\* \* \* 1 2 State Architects Licensure Board 3 May 9, 2019 \* \* \* 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 6 Architects Licensure Board was held on Thursday, May 7 9, 2019. John R. Hill, RA, President, called the meeting to order at 9:04 a.m. 8 9 \* \* \* 10 Roll Call 11 [Roll call was taken. A quorum was noted to be 12 present.] \* \* \* 13 Introduction of Audience Members 14 15 [President Hill requested visitors identify 16 themselves.] \* \* \* 17 Pledge of Allegiance 18 19 [The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.] \* \* \* 20 [John R. Hill, RA, President, noted applications for 21 22 the Board's review and the informal conference prior 23 to the meeting for discussion during executive 24 session.] 25 \* \* \*

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Approval of minutes of the March 14, 2019 meeting 1 2 PRESIDENT HILL: 3 We can start with the approval of the 4 meeting minutes from our last meeting. 5 Has everybody had a chance to review 6 those, have any comments or corrections? 7 Hearing no changes. 8 Do I have a motion to approve the 9 minutes? 10 MR. CARNEY: 11 So moved. 12 MR. HAMM: 13 Second. 14 PRESIDENT HILL: 15 A motion and a second. All those in 16 favor? 17 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 18 19 Report of Prosecutorial Division 20 [Robert B. Armour, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison, 21 presented the Consent Agreement for File No. 18-41-2.2 010929.1 23 Mr. Armour reviewed the Office of General 24 Counsel's Mediation Program, where a mediation would 25 be conducted between the parties. He stated the Board

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would review and approve any consent agreement 1 2 reflecting the result of the mediation. Mr. Armour 3 would not consult the Board regarding mediation 4 because of his experience with working with the Board 5 in making determinations on violations. Mr. Armor introduced Tiffany Raker as a new Board 6 7 prosecutor. Ms. Raker provided a brief summary of her 8 9 professional background.] 10 \* \* \* 11 Report of Board Counsel 12 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted 13 one item for discussion during executive session. 14 Mr. Fritz requested the Board's opinion on 15 changes to the regulations draft. 16 President Hill encouraged all to carefully 17 scrutinize the regulations. He suggested discussion 18 concerning the biennial renewal period, where there 19 are 24 continuing education units required with 12 of 20 them listed in health, safety, and welfare (HSW). 21 Mr. Fritz noted that August 2018 was the last 2.2 time the Board discussed the general revisions, and 23 the language was the result of that meeting. 24 President Hill noted comments for consideration 25 to the draft architect licensure revisions from

1 Ms. O'Malley.

2	Mr. Roller reviewed licensure by reciprocity
3	general requirements § 9.61(a)(1) that reads, holds a
4	license or registration in good standing to practice
5	architecture in another state or territory and meets
6	the requirements of § 9.14(a), (b), or (c) and allows
7	the Board to follow (a), (b), or (c), which are the
8	NAAB degree, bachelor's degree, and associate degree.
9	He commented that if individuals have none of those,
10	then it falls to the 10 years.
11	Mr. Fritz requested approval from the Board.]
12	* * *
13	PRESIDENT HILL:
14	Can I hear a motion to approve the draft
15	regulations as presented by Board
16	counsel?
17	MR. CARNEY:
18	So moved.
19	MR. HAMM:
20	Second.
21	PRESIDENT HILL:

24	those in favor, say aye. Opposed?
25	[The motion carried unanimously.]

\* \* \* 1 Report of Board Counsel (cont.) 2 3 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted items for discussion in executive session. 4 Mr. Fritz noted the continuing education 5 6 legislation initiative for the Board's review. 7 President Hill noted incorporated changes to the 8 act. He noted corrections to terminologies that were 9 incorporated, so there is more consistency between the 10 act and the regulations and Section 10 regarding 11 proposed continuing education. 12 Mr. Fritz noted the need for a legislator to 13 sponsor it once completed. 14 President Hill requested the Board's thoughts on 15 the HSW hours regarding the requirement of 24 biennial hours. 16 17 Mr. Roller questioned whether the time period 18 could be made annual versus coinciding with the 19 biennial renewal in June and stated that most Boards 20 do because of the difficulty in reciprocal licensure. 21 He explained the difficulty with correcting the number 2.2 of credits within the right time period for various 23 licenses since various states renew at different 24 times. He also believed that NCARB had recommended 25 that all of the continuing education requirements be

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on an annual basis. He suggested continuing education 1 2 requirements should be on a calendar year basis before 3 the biennial renewal. Mr. Fritz will rearrange the language. 4 Mr. Carney stated that this would be keeping in 5 6 line with the Governor's reducing regulatory oversight 7 that is unnecessary and does not add value to the life, safety, and health of the Commonwealth. 8 Mr. Roller also stated that it facilitates 9 10 Pennsylvania practitioners in practicing elsewhere in 11 the country.] \* \* \* 12 PRESIDENT HILL: 13 14 Can I hear a motion to approve the 15 continuing education legislation as 16 amended as presented to the Board today. 17 MR. ROLLER: So moved. 18 19 MR. CARNEY: 20 Second. 21 PRESIDENT HILL: 22 Anymore discussion on the item? If not, 23 all those in favor, say aye. Opposed? 24 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 25

