3 * * * 1 2 State Board of Auctioneer Examiners 3 September 11, 2017 * * * 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Board of Auctioneer Examiners was held on Monday, 6 7 September 11, 2017. Sherman E. Hostetter Jr., 8 Chairman, called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m. 9 Roll call was taken followed by a moment of silence. 10 A quorum was noted to be present. 11 Kathryn L. Waters, Deputy Commissioner of 12 Professional and Occupational Affairs, was not present 13 at the commencement of the meeting. * * * 14 15 Approval of Minutes of the July 10, 2017 meeting 16 [The Board discussed corrections to the Minutes.] 17 CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: 18 I need a motion to approve, including an 19 amendment to page 12, noting the second. 20 MR. TRACE: 21 I so move. 22 CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: 23 Okay. Dan Trace moves. 24 MR. RADER: 25 Second.

4 1 CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: 2 We have a second. Any discussion? We 3 have an amendment to fix page 12, the second for the adjournment. Any other 4 5 discussion? All those in favor, signify 6 by saying aye? Those opposed, same 7 sign? 8 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 9 10 Appointments 11 [Chairman Hostetter noted two appointments, he and Mr. 12 Rentzel, and further noted the need for public 13 members.1 14 * * * 15 Report of Board Counsel 16 [Maria Battista, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted an 17 Application for Stay/Supersedeas Request and two 18 Adjudications and Orders to be discussed during 19 Executive Session. 20 Ms. Battista also noted the status of cases and 21 an Order to Show Cause for discussion during Executive 2.2 Session. 23 George A. Michak, Esquire, provided a statement 24 regarding not filing a Motion.] * * * 25

5 [Kathryn L. Waters, Deputy Commissioner, entered the 1 2 meeting at 9:11 a.m. and exited at 9:12 a.m.] * * * 3 4 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, 5 the Board entered into Executive Session with Maria 6 Battista, Esquire, and Thomas Blackburn, Esquire, at 7 9:14 a.m. for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on matters that are currently pending 8 9 before the Board. The Board returned to open session 10 at 9:25 a.m.1 * * * 11 12 MOTIONS 13 MS. BATTISTA: The Board met in Executive Session to 14 15 conduct guasi-judicial deliberations on 16 a matter that was scheduled for oral argument this morning in the matter of a 17 18 Citation Issued to Charles Preston 19 Mowry; Citation No. 59313, File No. 13-20 64 - 09313. 21 I took into consideration the oral 2.2 motion by Counsel for Mr. Mowry, Mr. 23 Michak, regarding a continuance of the 24 oral arguments to the next Board meeting 25 in November, which I believe is November

6 13, 2017. Present for those discussions 1 2 was the supervising Board Counsel, Mr. 3 Blackburn for that Executive Session. At this time, I recommend that the 4 5 Board grant the oral motion of Mr. 6 Michak in the matter of the Citation 7 Issued to Charles Preston Mowry at 8 Docket No. 59313-64-16 and Citation No. 9 59313, File No. 13-64-09313, to be 10 continued to the next Board meeting. CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: 11 12 We have a motion? MR. TRACE: 13 I'll make a motion. 14 15 MR. RADER: 16 Second. 17 CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: 18 Okay. Gerald second it. Any 19 discussion? Hearing no discussion. He noted additional 8 matters for discussion in Executive Session and 9 offered to answer Board questions regarding those 10 11 matters.] * * * 12 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, 13 14 the Board entered into Executive Session with Maria 15 Battista, Esquire, at 9:29 a.m. for the purpose of 16 conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on matters 17 that are currently pending before the Board. The 18 Board returned to open session at 9:48 a.m.] * * * 19 20 MS. BATTISTA: 21 The Board met in Executive Session to 22 discuss the Bureau of Professional and 23 Occupational Affairs vs. Erin Groff, 24 Docket No. 0682-64-14, File No. 12-64-25 07005. The Respondent's Counsel filled

