Mr. Suter explained that while the report as compiled by an administrative assistant in the Professional Compliance Office provides information on cases to be presented, it is not 100 percent accurate. He reminded Board members that familiar names on the report should bring to mind the recusal guidelines.

Mr. Suter commenced the drafting of the Citation Schedule in terms of the Civil Penalties. He will provide a comprehensive Act 48 Citation Schedule Amendment separate and apart of the Act 88 amendments.

Chairman Hostetter requested a breakdown of licensees and apprentice categories.

There was discussion regarding a licensing increase in 2021. It was noted the Budget Office will provide additional information. Mr. Suter suggested the Board start discussions with regard to amending the existing language regarding the matter.

George Michak commented on a provision added in the Act in 2008 that stated that the fees for trading assistants were controlled by statute. In 2016, that provision was removed and now the Board has the ability to set licensing fees for trading assistants. The Board further discussed the matter.

School program in the existing regulation was defined
but reworded. He noted new language with regard to
the Group B Auction Schools. He asked for the Board's
input the language regarding course credits. Chairman
Hostetter suggested a breakdown of class categories in
terms of hours. There was further discussion
concerning types of additional categories and the
minimum number of hours for each category.

Chairman Hostetter suggested six categories, including law, marketing, bid calling/public speaking, internet/technology, general business and real estate/personal property. There was further discussion regarding each category.

Mr. Michak suggested the Board address in the regulations the difference between the Group A and Group B Schools, which is that Group B Schools still have a one-year apprenticeship requirement and the Group A Schools have a practicum requirement.

Chairman Hostetter suggested placing the