Report of Board Counsel (Continued) 1 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted 2 3 definitions for electronic seal in the legislative 4 initiative. He is working on electronic seal 5 regulation for engineering first and will later match 6 it up with the other Boards.] \* \* \* 7 8 Applications 9 [John R. Hill, RA, President, noted reciprocal 10 applications, Architect Registration Examination (ARE) 11 approval application, and an ARE testing 12 accommodations requests for review during executive session.] 13 14 \* \* \* 15 Report of Acting Commissioner - No Report \* \* \* 16 Report of Board President 17 18 [President Hill noted the 2019 NCARB Annual Meeting 19 June 19-23 in Washington, DC. Ms. Li stated that 20 funding is available for those attending. 21 President Hill noted the centennial celebration, 22 business agenda, and workshop sessions for the 23 meeting. 24 President Hill noted NCARB ARE candidate 25 approvals for discussion during executive session.

President Hill addressed Board initiatives, 1 2 noting to continue to push on the outreach to the PA 3 code officials. He noted AIA PA sent contact 4 information. He suggested Board members coordinate 5 among themselves in pushing that forward and requested ideas and key points to send back. 6 7 President Hill noted the newsletter draft and thanked Mr. Roller for his efforts. 8 9 Mr. Roller suggested the newsletter be generated 10 as a single document. He also suggested the addition 11 of an announcement regarding renewals. 12 Mr. Fritz will ask the commissioner's office to 13 put it in PDF. 14 President Hill addressed the NCARB correspondence 15 for the Board's review. 16 President Hill noted an invitation by Mr. Lopez 17 of the New York Board to attend the 2019 Tri-State 18 Design Conference for AIA New Jersey, AIA New York 19 State, and AIA Pennsylvania October 17-19 in Albany, 20 NY. He encouraged anyone who would be available to 21 attend and represent the Board in talking about the 22 licensure process for Pennsylvania.] 23 \* \* \* 24 Report of Board Administrator - No Report \* \* \* 25

1 Public Session

2 [Stephen M. Swarney, JD, Executive Director, AIA PA, 3 noted that Amal Mahrouki is spending the day with 4 Senator Argall teaching high school students the ins 5 and outs of government.

6 Mr. Swarney also noted that Bruce Johnson went to 7 the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs 8 (BPOA) to test the Pennsylvania Licensing System 9 (PALS) regarding renewals and will be discussing those 10 issues at the next meeting.

11 Mr. Swarney addressed the mandatory continuing education (MCE) bill, stating that AIA's Government 12 13 Affairs Committee is looking at it. He commented that 14 the minority leaders of the House Professional 15 Licensure Committee were astounded that the Board does not have continuing education. He stated that AIA was 16 17 holding off for national to put out their model and 18 wanted and alignment with NCARB. He mentioned that 19 AIA has been successful in getting some bills passed 20 and introduced.

Mr. Swarney mentioned Architects Action
Day on June 11 and invited Board members to the
legislative reception on June 10, 2019, from 5:00 p.m.
to 7:00 p.m. at the lieutenant governor's balcony in
the Capitol. He noted issues to focus on high-

1 performance buildings, school safety and construction, 2 historic preservation, mandatory continuing education, 3 and licensure law updates.

Mr. Swarney stated that AIA continues to track legislative exemptions to the Uniform Commercial Code (UCC), dealing with farms and historic agricultural buildings.

8 Mr. Swarney noted a big push on historic tax 9 credit expansions and extensions and the hope to 10 improve the Separations Act. He also noted the 11 Annual AIA Large States Conference in Pittsburgh this 12 September and the AIA Tri-States Architectural 13 Conference in Albany, NY, October 16-19.

Mr. Swarney mentioned that House Bill 1172 just passed out of the House Professional Licensure Committee. He commented that it is a bipartisan bill aimed at helping military spouses with reciprocity, noting Representative David Hickernell as the primary sponsor.

20 Mr. Swarney addressed House Bill 64 sponsored by 21 Representative Harry Readshaw regarding CE carryover. 22 He stated that Ms. Mahrouki looked into whether the 23 Board could establish continuing education in that 24 bill, noting there was not a warm reception to the 25 idea by the Chair. He stated that AIA will continue

to look for a way to get that done. 1 2 President Hill questioned whether there is an 3 update from the PA Department of Education regarding 4 the Planning and Construction Workbook (PlanCon). 5 Mr. Swarney stated that AIA continues to ally with the Pennsylvania School Boards Association, but 6 7 there is no update. He noted that AIA is hopeful because of the positive stories with some of the 8 9 income surpluses that the government is experiencing. \* \* \* 10 11 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 12 10:02 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session with C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, for 13 14 the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial 15 deliberations. The Board returned to open session at 11:02 a.m.] 16 \* \* \* 17 18 MOTIONS 19 MR.