8 out an Application for Stay/Supersedeas 1 2 pending judicial review. 3 [Mr. Michak answered questions from Board members on 4 the matter.] * * * 5 6 Report of Board Counsel (Continued) 7 [Maria Battista, Esquire, Board Counsel, stated Group B Schools will be discussed in Executive Session and 8 9 Public Session. Ms. Battista also addressed 10 correspondence from the Alabama State Board of 11 Auctioneers regarding a revised reciprocal agreement.] * * * 12 13 Report of Board Chairman 14 [Chairman Hostetter distributed materials from his 15 attendance at the National Auctioneers Association 16 (NAA) Convention.] * * * 17 18 Report of Deputy Commissioner - No Report * * * 19 20 Report of Board Administrator 21 [Terrie Kocher, Board Administrator, reminded Board 22 members that the hotel tax exempt form needs to be 23 presented at time of check-in. 24 Ms. Kocher addressed Board members regarding 25 upcoming November reappointments.]

9 1 MR. RENTZEL 2 I'll make the motion that, in the 3 absence of Sherm Hostetter due to non-4 reappointment, Dan would assume duties 5 as Acting Chairman and as the review of 6 reciprocal licensees. 7 MR. RADER: I'll second that motion. 8 9 CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: 10 Any discussion on the motion? Hearing 11 none. All those in favor of the motion, 12 signify by saying aye. Those opposed, 13 same sign. 14 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 15 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, 16 17 the Board entered into Executive Session with Maria 18 Battista, Esquire, at 9:59 a.m. for the purpose of 19 conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on matters 20 about which the Board is about to vote. The Board returned to open session at 10:59 a.m.] 21 * * * 22 23 MOTIONS 2.4 MS. BATTISTA: 25 Based on discussions in Executive

12 vs. Richard James Townsend & Kist 1 2 Auction Company, Respondents; Docket 3 Nos. 0332-64-12 and 1164-64-12, File Nos. 09-64-11117 and 12-64-05942. 4 MR. RADER: 5 6 I make a motion. 7 MR. TROUTMAN: 8 Second. 9 CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: 10 We have a motion and a second. Anv 11 discussion? All those in favor of the 12 motion, signify by saying aye. Those 13 opposed, same sign. 14 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 15 16 Report of Board Counsel - Group B School 17 [Maria Battista, Esquire, Board Counsel, discussed 18 Group A and Group B Schools. Ms. Battista noted the 19 statute in the Section 2 definition section. There 20 are currently two different types of auction schools. 21 She noted Section 1.11 approved course of study. 22 Group A requires a minimum of 20 credit hours on 23 instructional areas. The Group B auction school would 24 provide for the Board offering a course of study in 25 auctioneering in the auction industry approved with

the completion of something less than 20 credit hours. 1 2 The statute states Group B schools cannot exist 3 until the appropriate criteria is established and 4 regulations will ultimately be drafted. 5 Ms. Battista noted the existence of three schools 6 qualified as Group A schools. Section 3(e)(3) 7 explains that Group B schools have less than 20 8 credits along with a year apprenticeship. An 9 individual may sit for the exam after completing a 10 Group B course and an apprenticeship as a licensed 11 auctioneer for a period of not less than one year. 12 Mr. Hostetter will contact Reppert Auction 13 School, World Wide College of Auctioning, and Missouri 14 Auction School to obtain a course curriculum for 15 review by the Board at its November meeting. 16 Mr. Rader will draft a curriculum summary to be 17 completed in the spring.] * * * 18 19 Auction Company License/Application - Sole 20 Proprietorship [Maria Battista, Esquire, Board Counsel, discussed the 21 22 draft auction company license application. She noted 23 the definition of legally recognized entity in the 24 statute as a partnership, association, corporation, a 25 limited liability company, or any other entity

1	recognized under the laws of this Commonwealth or any
2	other state. She also noted the definition of an
3	auction company, which changed in September. The
4	first couple words says a legally recognized entity
5	that sells or attempts to sell, etc., has to have a
6	license. So the issue with sole proprietorship is the
7	old law. The one section was repealed noting an
8	auctioneer does not need an auction company license if
9	they are a sole proprietor. Only sole proprietors
10	that do not have any other license and individuals
11	working for them for an auctioneer record have to have
12	an auction company license. There could be as many
13	employees as desired.
14	Ms Battista explained that based on this new

