of Purvis, Mississippi, was assessed a civil penalty of \$500 because she had disciplinary action taken against her license by the proper licensing authority of another state. (1-19&20-06)

Kathryn T. Prough, LPN, license no. PN-071518-L of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, was indefinitely suspended for at least three years. Ms. Prough failed to practice the profession with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol, or mental impairment. (01-19&20-06)

Peter J. Theobald, license no. RN-333319-L, of Lancaster, Lancaster County, had a public reprimand placed on his permanent board record. Mr. Theobald had disciplinary action taken against his license by the proper licensing authority of another state, territory or country. (1-19&20-06)

Elaine M. Wright, license no. RN-271827-L of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than one year, and the suspension was immediately stayed in favor of no less than one year of probation. Ms. Wright violated her Disciplinary Monitoring Unit by testing positive for a foreign substance. (01-19&20-06)

Rhonda M. Zajac, license no. RN-244802-L, of San Diego, California, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years. Ms. Zajac is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol,

or mental impairment and had disciplinary action taken against her California nursing license. (01-19,20-06)

Marie Bertrand-Whatley, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was granted permission to sit for the Professional Nursing Examination, and upon successful completion of the examination, shall be issued a license to practice professional nursing. (01-23-06)

Kristen D. Bray, license no. RN-542578-L, of Palmyra, NJ, had her professional nursing license revoked based on disciplinary action taken against her license by the proper licensing authority of another state. (01-23-06)

Angela Herbst Bricker, license no. RN-523140-L, of York, York County, was actively suspended for at least three years, retroactive to April 26, 2005. Ms. Bricker failed to comply with the terms of the Voluntary Recovery Program of the Professional Health Monitoring Programs. (01-23-06)

William Brian Burnham, license nos. RN-330116-L and PN-090735-L, of New Hope, Bucks County, had his professional and practical nursing licenses revoked following his guilty plea to felonies in the courts of the United States. (01-23-06)

Melissa Sue Cole, license no. RN-348819-L, of Brookfield, OH, was indefinitely suspended, based on disciplinary action taken against her license by the proper licensing authority in another state. (01-23-06)

Brian Alan DuBow, license no. RN-509389-L, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was actively suspended for at least three years, retroactive to April 26, 2005. Mr. DuBow failed to comply with the terms of the Voluntary Recovery Program of the Professional Health Monitoring Programs. (01-23-06)

James A. Ellsworth, of Warminster, Bucks County, was granted permission to sit for the Practical Nursing Examination, and upon successful completion of the examination, shall be issued a license to practice practical nursing. Mr. Ellsworth will be immediately placed on probation for a period of no less than three years, subject to monitoring by the Professional Health Monitoring Program. (01-23-06)

Linda Hammack Finney, license no. RN-353653-L, of Yuma, AZ, had her professional nursing license revoked based on disciplinary action taken against her license by the proper licensing authority of another state. (01-23-06)

Barbara J. Francis, license no. PN256588L, of Cypress, TX, was suspended by the Chester County Court of Common Pleas on December 19, 2005. The court issued the suspension, which was effective immediately, under section 4355 of the Domestic Relations Code. (01-23-06)

John C. Green, license no. RN-344621-L, of Newport, VA, was suspended for at least three years, retroactive to January 9, 2003. Mr. Green failed to comply with the terms of

the Voluntary Recovery Program of the Professional Health Monitoring Program. (01-23-06)

Scott Jason Amrozewicz, license no. RN-349022-L, of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was indefinitely suspended, retroactive to February 28, 2005. Mr. Amrozewicz violated the terms and condition of his parole imposed by the board's September 30, 2003 reinstatement order by dispensing narcotics without prior case manager approval. (01-27-06)

Diand Plymire Fraser, license no. RN-310765-L, of Langeloth, Washington County, was indefinitely suspended, retroactive to October 22, 2004. Ms. Fraser violated the terms of probation set forth in the board's order of February 13, 2004. (01-27-06)

Tracey Graham, unlicensed, of Belmont, NY, was granted licensure as a practical nurse by endorsement, and immediately placed on probation for a least one year. Ms. Graham previously pled guilty to a misdemeanor on December 21, 2004. (01-27-06)

Amanda Jill Jerles, L.P.N., license no. PN-253361-L, of Mill Hall, Clinton County, had her nursing license suspended for no less than three years, retroactive to December 1, 2005. Ms. Jerles is unable to practice practical nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of addiction to alcohol or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (01-27-06)

William C. Jackson, license no. RN-524990-L, of Cherry Hill, NJ, was suspended for no less than three years, retroactive to May 23, 2005. Mr. Jackson is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of addiction to alcohol or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (01-31-06)

Shelly L. Oxenreider, L.P.N., license no. PN-254292-L, of Pottsville, Schuylkill County, was issued a \$1,000 civil penalty and had her nursing license suspended, with the suspension stayed in favor of probation subject to monitoring by the board for a period of time to run concurrent with her court ordered criminal probation. (01-31-06)

