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Chairman Christopher noted a significant focus on education. He commented that cosmetologists outnumber

10 barbers in some cases up to 10 to 1.

Chairman Christopher also mentioned a review of the bylaws of the National Association of Barber Boards and the finalization of the policies and procedures. He discussed different state governing bodies, where Boards have inspectors who only inspect barbershops, salons, and schools. He mentioned that some states have a combined license for barbers and cosmetologists.

Chairman Christopher noted the interest of other states to reform their laws concerning reciprocity.

He stated the National Association of Barber Boards of America (NABBA) will support the Board regarding educating Governor Wolf as to the Board's position on the Executive Order.
