3 \* \* \* 1 2 State Board of Auctioneer Examiners 3 July 8, 2019 \* \* \* 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 6 Board of Auctioneer Examiners was held on Monday, 7 July 8, 2019. Nevin B. Rentzel, Chairman, 8 Professional Member, called the meeting to order at 9 9:03 a.m. 10 \* \* \* Introduction of Audience 11 12 [Chairman Rentzel requested a moment of silence. He 13 also requested the introduction of the audience in 14 attendance.] \* \* \* 15 16 Approval of minutes of the March 11, 2019 meeting 17 CHAIRMAN RENTZEL: We have all been emailed the minutes 18 19 from our last meeting. 20 [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.] 21 CHAIRMAN RENTZEL: 22 Do I have a motion, otherwise, to accept 23 the minutes? 24 MR. RADER: 25 So moved.

4 MR. HOSTETTER: 1 2 Second. 3 CHAIRMAN RENTZEL: 4 All those in favor, give their consent 5 by saying aye. Opposed? 6 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 7 Prosecution Division Presentation 8 9 [Carolyn A. DeLaurentis, Esquire, Deputy Chief Counsel, Prosecution Division, introduced herself and 10 11 provided a brief summary of her professional 12 background. 13 Ms. DeLaurentis addressed the prosecution 14 division statistics for the Auctioneer Board, noting 15 51 open cases for FY 2018-2019 and 73 open cases as of 16 July 1, 2019. Ms. DeLaurentis discussed statistics on 17 18 enforcement actions during the FY 2018-2019, where 19 19 warning letters were distributed, 1 revocation, 2 20 suspensions, various administrative closings and other 21 closings. 2.2 Ms. DeLaurentis addressed immediate temporary 23 suspensions, where a license can be immediately 24 removed if there is immediate danger to the health and 25 safety of the public.

Ms. DeLaurentis stated there were 11,359 open cases in general. She noted 1,500 more cases than the year before. The staff is working on a balance of managing the workload upon arrival.

5 Ms. DeLaurentis mentioned the Pennsylvania Justice Network (JNET) for all of the Boards and 6 7 licensees in the Commonwealth that notifies the prosecution division of arrests, convictions, and 8 9 sentences on a case. She noted that two 10 administrative assistants process the information 11 received in a queue, which is distributed to the 12 appropriate Boards.

Ms. DeLaurentis stated the prosecution division receives e-Alerts upon convictions and sentencing, because an arrest is not an actionable event for the Board unless there is a requirement for an immediate temporary suspension. She commented that the division is more focused on convictions.

Ms. DeLaurentis explained warning letters as a reminder to a licensee of the statutes that apply to their licenses.

Ms. DeLaurentis addressed the Office of General Counsel's Mediation Program, where a neutral mediator works with both sides to reach an agreement at no She noted the program to be optional and both

6 sides must agree to the mediation. 1 Ms. DeLaurentis introduced J. Karl Geschwindt, 2 3 Esquire, as the new Board prosecution liaison. Mr. 4 Geschwindt provided a brief summary of his 5 professional background.] \* \* \* 6 7 Report of Board Counsel 8 [Nevin B. Rentzel, Chairman, Professional Member, noted an application hearing at 10:00 a.m. He also 9 10 noted the auctioneer reciprocity application for 11 discussion during Executive Session. 12 Mr. Suter, Esquire, Board Counsel, reviewed the 13 Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs Recusal Guidelines and the need for Board member 14 15 recusal to avoid any potential conflict or appearance 16 of conflict. 17 Mr. Suter provided an overview of mandatory, 18 strongly suggested, discretionary, and uncertain areas 19 for the Board. 20 Mr. Suter also provided guidelines regarding the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act for the Board's review. He 21 22 commented that agenda items are advertised for the 23 public's participation in order to hear the 24 developments of the Board. He stated the meetings are 25 open except for Executive Session.

Mr. Suter discussed exceptions to the Sunshine 1 2 Act that include seeking legal advice, consent 3 agreements, and personnel issues that are to be discussed in Executive Session. He noted that 4 5 official actions of the Board must be voted on in 6 public. 7 Chairman Rentzel noted agenda items 4, 5, 6, 9, 8 and 10 for discussion during executive session.] 9 \* \* \* 10 Report of Board Chairman - No Report \* \* \* 11 Report of Acting Commissioner - No Report 12 13 \* \* \* Miscellaneous 14 15 [Terrie Kocher, Board Administrator, noted the remaining upcoming 2019 meeting dates for the Board's 16 17 review.] \* \* \* 18 19 Report of Board Administrator 20 [Terrie Kocher, Board Administrator, informed those 21 who received a notice for workplace training that the 2.2 personal email received to check pa.gov was to advise 23 the member that the training was not mandatory. 24 Ms. Kocher addressed appointments, noting that 25 she had not received any updates.
