1.	Writ, prepared by presiding officer, served on the Secretary of the Commonwealth January 25, 2019 (<i>At least 60 days prior to the special election. 25 P.S. § 2777</i>)
2.	First day for political parties and minor political parties to nominate candidates by filing nomination certificates
3.	First day for political bodies to circulate and file nomination papers nominating candidates
4.	Last day to file nomination certificates and nomination papers
5.	Last day to file objections: 3 days after the deadline for filing April 4, 2019 (25 P.S. § 2782)
6.	Last day for Commonwealth Court to set a hearing on objections: 7 days after deadline for filing April 8, 2019 (25 P.S. § 2782)
7.	Last day to withdraw: 7 days after the deadline for filing April 8, 2019 (25 P.S. § 2783)
8.	Last day to file substituted nomination certificates: 7 days after the deadline for filing
9.	Last day to file objections to substituted nominations: 3 days after substituted nomination certificate is filed Depends on filing date (25 P.S. § 2785)

10.	Last day for Secretary of the Commonwealth to certify names and residence of all candidates
11.	Last day to register to vote before the election
12.	Last day before the election on which official applications for civilian absentee ballots may be received by the county board of elections
13.	All civilian absentee ballots must be received by the county board of elections not later than 5:00 P.M. on this day to be counted
14.	Last day for county boards of elections to receive voted military and overseas absentee ballots

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- A. Political Parties file nomination certificates, nominating candidates in accordance with party rules.
- B. Candidates of political bodies file nomination papers, obtaining signatures equal to 2% of the largest vote cast for any elected officer in that district at the last preceding election or the number of signatures required on a nomination petition for a political party candidate, whichever is greater. Signers of such papers must be qualified, registered electors of the district. The number of signatures required on nomination papers to be filed by candidates of political bodies for the Special Election for the 12th Congressional District is 3,221. All nomination papers must be accompanied by a properly completed candidate's affidavit. In addition, a filing fee of \$150.00 must be submitted with each set of nomination papers and must be paid by cashier's check or money order payable to the 'Commonwealth of Pennsylvania'. Please contact the Bureau of Commissions, Elections and Legislation at 717-787-5280, Option 5 to answer questions regarding nomination papers.
- *NOTE:* The Election Code provides that no person "who is a registered and enrolled member of a party (shall) be eligible to be the candidate of a political body for a special election." 25 P.S. § 2911.1.
