9 State Board of Accountancy

10 July 21, 2020

11 ***

12 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State
13 Board of Accountancy was held on Tuesday, July 21,
14 2020. Erik V. Scully, Esquire, CPA, Chairman, called
15 the meeting to order at 10:33 a.m.

16 ***

17 [Introduction of Board Members]

18 ***

19 [Erik V. Scully, Esquire, CPA, Chairman, stated the
20 Board regulates the practice of public accountants and
21 certified public accountants (CPAs) in the
22 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, noting the Board's
23 functions include the regulation of licensure and
24 registration of public accountants and the licensure
25 and certifications of CPAs.]

1 Chairman Scully commented that the Board
2 promulgates, amends, and enforces requirements for
3 continuing education and the standards of professional
4 conduct applicable to public accountants and CPAs.

5 Chairman Scully mentioned changes throughout the
6 years and streamlining the profession. He referred to
7 the attest function as the CPAs franchise, which was
8 an examination of all data used in an audit as well as
9 the finished audit report conducted by a CPA with the
10 intention to express an opinion as to the accuracy of
11 the company's financial statements.

12 Chairman Scully stated that accountants act as
13 independent certifiers of the financial records of
14 businesses, which is the driving force in the economy.

15 Chairman Scully also stated that accountants
16 adhere to a strict code of ethics of independence,
17 integrity, character, and responsibility.

18 Ms. Fox welcomed Mr. O'Brien to the Board.

19 Mr. O'Brien thanked Chairman Scully for the
20 opportunity to serve the Board and Pennsylvania CPAs.

21 Mr. O'Brien provided a brief summary of his
22 present professional background.]

23 ***

24 Approval of minutes of the May 19, 2020 meeting

25 CHAIRMAN SCULLY:

1 The first thing on the agenda is
2 approval of the minutes from our May 19,
3 2020 Board meeting.

4 Has everybody had an opportunity to
5 review the minutes and does anybody have
6 any changes to be made to the minutes?

7 Hearing none. I ask for a motion
8 to approve the minutes of May 19, 2020?

9 MR. KELLY:

10 So moved.

11 CHAIRMAN SCULLY:

12 Do I have a second?

13 MS. JENSIK:

14 Second.

15 CHAIRMAN SCULLY:

16 All those in favor, say aye. Any
17 objections, say nay.

18 [The motion carried unanimously.]

19 ***

20 Report of Prosecutorial Division

21 [Angela B. Lucci, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison,
22 presented the Consent Agreements for File No. 15-55-
23 15240, Case No. 17-55-07785, File No. 18-55-008057,
24 File No. 18-55-009259, and File No. 17-55-08088.]

25 ***

1 Report of Board Counsel

2 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred to
3 the Act 41 proposed licensure by endorsement annex.
4 He mentioned prior discussion and referred to the
5 revised annex with additions requested by the Board at
6 the last meeting.

7 Chairman Scully referred to § 11.5a regarding
8 licensure by endorsement, confirming that applicants
9 must meet all of the requirements in numbers 1 through
10 5.

11 Chairman Scully also referred to § 11.5a(1)(i)
12 regarding "substantially equivalent," where an
13 applicant must have (A) a baccalaureate or higher
14 degree from a college or university accredited by an
15 accrediting agency nationally recognized by the United
16 States Department of Education or a college or
17 university approved by the board and (B) achievement
18 of a passing score on the Uniform Certified Public
19 Accountant Examination or other Board-approved skills
20 examination.

21 Mr. Rouse noted the addition of the word "and" to
22 be that connector for people to be aware they needed
23 both (A) and (B).]

24 ***

25 MR. ROUSE:

1 Is the Board going to entertain a motion
2 to adopt the Annex for Licensure by
3 Endorsement for CPAs and direct Board
4 counsel to distribute this as an
5 exposure draft?

6 CHAIRMAN SCULLY:

7 Do we have a motion to submit this
8 proposed annex as an exposure draft and
9 distribute it to the appropriate
10 stakeholders?

11 MR. KELLY:

12 So moved.

13 CHAIRMAN SCULLY:

14 Do I have a second?

15 MS. JENSIK:

16 Second.

17

18 CHAIRMAN SCULLY:

19 All those in favor, say aye. All those
20 who object, say nay.

21 [The motion carried unanimously.]

22

23 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed
24 Act 53 of 2020, which was enacted on July 1, 2020, to
25 codify Act 48 of 1993 and Title 18 of the Pennsylvania

1 Consolidated Statutes for the Board's review. He
2 mentioned consideration of criminal convictions and
3 best practice guidelines, which the Board will need to
4 discuss at the next Board meeting.

