20 Regulation 16A-6411 Discussion

21 [Kimberly Adams, Chief of Fiscal Management, Bureau of  
22 Finance and Operations, Department of State, presented  
23 to the Board with changes Ms. Sacavage requested to  
24 the fee package that was previously approved. She  
25 addressed FY 2019-2020 revenue versus expenses, noting

1 revenue is trailing behind expenses, which prompted  
2 the fee increase discussion.

3 Ms. Adams stated the Board had 125,467 licensees  
4 as of July 12, increasing another 234 to 125,701  
5 licensees, which is showing growth and was taken into  
6 consideration when crafting the fee increase package.

7 Ms. Adams addressed Board expenses from FY 2011-  
8 2012 to the present. She mentioned total expenses for  
9 FY 2020-2021 are \$4,655,045.65 and expenses starting  
10 on July 1 are at \$23,063.05. She noted overall  
11 revenue through June 30 was \$5,256,236.78 and has  
12 increased.

13 Ms. Adams noted applicants were compared with the  
14 State Board of Barber Examiners, and the current cost  
15 of all licensee types and have readjusted it.

16 Ms. Adams noted reviewing applicants, where there  
17 would be a negative balance of \$9,541,417.03 projected  
18 for FY 2025-2026 if the Board had no increase. She  
19 commented that the Board already approved the fee  
20 package, but she wanted to tweak it based on what was  
21 done with the applications.

22 Ms. Adams reported a positive balance of \$1.6  
23 million in FY 2025-2026 by increasing renewals. She  
24 stated the Board would have one fee increase of \$15 in  
25 FY 2022-2023 and FY 2023-2024 and another \$15 fee

1 increase in FY 2024-2025 and FY 2025-2026.

2 Ms. Sacavage commented that an exposure draft for  
3 the fee increased had gone out and was approved at the  
4 September 21, 2020 meeting but revised the report to  
5 have the most up-to-date numbers in 2021.

6 Commissioner Johnson commented that it would be  
7 about a 9 percent increase over the next two biennial  
8 periods for a total of \$30 over the next four years.

9 Ms. Adams reported that the first application  
10 renewal period had no change, the second application  
11 renewal period was based on the cost to process the  
12 applications, and the third application renewal period  
13 was adjusted with a 5 percent increase.

14 Ms. Sacavage commented that other fees have not  
15 changed in this report, and the Board and staff will  
16 examine those in the future should the Board direct  
17 her to promulgate the regulations. She questions  
18 whether there will be a negligible difference in  
19 revenue should the Board make changes in the future.

20 Ms. Adams stated she cannot guesstimate fees that  
21 are a one-time fee and is basing the fees on how many  
22 cosmetologists may apply based on the past. She noted  
23 a drop in applications is going to affect the  
24 projected amount and so would an increase.]

19 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of  
20 Professional and Occupational Affairs, addressed the  
21 extension of the general waivers with respect to  
22 licensing until September 30, 2021, noting the virtual  
23 platform will continue until then.

24 Commissioner Johnson also addressed physical  
25 travel requests, noting physical travel is considered



1 up to the pre-COVID limit of two members with the rest  
2 of the Board having the option of attending virtually.  
3 He encouraged everyone to submit travel requests to  
4 the Board administrator as soon as possible so any  
5 concerns can be addressed.

6 Ms. Bruno questioned how Board members can speak  
7 to elected officials about their concerns with changes  
8 and moving forward. She also requested information  
9 regarding procedures for requesting raises.

10 Commissioner Johnson explained that per diems are  
11 set and are statutory, which would involve the general  
12 assembly, and cannot be altered at the administrative  
13 level. He stated the committees are highly attuned to  
14 Board discussions, noting four executive directors who  
15 sit with respect to the majority and minority chairs  
16 of the Senate and House Professional Licensure  
17 Committees and the Consumer Protection & Professional  
18 Licensure Committee of the Senate.

19 Ms. Bruno commented that a lot of cosmetologists  
20 reached out her who felt their voices were not heard  
21 during COVID-19. She mentioned that Board needs to  
22 have a stronger voice if another pandemic happens  
23 again.

24 Commissioner Johnson stated virtual meetings had  
25 been conducted for the past several months that were

1 as accessible and transparent as possible and provided  
2 ample opportunities for members of the public and  
3 licensees to voice their opinions.

4 Commissioner Johnson mentioned the department is  
5 raising a concern regarding the physical presence  
6 requirements because it does not allow for the same  
7 interaction the virtual space allows. He stated the  
8 general assembly is navigating all of the changes that  
9 took place and how they could safely incorporate them  
10 into the new standards. He encouraged the public to  
11 attend Board meetings to be part of the discussion and  
12 make their voices heard.

13 Ms. Bruno also mentioned their concern is the  
14 fear of shutting down again.

15 Commissioner Johnson encouraged all to have faith  
16 in the branches of government designed to deal with  
17 those issues. He noted the department was engaged in  
18 those discussions but suggested individuals  
19 communicate their concerns to the department or  
20 elected officials and step up and take a greater role  
21 in that conversation.]

