2019-2020, which also permitted nonmember registered architects to participate this year. She stated that over 5 percent of their membership participated in that survey and was awaiting Board approval on the legislative agenda.

Ms. Mahrouki commented that AIA's focus would be on mandatory continuing education this year. She noted getting the farthest ever with that piece of legislation last session. The legislation made it through the House with record numbers.

Ms. Mahrouki noted that priorities such as building codes and legal reform for architects.

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Mr. Leinbach was pleased to see questions regarding energy service companies (ESCOs) and performance contracting, noting that to be a circumvention of practice of architecture. He also noted the need to focus on this issue as it moves into the bounds of unlicensed practice.

Ms. Mahrouki mentioned AIA's involvement regarding this issue, noting that the coalition was looking at the procurement code and public procurement and project delivery methods for anybody who performs Department of General Services or other public work. She discussed the ESCO issue as a huge concern moving forward since amendments to the law in 2016 regarding

ESCOs expanding their scope.] 1 2 Report of Board President 3 4 [John R. Hill, RA, President, noted the 2019 National 5 Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB) 6 Regional Summit in Nashville, TN, March 8-9. - 18 Mr. Leinbach offered to provide comments, noting
- 19 that it is largely unchanged from what the Policy
- 20 Advisory and Regional Leadership Committees reviewed
- 21 | in the fall. He stated it was intended to align with
- 22 the six areas of learning in the Architectural
- 23 Experience Program (AXP) and to create a background
- 24 quide for those who need continuing education, either
- 25 | who are pursuing licensure or have a license and need

1 to maintain continuing education for either AIA or
2 state license requirements.

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Mr. Leinbach discussed critical areas from the Policy Advisory Committee Meeting in Atlanta, including the introduction of nano learning programs. He noted his opposition to nano and commented that Dr. Robert McKinney from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette also questioned the program.

Mr. Leinbach commented that NCARB certificate holders should be given the benefit of a link with their AIA account or, in the alternative, let NCARB track continuing education credits so that upon renewing a reciprocal license, there is a clear connection as to whether the jurisdiction's requirements are being met or not.

President Hill stated that, as NCARB might be registered in multiple states, it is important that continuing education be applicable between licenses. He suggested a review of the matter and the submission of comments to NCARB on behalf of Pennsylvania's Board. The review would include an explanation of the comments to NCARB with feedback from colleagues and peers about continuing education from licensed architects.

President Hill noted April 2 as the deadline and

suggested drafting the comments for review at the next meeting.

Mr. Roller discussed the calendar of continuing education, which was a big issue in terms of the various states. He mentioned that many states are tied to the renewal dates, where it becomes exceedingly difficult to verify that the requisite number is being met within that calendar. He noted that a number of states have taken NCARB's recommendation that it be a calendar year no matter when the renewal period, which should be encouraged.

President Hill mentioned the upcoming Regional Conference and requested that Mr. Leinbach review the agenda items or key points to be addressed.

Mr. Leinbach noted the updating of the archaic language in the bylaws and rules. He discussed the required two-signature check, noting possible updates to allow electronic approval so disbursement can then take place by the executive director.

Mr. Leinbach discussed the addition of a new area regarding a change to rules or bylaws for a future symposium the organization of the committee and to provide clarification on the parameters of payment.

Mr. Leinbach mentioned the idea of Region 2 distributing a biannual press release of newsworthy

items and updating all of Region 2, both current and previous members.

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Mr. Leinbach addressed unlicensed practice and doing some type of continuing education unit (CEU) ethics seminar for interested parties within Region 2 to receive CEU health, safety, and welfare (HSW) and also to get the message out from a regulatory standpoint to members.

Mr. Leinbach discussed the election of officers from Region 2. He noted individuals self-nominating for current roles, including himself.

President Hill discussed Board initiatives

regarding outreach to PA code officials. He mentioned

having the National Architectural Accrediting Board

(NAAB) schools invited to return again in the fall.

Mr. Roller questioned whether code officials have a statewide meeting. Ms. Mahrouki explained that code officials have a conference every year in addition to participating in continuing education, especially regarding the code updates. She offered to introduce anyone or organize a meeting if the Board were interested.

Mr. Leinbach suggested a joint meeting with code officials and labor and industry because labor and industry also does code enforcement for the
