        Ms. Adams addressed licensee population from a
22
   revenue standpoint. She reviewed FY 2016-2017 and FY
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2018-2019, noting a licensee count of 124,699 with a

recent addition of 561, making the current figure at

125,260. She reviewed FY 2014-2015, FY 2015-2016, and

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1 FY 2017-2018, noting a decrease of 11,137 licensees 2 since 2014.

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Ms. Adams stated 93% of revenue was from renewals and applications. She noted the last renewal increase was in January 2015.

Ms. Adams reviewed the categorical breakdown of administrative and legal expenses for FY 2016-2017 and FY 2017-2018, FY 2018-2019 budget, and FY 2018-2019 expenses. She noted a recent increase in expenses increased. She commented that expenses are incurred through direct cost, timesheet-based cost, and licensee-based fees.

Ms. Adams addressed revenues and expenses from FY 2016-2017, FY 2017-2018, and FY 2018-2019, noting the current budget balance. She mentioned projected expenses outweighing revenue and declining licensee population and suggested a fee increase.

Ms. Adams provided a breakdown of Board member expenses for FY 2016-2017 and FY 2017-2018, noting the budget for FY 2018-2019 that will be carried over to FY 2019-2020. She noted the current expenses figure. She commented that any excess goes back to the restricted account for the Board's use.

Ms. Adams reviewed the expenditure sheet reflecting a pictorial overview of the fluctuation in

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24 [Luke Fishel, Central Pennsylvania Literacy Council,

25 introduced herself and student, Mary Alizada.

Ms. Fishel questioned why the Board ruled against the extended time for testing through Pearson VUE.

2.0

Ms. Walter explained that individuals who apply through Pearson VUE for an extension of time must have a disability as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act. She noted the Board's discussion at the January meeting regarding an extension of time, where the sole basis was English as a second language. She stated that English as not a primary language is not a disability recognized by the Americans with Disabilities Act, and the individual could apply and pay for a translator in the necessary language.

Ms. Fishel explained that Ms. Alizada is basically fluent in English, but her speed of reading precludes trying to answer 135 questions in 135 minutes. She stated Ms. Alizada does not need an interpreter or translator for \$1,500 but requires someone to read the test to her. She requested the Board approve and allow Pearson VUE to provide her with a reader of the test.

Donna Noecker, Cosmetology Instructor, Berks

Career and Technology Center, addressed the four-year rule as being a hardship for vocational schools.

Ms. Water explained that the Board cannot give you any legal advice. The supervisor of the school

would certify the hours. She stated that the Board cannot waive the 1,250 in four consecutive years requirement because it is statutory.

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Nancy Quick, Cosmetology Instructor, Berks Career and Technology Center, questioned who to contact to get this changed. Acting Commissioner Johnson suggested contacting local representative to request flexibility in terms of interpretation for the four-year requirement. Ms. Diller also suggested speaking to the local representative or senator to change that part of the law.

Jeannie Jarvis, Manicuring Dreams by Jeannie LLC, addressed foot files that are no longer legal through the state Board. She noted that customers had the best results with the file, and it can be 100% sanitized.

Ms. Walter explained that Footlogix is similar to a metal nail file and not a metal rasp that people use during the pedicure process. She noted this to be an issue for Ms. Jarvis during a recent inspection but commented that the Board would not be able to give a legal opinion on this matter.

Ms. Jarvis stated that Footlogix is safer than other files and expressed a concern for client safety if these files can no longer be used.

Jen Navarro and John Cowan, MY SALON Suite owners, introduced themselves. Ms. Navarro addressed variance requests based on wall measurements in the salon suites. She believes the suites are in compliance with the PA State Code § 7.76 regarding floor space and would like to move forward with an inspection on the listed suites.

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Mr. Cowan stated their intent was to be compliant and provide a safe working environment for cosmetologists who are practicing in these salons as well as their clients. He believed the space requirements were met and would also provide a good safe working environment for the practitioners.

Ms. Walter commented that the Board traditionally does not and will not preapprove architectural plans for any sketches that are brought before construction begins. She noted that the onus is on the salon owner or the person building the salon to assure compliance, not only with their township codes and the construction codes but with the regulations.

Ms. Walter stated the Board has the blueprints and sketches the architectural firm provided and will consider those applications for the variance requests during executive session.

Ken McAllister, President, Suite Management

Franchising/MY SALON Suite and Salon Plaza, noted
Ratner Companies partnering with them for a total of 8
owners in the state of Pennsylvania representing 20
stores. Mr. McAllister is also an engineer and

5 believed all of the rooms meet the code of width by 6 definition.

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Mr. McAllister recommended accelerating the process, where the review is done before the construction, just like building codes. He noted that doing it at the end creates a burden, both on the owners and the stylists moving into those stores.

Chris Lammando, Gmerek Government Relations,
Inc., introduced himself and Bo Breuner, Owner, Sola
Salon Studios. Mr. Lammando stated that Sola Salon
Studios has opened more than 100 salons in the
Commonwealth. He discussed the variance requests
pertaining to MY SALON Suite, clarifying not to hinder
or block competition or new entrance to the salon
industry.

Mr. Lammando commented that the rules applied to Sola Salon Studios should be applied uniformly across the Board to all new entrants, whether it is the provisions of the cosmetology law or associated regulations. He noted his understanding of the situation and the variances as recently presented to

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the Board was new internal construction as well and could be reconfigured to meet the requirements of the law.

Mr. Lammando stated that the company was in the development of additional salons as well and moving forward with the construction of those spaces based on the requirements of the law and codes that were placed on Sola Salon Studios at the time they originally came to Pennsylvania.]