24 [Cheriss Lefever, Owner, Salon Cheriss, requested more  
25 information regarding how cosmetologists could receive

1 help and guidance when it is not easy to get in touch  
2 with the Board and meetings occur every couple of  
3 months. She questioned whether there could be an open  
4 forum with the Board, where salon owners could discuss  
5 changes and get some help.

6 Ms. Sacavage thanked Ms. Lefever for her comments  
7 and encouraged her to email the Board with individual  
8 questions or concerns and invited her to continue to  
9 attend the virtual meetings. She stated the Board  
10 does not discourage anyone from forming any kind of  
11 discussion group with colleagues outside of Board  
12 meetings, but there is no public session during a  
13 Board meeting with a question and answer period.

14 Ms. Lefever commented that she is having a  
15 meeting tonight with about 8 to 10 people and attended  
16 the Board meeting to be more proactive. She reported  
17 not receiving any help from the Board until eight  
18 weeks after being opened. She recommended more Board  
19 contact and help for cosmetologists with emails.

20 Ms. Lefever addressed salon solos and questioned  
21 why barbers can rent chairs but cosmetologists cannot.  
22 She questioned whether to send an email for each issue  
23 or whether to start a petition. She requested more  
24 information on how to be more connected with the state  
25 and what is happening.

1 Ms. Sacavage stated the policy during COVID came  
2 from the Governor's Office and the Department of  
3 Health. She noted that any concerns about the statute  
4 or regulations could be communicated to their state  
5 representative or state senator. She also noted being  
6 able to contact the executive directors of the  
7 Professional Licensure Committee in the Senate and the  
8 House.

9 Ms. Sacavage stated the issues could be passed to  
10 the Board, but changes in the law go through the  
11 General Assembly. She provided information regarding  
12 contacting the committees to ask if the issue is  
13 something that is on their radar and considered before  
14 in their history. She noted the committees are a  
15 wealth of knowledge regarding changes to the law and  
16 can address questions concerning changes to the  
17 statute.

18 Ashley Herbert questioned who would provide  
19 answers for licensed cosmetologists if the Board  
20 cannot and the individual cannot afford a lawyer.

21 Ms. Sacavage stated the Board and its counsel  
22 cannot interpret the regulations or the statute or  
23 indicate how the Board may rule on a matter. She  
24 suggested individuals retain private counsel to  
25 navigate the rules and regulations and encouraged

1 everyone to review the statutes and regulations. She  
2 noted their local bar association may be able to  
3 assist those who are unable to afford legal counsel.

4 Ms. Herbert expressed concern with legal counsel  
5 interpreting the law differently, such as body waxing,  
6 where it is vague and does not give specifics.

7 Ms. Sacavage apologized for any confusion, noting  
8 the Board's website offers public notices about topics  
9 that are deemed relevant. She stated she is not in a  
10 position nor are any of the Board members to weigh in  
11 on conflicting opinions regarding the law.

12 Debbie Weidner, DeRielle Cosmetology Academy,  
13 also reported a lot of subjects are vague in the laws  
14 and regulations. She noted students want to do  
15 everything by the book and are taught to do it by the  
16 book at her school. She requested more information  
17 why the Board can answer a waxing question for one  
18 school but not her school.

19 Ms. Sacavage maintained her position that the  
20 Board cannot give any advisory opinions, which is the  
21 policy of the Department of State. She informed Ms.  
22 Weidner that she is welcome to peruse any prior  
23 adjudications and opinions by the Board, which is  
24 their medium of legal interpretation.

25 Ms. Weidner questioned whether she could get in

1 any trouble with waxing if a lawyer interprets the law  
2 as being able to wax anything on the body.

3 Ms. Sacavage stated she cannot give an  
4 interpretation or indication of how the Board would  
5 consider any legal matter.

6 Caprice questioned whether the Board set any  
7 guidelines for chemical peels that can be done in a  
8 licensed esthetic salon spa by an esthetician or a  
9 cosmetologist.

10 Ms. Sacavage noted the question to again be  
11 something where Caprice would have to refer to the  
12 Board statute and regulations or any past  
13 adjudications or opinions the Board has issued for an  
14 answer. She encouraged her to refer to the Board's  
15 website under Board laws and regulations.

16 Kayla questioned whether back facials are an  
17 approved service for a salon to offer as a licensed  
18 profession.

19 Ms. Sacavage stated some public commenters may  
20 misinterpret the parameters of public comment at the  
21 Board meeting. She explained that it was not a forum  
22 where individuals could seek legal advice, noting the  
23 Board can only refer to the Board laws and regulations  
24 that are on the Board's website. The Board does not  
25 provide advisory opinions or legal opinions and does



1 not indicate how the Board may rule on an issue.

2 Kayla questioned whether there was a lawyer the  
3 Board preferred who would be in line with the Board's  
4 thoughts on laws and regulations since there seems to  
5 be an issue regarding interpretation.

6 Ms. Sacavage stated the Board had no advice on  
7 the question.

8 Kaylee questioned whether the Board will be  
9 changing the number of hours between the barber and  
10 cosmetology license since both text books are 90  
11 percent the same.

12 Ms. Sacavage stated the Board is unable to  
13 provide any information about pending changes to any  
14 text books.

15 Ms. Sacavage noted the next Board meeting is  
16 September 20, 2021.]