Laura Reed Kauffman, C.R.N.P., license no. RN-317598-L, of Marietta, Lancaster County, had her nursing license suspended for five years stayed in favor of probation subject to monitoring by the board. (02-01-06)

Susan Keelen, R.N., license no. RN-502354-L, of Stockton, NJ, had her nursing license suspended until such time as her nursing license in New Jersey is reinstated to non-restricted status. Ms. Keelen is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of addiction to alcohol or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (02-01-06)

Joy Norris, R.N., license no. RN-159902-L, of Plumsteadville, Bucks County, was suspended for no less than three years, retroactive to August 1, 2005, stayed, after no less than six months active suspension, in favor of probation for a period of three years subject to monitoring by the board. (02-06-06)

Joan Codispot, license no. RN-201321-L, of Butler, Butler County was actively suspended for at least three years, retroactive to December 5, 2005. Ms. Codispot failed to comply with the terms and conditions of the Voluntary Recovery Program Consent Agreement and Order. (02-08-06)

Tammy S. Fiedler, license no. PN-258088-L of Myerstown, Lebanon County, was placed on indefinite suspension for no less than two years from the date of the board's acceptance of this order, together with payment of a civil penalty of \$500. Ms. Fiedler had disciplinary action taken by the proper licensing authority of another state. (03-02-06)

Jennifer L. Freeman, license no. PN-256931-L of York, York County, was immediately suspended, pending a hearing, for being deemed to be a clear and immediate danger to public health and safety after being charged with several felonies, including criminal homicide, in York, Pennsylvania. (03-02-06)

Nicholas J. Maioriello, license no. RN-320391-L of Bethlehem, Northampton County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years. Mr. Maioriello is unable to practice the profession with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol, or mental impairment. (03-02-06)

Beth L. Pennypacker, license no. RN225597L of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, was required to pay a civil penalty of \$1,000 and a reprimand was placed on her board record. Ms. Pennypacker practiced as a professional nurse on an expired license. (03-2-06)

Michael A. Pulizzi, license no. RN-512704-L of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, was indefinitely suspended. Mr. Pulizzi is unable to practice the profession with reasonable skill and safety to patients. (03-02-06)

Lynn M. Work, license no. PN-052098-L and RN-298333-L of Lancaster, Lancaster County, was suspended for no less than four years, retroactive to April 30, 2005. After one year of active suspension, retroactive to April 30, 2005, Ms. Work may petition the board to stay the suspension in favor of probation. Ms. Work violated the terms and conditions of her VRP Consent Agreement and Order. (03-02-06)

Phyllis S. Dempsey, RN, license no. RN-276329-L of North Huntingdon, Westmoreland County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$1,000. Ms. Dempsey practiced nursing while her license was expired or lapsed. (03-02&03-06)

Robin McGettigan Farr, license no. PN-085914-L of Abington, Montgomery County, was suspended for no less than five years, such suspension to be immediately stayed in favor of no less than five years of probation. Ms. Farr violated her DMU Order by testing positive for Cocaine Metabolite. (03-02&03-06)

Bonnie Miller Gabler, license no. RN-323257-L of Chambersburg, Franklin County, was ordered to permanently surrender her license to practice professional nursing. Ms. Gabler

engaged in unprofessional conduct which departed from the ethical or quality standard of the profession and is unable to practice professional nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol, or mental impairment. (03-02&03-06)

Faith Seserko-Gaffney, license no. RN-227375-L of Merchantville, NJ, was suspended for no less than three years, with the suspension immediately stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Ms. Seserko-Gaffney is unsafe to practice professional nursing by reason of mental or physical illness or condition or physiological or psychological dependence upon alcohol, hallucinogenic or narcotic drugs or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (03-02&03-06)

Betty H. Stauffer, license no. PN-084801-L of Ephrata, Lancaster County, was suspended for no less than three years, with the suspension immediately stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Ms. Stauffer tested positive to a restricted substance in violation of her VRP Agreement (03-02&03-06).

Melissa A. Trimbath, license no. RN-217618-L, of Republic, Fayette County, voluntarily surrendered her professional nursing license. Ms. Trimbath is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol, or mental impairment. (3/2-3/06)

Michael Darren Blassingame, a.k.a. Darin Blassingame, license no. RN-538973-L, of Macon, GA, was suspended for at least five years and assessed a \$1,000 civil penalty, based on immoral or unprofessional conduct. (03-07-06)

Roberta A. Shannon Gillispie, license no. PN-264627, of Wellsburg, WV, was issued a public reprimand, by reason of disciplinary action imposed upon her by the proper licensing authority in West Virginia. (03-07-06)

