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   [Mark Zogby, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, discussed the
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   interstate crime reporting system, including the
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   system known as JNET. He noted fines imposed upon
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   applicants with reciprocal licenses for failure to
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   disclose crimes on their applications. It was noted
   the Act 48 Schedule was on the Board's website for
   reference.1
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   Matters for Discussion
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   Draft License Requirements Revision
   [Ariel O'Malley, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the
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   Board's prior discussion with regard to including
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   information on the Mutual Recognition Agreement (MRA)
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   in Section 9.41(a)(1). She noted in the Draft License
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   Requirements Revision under the General Rules, a
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   sentence was added at the end of Section (a)(1)
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   indicating the Board reserves the right to accept
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   qualifying education utilized to obtain licensure in a
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   jurisdiction that is part of an MRA.
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Mr. Leinbach questioned whether or not to include a Canadian Architectural Certification Board (CACB) accredited professional degree program. He commented that the current requirement should be left in place.

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Mr. Carney stated the MRA language was perfect

and "it's fine to remove the CACB."

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Ms. O'Malley commented that more clarifying language could be included with regard to the use of semi colons and and/or. Mr. Leinbach referred to 9.61 (b) for further discussion and suggested additional clarification may be needed.

There was discussion concerning the removal of 9.41 (e) as previously suggested by Mr. Roller. Education eligibility requirements were discussed.

The Board referred to the Integrated Path to Architectural Licensure Program or IPAL, which is an option within a National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB)-accredited program that provides students with the opportunity to complete requirements for licensure while earning a degree.

Mr. Carney volunteered to meet with Rachel and Alan to draft language for the Board to consider pertaining to when an applicant can sit for the exam. Board members were asked to review the revisions and make any comments regarding the same. Ms. O'Malley noted the Board may be able to review an exposure draft at the next meeting if the language issues are resolved. Mr. Hill suggested that members email comments by June 10, 2018.

Mr. Leinbach referred Board members to Section

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9.62(b), which states that an applicant who has passed the ARE on or after 1992 shall submit certification of having met the training requirements for IDP. It was suggested that the AXP also be included as in other areas. Mr. Leinbach referred to Section 92.7 for further discussion regarding inactive records.

Ms. O'Malley will add a definition for inactive records, that it is an incomplete application that has not yet been "greenlighted" to take the examination.

Mr. Roller suggested that language be drafted by the June 10, 2018 deadline that authorizes the Board to reserve its discretion to accept IPAL without waiting for NCARB approval, which is a two-year process. Ms. O'Malley will make the requested revisions and provide a draft to the Board as soon as possible.]
