Allegheny County

VHA Pennsylvania, Inc., license no. PX177323 of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$500, because they failed to renew their approval to offer continuing education courses by Jan. 1, 2008. (01/12/09)

Bucks County

George P. Boyle, license no. CA014553L of Yardley, Bucks County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$1,000 and a public reprimand was placed on his permanent Board record, because he engaged in unprofessional conduct. (01/12/09)

AF000281L of Paoli, Chester County, was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$1,500 and a public reprimand was placed on the Respondent's permanent record, because they operated an accountancy firm when it was not currently licensed and registered under the Act. PE049485R of Onsted, Mich., was ordered to pay a civil penalty of \$5,000, ordered to enroll in and complete a board-approved course in engineering ethics prior to Dec. 15, 2008, and provide evidence to the board of his successful completion of the required ethics course, because he practiced engineering in the Commonwealth on a lapsed license between Sept. 29, 1999 and Feb. 28, 2007, and used his seal on engineering drawings during the period of Sept. 29, 1999, through Feb. 28, 2007, during a time when he held no valid, current certificate of licensure. reason of mental or physical illness or condition, or physiological or psychological dependence upon alcohol, hallucinogenic or narcotic drugs or other drugs that tend to impair judgment or coordination. Respondent has also violated a lawful disciplinary order of the Board in that the Respondent pled guilty to a misdemeanor under the Pharmacy Act. (01/15/09)

RN578073 of Mohnton, Berks County, had his nursing license suspended for no less than three years, retroactive to Oct. 27, 2008, based on findings that he is unable to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of addiction to alcohol or other drugs that tend to impair judgment or coordination. Mary Bush Hallock, LPN, license no. PN257552l of Sellersville, Bucks County, had her license reinstated subject to a three-year period of probation while participating in a Professional Health Monitoring Program. (12/19/08)

RN528953L of Lincoln University, Chester County, had her professional nursing license indefinitely suspended until such time that her Delaware license has been reinstated to unrestricted status, and she provides the Board with an evaluation indicating that she is safe to practice professional nursing in Pennsylvania.