Ms. Battista explained that based on this new 14 15 definition, the only entity that is allowed to have an 16 auction company license is a legally recognized 17 entity, which does not include sole proprietorship. 18 Mr. Rentzel explained as an auctioneer that he is 19 the sole proprietor and does not have an auction 20 company license. His license is sufficient unless he 21 goes by auctioneers and has employees working for him. 22 Ms. Battista addressed LLC, out-of-state LLC, 23 general partnership, limited partnership, professional 24 associations, and sole proprietorship. A non-sole 25 proprietor, based on the strict reading of the

1	statute, is not a legally recognized entity.		
2	The old law allowed an unlicensed auctioneer to have		
3	the auction company license as an individual.		
4	Mr. Blackburn reviewed the General Assembly's		
5	intent. When the General Assembly was considering the		
6	bill that later passed, a number of its committees		
7	conducted an analysis of the bill. In their memos,		
8	both the house and senate believed that the amendments		
9	being proposed would eliminate all licensure of sole		
10	proprietors, very clearly for licensed auctioneers,		
11	but also for unlicensed auctioneers who would		
12	otherwise operate an auction company as a sole		
13	proprietor.		
14	Mr. Blackburn stated a licensed auctioneer must		
15	keep running their business as a sole proprietor.		
16	A non-licensed auctioneer with a licensed auction		
17	company as a sole proprietor must form an LLC,		
18	corporation, or partnership. The LLC must be licensed		
19	as an auction company, so that there is an entity that		
20	is directly licensed by the Board.		
21	Ms. Battista suggested sending a letter before		
22	the next renewal period to inform any unlicensed		
23	auctioneers wanting to become LLC of the need to		
24	provide a certificate of an organization and a copy of		
25	the operating agreement. The operating agreement

would identify the managing members, the percentage of 1 2 ownership, and the fictitious name if the fictitious 3 name is different than the LLC. 4 Ms. Battista will change the draft and take off 5 individual or owner. The law does not provide for an 6 individual owner. 7 Ms. Kocher noted the original language of the draft, and the Board members decided to further review 8 9 the matter at its next meeting.] 10 * * * 11 Alabama State Board of Auctioneers revised Reciprocal 12 Agreement 13 [Maria Battista, Esquire, Board Counsel, discussed a 14 revised reciprocal agreement with Alabama. She 15 reviewed the additions and requirements regarding 16 continuing education.] 17 MS. BATTISTA: 18 Pursuant to the review of the memorandum sent from the Alabama State Board of 19 20 Auctioneers on June 26, 2017, following 21 up from a prior memorandum of January 3, 22 2017, and the Alabama Board wishing this 23 Board to consider its revised agreement 24 for reciprocity between the state of 25 Pennsylvania and the state of Alabama, I

recommend the Board agree and adopt that 1 2 this is okay as written and to allow the 3 Board Administrator, Terrie Kocher, to 4 sign it and send it back to the Alabama 5 Board. 6 MR. TRACE: 7 So moved. 8 MR. RADER: 9 Second. 10 CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: 11 Hearing the motion. Any discussion? 12 Hearing none. All those in favor of the 13 motion, signify by saying aye. Those 14 opposed, same sign. 15 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 16 17 Miscellaneous 18 [Chairman Hostetter noted the next State Board of 19 Auctioneer Examiners meeting to be scheduled for 20 November 13, 2017.] 21 * * * 22 Adjournment 23 CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: 24 Hearing nothing else, I'll make the 25 motion to adjourn.

MR. RADER: So moved. CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: And we need a second. MR. TRACE: Second. CHAIRMAN HOSTETTER: We have a motion and a second. All those in favor, signify by saying aye. Those opposed, same sign? [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * [There being no further business, the State Board of Auctioneer Examiners meeting adjourned at 12:31 p.m.] * * *