Theresa A. Kamus-Kelly, license no. RN298133L of Kingston, Luzerne County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than 39 months, with three months active suspension, with the suspension to supersede the prior Order of Suspension entered January 11, 2006. Ms. Kamus-Kelly pleaded guilty to knowingly and intentionally acquiring or obtaining possession of Fentanyl by misrepresentation, fraud, forgery, deception or subterfuge in violation of Section 13(a)(12) of the Drug Act, 35 P.S. §780-113(a)(12), a felony. (04-10-06)

Catherine W. McGrail, license no. RN-324475-L of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$1,000. Ms. McGrail practiced as a professional nurse on an expired license. (04-10-06)

Susan W. Moorhead, license no. PN-095087-L of Kittaning, Armstrong County, was suspended for no less than one year, with the suspension immediately stayed in favor of no less than one year of probation. Ms. Moorhead failed to conform to a quality standard of the nursing profession to safeguard a patient's dignity and right to privacy. (04-10-06)

John J. Pambianco, license no. RN-324865-L of Trucksville, Luzerne County, was revoked retroactive to September 19, 2005. Mr. Pambianco was convicted of a crime of moral turpitude and violated the Criminal History Record Information Act in that he was convicted of a misdemeanor which relates to his profession. (04-10-06)

Susan Smith, license no. RN-335770-L of Elverson, Chester County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$1,000 because she practiced as a professional nurse on an expired license thereby practicing nursing without a current, valid, unexpired license. (04-10-06)

Heather L. Konzelmann, license no. RN-552704-L, of Douglassville, Berks County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years, with the suspension immediately stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Ms. Konzelmann is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol, or mental impairment. (04/10-11/06)

Karen A. Gordon, license no. RN-318753-L, of Toronto, OH, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years, with the suspension immediately stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Ms. Gordon is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol, or mental impairment and misappropriated drugs from an employer. (04/10-11/06)

Shawn R. Arnold, license no. RN-5427034-L, of Denver, Lancaster County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years and three months, with the suspension may be stayed after three months of active suspension in favor of no less than three years of probation. Mr. Arnold is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol, or mental impairment. (04/10-11/06)

Valerie D. Borkovich, license no. RN-529542-L, of Monaca, Beaver County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years, such suspension to be immediately stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Ms. Borkovich is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol, or mental impairment misappropriated drugs from an employer, and possessed, used, acquired or distributed a controlled substance for other than an acceptable purpose. (04/10-11/06)

Letty A. Burkett, R.N., license no. PN-106647-L and RN-542205-L, of Brookville, Jefferson County, was suspended for no less than three years, such suspension to be immediately stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Ms. Burkett is unsafe to practice professional or practical nursing by reason of mental or physical illness or condition or physiological or psychological dependence upon alcohol, hallucinogenic or narcotic drugs or other drugs. (4-10&11-06)

Jerome D. Ciancione, license no. RN-522317-L, of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years, such suspension to be immediately

stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Mr. Ciancione is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, addiction to drugs or alcohol, or mental impairment and his license to practice nursing was disciplined in another state. (04/10-11/06).

Patricia M. Cuthbertson, LPN, license no. PN-251139-L of Ischua, NY, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$1,500 and suspended for a period of one year, stayed in favor of one year probation. Ms. Cuthbertson violated the Act at P.S. § 666(a)(8) in that she has been guilty of immoral or unprofessional conduct. (04-10/11-06)

Eileen Howell Hayne, license no. RN-242630L of Irwin, Westmoreland County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years, with the suspension stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation, said probation to be subject to terms and conditions set forth in the order. Ms. Hayne is unable to practice professional nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of mental or physical illness or condition or physiological or psychological dependence upon alcohol, hallucinogenic or narcotic drugs or other drugs which tend to impair judgment or coordination. (04-10-11-06)

Lisa Williamson Reeder, license no. RN-262405-L of Claysville, Washington County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years, with the suspension immediately stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Ms. Reeder is unsafe to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety by reason of addiction to alcohol. (04-10/11-06)

Natalie L. Ryan, license no. RN-534170-L, of Havertown, Montgomery County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than three years, with the suspension immediately stayed in favor of no less than three years of probation. Ms. Ryan is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness and violated an order of the Board. (04/10-11/06).

Patricia E. Saunders, now know as Patricia E. Bainbridge, license no. PN-101031-L of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than five years, with the suspension immediately stayed in favor of no less than five years of probation, being subject to terms and conditions. Ms. Saunders is addicted to alcohol, hallucinogenic or narcotic drugs or other drugs which tend to impair judgment and coordination or cause mental incompetence. (04-10/11-06)

Arthur A. Weglein, license nos. PN-077549-L and RN-536937-L, of East Stroudsburg, Monroe County, was indefinitely suspended for no less than one year, such suspension to be immediately stayed in favor of no less than one year of probation. Mr. Weglein is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness and violated an order of the Board. (04/10-11/06).

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
