programs, noting that a complaint filed against an appraiser is public in many states. He explained that every complaint must be dismissed by the Board or acted upon by the Board in a public manner.

Mr. Michalowski stated Alabama provided enlightenment with respect to moving toward more remedial education. Mr. Michalowski will provide a presentation of additional information in February.]

 - Ms. Wolfgang stated the ASC published the final rule to implement collection and transmission of the annual Appraisal Management Company (AMC) registry fees. She stated the states have until June 4, 2020, to begin collecting registry fees and registering AMCs

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on the national registry.

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Ms. Wolfgang noted the October 2017 Appraisal Subcommittees (ASC) follow-up review concerning the progress in the three areas of noncompliance identified in May 2016.

Ms. Wolfgang referred to the letter from Real Estate Valuation Advocacy Association (REVAA) regarding the AMC regulations for the Board's information.

Ms. Wolfgang addressed the redline comparison of existing versus proposed policy statements and discussed major changes with the AMC and AMC registry.

Ms. Wolfgang referred to the attached June 2017 Q&A trainee-supervisor requirements relating to the restriction of supervisory appraisers to a maximum of three trainee appraisers at one time.]