5 Chairman Scully referred to Chapter 31 regarding
6 Powers and Duties, where under § 3105(a)(2) each
7 licensing board shall have the power to decide if a
8 specific disciplinary matter or type of disciplinary
9 matter is to be heard by the licensing board itself or
10 by a hearing examiner appointed under this subsection.

11 Chairman Scully noted this to be a called a
12 delegation order and requested the Board examine that
13 delegation order to see if it is appropriate and
14 whether it needed to be expanded or limited. He
15 stated the Board currently retains jurisdiction over
16 the moral character issue and everything else is
17 delegated pretty much to a hearing examiner, where the
18 Board has the right to review and deny the hearing
19 examiner's recommendation.

20 Chairman Scully suggested the Board review § 3111
21 licensure by endorsement language regarding whether a
22 current license in a territory or country was
23 substantially equivalent.]

24 ***

25 Report of Regulatory Counsel - No Report

2 Report of Board Chairman

3 [Erik V. Scully, Esquire, CPA, Chairman, announced Ms.
4 Ellis will be taking over as Board Chair, noting this
5 to be Chairman Scully's last meeting.

6 Chairman Scully thanked Ms. Fox, legal counsel,
7 and the commissioner for making this an enjoyable
8 exercise.]

9 ***

10 Report of Commissioner

11 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of
12 Professional and Occupational Affairs, thanked
13 Chairman Scully for his service on the Board and
14 wonderful working relationship. He noted being
15 privileged and honored to work with Chairman Scully
16 and the Board.

17 Commissioner Johnson welcomed Mr. O'Brien to the
18 Board, referring to the Board as a great group of
19 individuals committed to the protection of public
20 health and safety.

21 Commissioner Johnson again thanked members of the
22 Board for their flexibility and patience during the
23 COVID-19 world of virtual meetings. He mentioned the
24 Board has performed admirably under the present
25 conditions. He noted appreciation for the

1 participation of stakeholders and the public.

2 Commissioner Johnson acknowledged the program
3 folks and Ms. Fox for all of their hard work
4 throughout these trying times and Board counsel and
5 the prosecutorial division for their hard work.

6 Commissioner Johnson thanked Mr. Farrell and Mr.
7 LaFratte from the policy office for their effort with
8 regard to extension and regulatory waivers and
9 ensuring the regulatory community continues to be able
10 to operate given the burdens and challenges.]

11 ***

12 Report of Board Administrator

13 [Sara Fox, Board Administrator, provided an update on
14 the 2019 Continuing Professional Education (CPE)
15 audits. She stated letters have gone out and audits
16 are being received on a daily basis. She will provide
17 statistics at some point in the future when completed.

18 Ms. Fox updated the Board on the National
19 Association of State Boards of Accountancy (NASBA)
20 Licensee Database, noting it will be up and running
21 again as soon as possible. She noted both state
22 information technology (IT) and NASBA IT folks are
23 reviewing the backend of that. She thanked licensees
24 for their patience during the period the information
25 was gone and hopes it will be implemented as soon as

1 possible.]

2

3 Report of Board Chairman (cont.)

4 [Erik V. Scully, Esquire, CPA, Chairman, noted holding
5 the committee assignments following the open Board
6 meeting.]

7

8 Report of Committees - Communications Committee

9 [Sheri L. Risler, CPA, announced a newsletter for
10 distribution to CPAs in Pennsylvania for the fall of
11 2020 to include a brief description about the
12 developments with CPA Evolution and a Uniform
13 Accountancy Act (UAA) call to action provided by
14 NASBA.

15 Ms. Risler also noted the newsletter to include
16 providing CPAs from Pennsylvania with anything
17 relevant to the impact of COVID-19, such as CPA credit
18 extensions. She mentioned providing a list of new
19 CPAs for the last year acknowledging their
20 accomplishments and data regarding statistics of
21 Pennsylvania CPAs. She stated the newsletter will
22 have a letter from Chairman Scully and incoming Chair
23 Ellis.

24 Ms. Risler noted the importance of communicating
25 with CPAs in Pennsylvania.]

2 Review of Program Sponsor Applications

3 [Erik V. Scully, Esquire, CPA, Chairman, noted program
4 sponsor applications for approval during this
5 meeting.]

6 ***

7 Review of Experience Qualifications for CPA
8 Certification

9 [Erik V. Scully, Esquire, CPA, Chairman, noted review
10 of experience qualifications for CPA certification was
11 on hold.]

12 ***

13 Miscellaneous

14 [Sara Fox, Board Administrator, noted 2020 Board
15 meeting dates. She also requested Board approval for
16 the proposed 2021 Board meeting dates.]

