Justin Lehman, Vice President, Jean Madeline Aveda Institute, stated no physician wants to have this position or take on this responsibility. He noted accreditation repercussions regarding the regulation and schools' inability to attach a physician.

Debbie Weidner, DeRielle Cosmetology Academy, noted that the regulation was never enforced and questioned that the regulation would pertain to anybody anymore.

Ms. Walter stated the regulation remains in effect but there has been a lack of enforcement. She stated options would be discussed during Executive Session.

Chairman Wallin noted that the regulation predates 1974.]
