January 27, 2021

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[Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 9:11 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session with Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations. The Board returned to open session at 10:32 a.m.]

[Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, noted the meeting was being recorded, and those who remained on the call were giving their consent to be recorded.]

[Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, referred to Section 301(1) of the Crane Licensure Act, noting the requirement was waived during the COVID-19 emergency declaration from Governor Wolf on March 17, 2020, allowing videoconferences.]

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The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Board of Crane Operators was held on Wednesday, January 27, 2021. Dan R. Haulman, Chair, Professional Member,

4 called the meeting to order at 10:32 a.m. * * * 2 3 Introductions [Chair Haulman requested the introduction of the Board members, staff, and audience in attendance.] * * * 6 Approval of Minutes of November 18, 2020 meeting. CHAIR HAULMAN: Is there any discussion on the minutes 10 and if not, do we have a motion to accept 11 the minutes? 12 MR. SCHMOYER: 13 Brian Schmoyer. I will make a motion to 14 accept the minutes as presented. 15 MR. BECKER: I second that motion. 16 17 CHAIR HAULMAN: 18 All in favor the minutes being approved 19 from the November 18, meeting, please say 20 aye. Is there any opposition to that? Not hearing any opposition, the Minutes 21 22 are approved from the last meeting of 23 November 18th. 24 [The motion carried. Mr. Mauger abstained from voting 25 on the motion.]

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Report of Prosecution Division

[Carolyn DeLaurentis, Esquire, Deputy Chief of

Prosecution Division, reviewed highlights of 2020.

She noted the Prosecution Department staff had

successfully handled the challenges telework and

virtual hearings. She noted Board prosecutors made

efforts to monitor restrictions, waivers, policies and

new procedures.

Ms. DeLaurentis reported that 75 cases were opened in 2020 for the Crane Board and 51 cases closed. She noted that as of January 1, 2021, the Crane Board had 97 cases open. She thanked Mr. Tim Smith for working the New Year's weekend to pull the numbers.

Ms. DeLaurentis noted the Board's enforcement and disciplinary actions. She stated there were 6 cases which resulted in discipline, 28 warning letters, 2 cases resulting in fines, 1 case resulting in a suspension and 4 cases resulting in probation.

Ms. DeLaurentis presented overall prosecution information. She noted 44 immediate license suspensions in 2020.

Ms. DeLaurentis presented COVID-19 complaints.

She noted 1,223 COVID-19 cases were opened in 2020,

none of which were for the Crane Operators Board. Ms.

1 DeLaurentis stated that current open cases as January 1 for the entire office was 12,250. Total cases 3 opened in 2020 was 13,394 with total cases closed of 13,274.]

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Appointment - Bureau of Finance and Operations [Kimberly S. Adams, Chief of Fiscal Management, Bureau of Finance and Operations, Department of State, addressed licensee population. She noted a licensee count increase from 3,228 in 2016 to 3,534 in 2018 11 with a current count of 3,097 licensees.

Ms. Adams noted revenue by source. She reviewed categories and actual revenue, noting a biennial total with 96.3 being from percent from renewals and applications.

Ms. Adams provided a categorical breakdown of She noted the current budget and expenses. expenses.

Ms. Adams reviewed bottom line revenues and expenses for FY 2020-2021. She noted that Board revenues were currently exceeding expenses.

Ms. Adams addressed Board member expenses, noting the current budget with Board member expenses. stated any excess money not used would remain in the restricted account for the Board's use.]

1 Report of Board Counsel

Mr. Picarella addressed regulations regarding civil penalties under Act 48, BPOA Regulation 16A-7103. He presented comments made by the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC).

He noted the IRRC's first comment asked for clarification regarding the use of the civil penalty section for the offense of operating a crane without a license.

Mr. Picarella suggested adding language to the regulation that would confirm that ability to file a citation does not foreclose to the option of filing formal action.

He noted IRRC's second comment involved penalties for failing to maintain current certification. Mr. Picarelli explained his response, noting certifications can expire before licenses and some operators leave the profession or retire. He noted the Board does not discipline operators with expired

Mr. Picarelli noted the IRRC's third comment

certifications unless they actually operate a crane.

involved the use of the title "licensed crane 1 2 operator." 3 The Board discussed clarifying when an individual is allowed to hold themselves out as being able to operate a crane to protect the public. They concurred that operators trying to deceive consumers should be held accountable and should be fined. Mr. Picarelli will make changes to the regulation and bring it back to the Board for approval.] * * * 10 11 Applications 12 MR.