17 ***

18 CHAIRMAN SCULLY:

19 Do we have a motion on the meeting dates
20 for 2020 and 2021 as outlined by our
21 Board administrator?

22 MR. KELLY:

23 Motion to approve.

24 CHAIRMAN SCULLY:

25 Do I have a second?

1 MR. ROLLAGE:

3 CHAIRMAN SCULLY:

9 National Association of State Boards of Accountancy
10 [Erik V. Scully, Esquire, CPA, Chairman, noted the
11 NASBA Candidate Quarterly Report for the 1st quarter
12 of 2020 for the Board's review.]

13 ***

14 Report of Board Chairman (Continued)

15 [Erik V. Scully, Esquire, CPA, Chairman, referred to
16 the Gift Ban Policy and the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act
17 for the Board's review.]

18 ***

19 Miscellaneous (Continued)

20 [Barry M. Berkowitz, CPA, Chair of the American
21 Institute of Certified Public Accountants Board of
22 Examiners, welcomed Mr. O'Brien to the Board. He
23 mentioned this would be the last meeting for Chairman
24 Scully and Mr. Whitcomb and hoped to get together soon
25 as former Board members.]

1 Mr. Berkowitz addressed COVID-19 and the closure
2 of testing centers during the pandemic, where
3 candidates lost the opportunity to take the exam. He
4 stated the American Institute of Certified Public
5 Accountants (AICPA) started to look at remote testing
6 during the quarantine and received feedback from other
7 state Boards, NASBA members, and Board of Examiners
8 concerning security.

9 Mr. Berkowitz explained the proctors would be
10 assigned to candidates to monitor their actions while
11 taking the test and could actually shutdown the exam
12 if something unusual was detected. He stated AICPA
13 has invested \$ 1 million from the budget of the Board
14 of Examiners to develop software to bring along remote
15 testing, which will be in place by the fall in case
16 there was another quarantine and testing centers have
17 to be shutdown.

18 Mr. Kelly questioned whether any other profession
19 was administering an exam in this fashion.

20 Mr. Berkowitz noted no high-stakes exam has gone
21 to remote testing yet but emphasized the importance of
22 looking at other options and not putting the
23 profession on hold.

24 Ms. Fox reported other professions are looking at
25 the same thing.

1 Ms. Ericson questioned what type of security
2 measures have been discussed or proposed for remote
3 testing. She mentioned being familiar with rooms
4 without distractions, providing a visual of the entire
5 room, and not allowing any objects at the table.

6 Mr. Berkowitz mentioned a setup with Patricia
7 Hartman from NASBA, where her work station and things
8 on her desk were able to be viewed, but she would not
9 be allowed to take the exam under that scenario
10 because there were too many distractions and
11 possibilities of improprieties.

12 Mr. Berkowitz commented the AICPA invested the \$1
13 million without NASBA approval, which should have been
14 done, because the exam was a partnership between
15 Prometic, NASBA, and the AICPA.

16 Mr. Kelly expressed concern with test takers
17 cheating to pass and the security threat of pirating
18 of exam material and the ability to broadcast that
19 outside the testing environment. He stated a Zoom
20 environment was basically looking at the candidate
21 through their computer camera.

22 Mr. Berkowitz commented that maybe that was why
23 the software was being developed. He mentioned
24 discussion allowing the candidate to take the exam at
25 their workplace, but if we are under quarantine again,

1 then they are not going to be at their workplace.

2 Ms. Risler mentioned experiencing these the last
3 six months at Temple and not being a fan. She noted a
4 lot of different software and software with proctors
5 but recommended waiting to see what developed.

6 Mr. Kelly mentioned previously doing away with
7 the requirement for experience and then trying to
8 compensate for that through the exam and now trying to
9 stretch the limits of executing the exam. He could
10 not image a remote scenario that he would find
11 acceptable and would prefer taking a rest for six
12 months.

13 Mr. Berkowitz stated the future of the profession
14 was at stake and expressed the need to look at other
15 alternatives to keep the profession thriving.

16 Chanel Green, Western Governors University,
17 stated that 100% of their programs and exams are
18 online. She noted all students are required to have
19 an external camera and the exam was recorded for
20 review of the tape at a later date if there was
21 something the proctor happened to miss. She suggested
22 the Board contact folks at Western Governors
23 University.

24 Chairman Scully commented that CPAs have always
25 been in the frontline of technology and thanked Mr.

1 Berkowitz for sharing all of that information. He
2 mentioned it does seem to be the wave of the future.

3 Mr. Berkowitz wished Ms. Ellis the best.]
