7 [Kathryn L. Waters, Deputy Commissioner of 1 2 Professional and Occupational Affairs, discussed 3 Executive Order 2017-03 as signed by the Governor on 4 October 24, 2017. She explained the report will compare 5 Pennsylvania's licensure process to other states, 6 7 including examination fees, criminal background and educational requirements. She requested Board members 8 9 return the confidential survey attached to a recent 10 memo. 11 Ms. Diller asked Board members to return the 12 survey to her by the end of the meeting. 13 Deputy Commissioner Waters stated advisory groups will be formed consisting of a diversified group of 14 15 Board and Commission members to work on the statistical information.] 16 * * * 17 18 CE Research 19 [Ariel O'Malley, Esquire, Board Counsel, discussed her 20 findings on CE research by noting that only 14 states 21 in the United States require CE for any kind of 22 renewal for cosmetology. 23 Ms. O'Malley addressed the inquiry from the 24 Department of Corrections regarding Board Regulation 25 Section 7.97, relating to the protection against

infectious, contagious and communicable diseases. 1 2 Mike Gent, Curriculum Coordinator, PA Department 3 of Corrections, informed the Board of the recent 4 conversion of barber schools to cosmetology schools. 5 Mr. Gent addressed the concern of licensed cosmetologists who cannot perform a service due to an 6 7 inmate's communicable disease condition. He requested 8 advice from the Board on the situation. 9 Chairman Wallin noted a motion from a Board member would be necessary to waive the regulation 10 11 specifically for state correctional institutions to 12 permit a licensee to knowingly work on contagious and infectious disease conditions.] 13 MS. O'MALLEY: 14 15 What we would be looking for is a Motion 16 to waive the enforcement of Board 17 Regulation Section 7.97 as it applies to 18 the Department of Corrections and its 19 state correctional institutes. 20 MS.
