Language, noting a relation to changing regulations.

He stated that currently the exam has been extended 10
days into the third month of the testing window and
will ultimately be year-round. He suggested changing
the wording of the regulations to match when the exam
will be given.

Mr. Rollage noted the Proposed Change to Rule 5-7(a)(2).

Ms. Walter will draft a letter to NASBA regarding the language. She commented that other Boards have voted on not enforcing a particular regulation pending amendment to the regulation. The Board will further consider the matter at its April meeting.

Mr. Rollage questioned whether there was a way of streamlining the process when inconsistencies are identified, either through communication with legislature or with the commissioner's office.

Ms. Walter stated the Board does regulatory changes and explained that statutory changes go through the legislature and are not something empowered by the Board.]
