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3 State Board of Crane Operators 1 November 18, 2020 2 * * * 3 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 4 Board of Crane Operators was held on Wednesday, 5 November 18, 2020. Michael A. Becker, Chair, 6 7 Professional Member, called the meeting to order at 8 10:30 a.m. 9 * * * 10 [Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, noted the meeting was being recorded, and those who 11 remained on the call were giving their consent to 12 13 being recorded.] * * * 14 15 [Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, referred to Section 301(1) of the Crane Licensure Act, 16 17 noting the requirement had been waived during the 18 COVID-19 emergency declaration from Governor Wolf on March 17, 2020, allowing videoconferences.] 19 * * * 20 21 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 22 9:00 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session 23 with Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, 24 for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial 25 deliberations on a number of matters that are

currently pending before the Board and to receive the 1 2 advice of counsel. The Board returned to open session 3 at 10:30 a.m.] * * * 4 5 Roll Call/Introductions 6 [Chair Becker requested the introduction of the Board 7 members, staff, and audience in attendance.] * * * 8 9 Approval of minutes of the September 23, 2020 meeting 10 CHAIR BECKER: 11 Next on the agenda is the approval of 12 the minutes. Could I have someone make 13 a motion for the approval of the 14 September 23 minutes? 15 [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.] CHAIR BECKER: 16 17 With those changes, do we have a motion 18 to approve the September 23 minutes? 19 MR. SCHMOYER: 20 I make a motion we approve the September 21 23 minutes. 22 MR. HAULMAN: 23 I'll second that motion. 24 CHAIR BECKER: 25 All in favor, say aye. Any who do not

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1 approve the minutes, say nay. [The motion carried. Michael Becker recused himself 2 3 from voting on the motion.] * * * 4 5 Report of Prosecutorial Division 6 [Colby B. Widdowson, Esquire, Board Prosecution 7 Liaison, presented the Consent Agreement for Case No. 8 19 - 71 - 006408.19 * * * 10 MR. PICARELLA: 11 This matter was previously discussed in 12 Executive Session this morning. 13 Based upon the presentation and discussions in Executive Session, I 14 15 believe the Board would entertain a 16 motion to accept the Consent Agreement 17 as proposed at Case No. 19-71-006408. Do we have such a motion? 18 19 MR. GOULET: 20 So moved. 21 MR. HAULMAN: I'll second the motion. 22 23 CHAIR BECKER: 24 I would like to see if we could have a 25 vote on whether we accept as proposed.

6 1 All those in favor, say aye. Opposed, 2 say nay. 3 [The motion carried unanimously. The caption in that 4 matter is the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania BPOA v. 5 Daniel M. DeAugustine, L.C.O., Case No. 19-71-006408.] * * * 6 7 Report of Board Counsel [Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, 8 9 addressed progress on regulations. He referred to 16A-7104 regarding Act 41 of 2019, noting a regulation 10 11 package was prepared and forwarded for promulgation 12 consistent with the Board's direction at the last 13 meeting. Mr. Picarella referred to 16A-7103 under Act 48 14 15 regarding citation authority, noting it continued to 16 move through the process. He stated the regulation 17 was within the 30-day public comment period, which 18 would close on November 23, 2020. He noted receiving 19 no comments on that regulation. 20 Mr. Picarella addressed prior discussion 21 regarding changing the definition of "crane" to 22 include digger derricks. He stated the definition was 23 also in the Act at Section 102, where digger derricks 24 are not cranes, and given that it was in the Act as 25 well, the definition would need to go through a

1 legislative change. He questioned whether the Board 2 would like him to pursue a legislative change to the 3 definition, so digger derricks could be used to test 4 for certification.

5 Mr. Schmoyer did not have an issue with digger 6 derricks being used as long as it could be configured 7 as a crane for practical exams. He did express 8 concerns with technology changes, manufacturer 9 equipment types, and design changes. He was also 10 concerned about drawing a line as to what would be 11 allowed to be used as a crane for practical exams.

Mr. Schmoyer commented that they are the State Board of Crane Operators, and it must be set up as a B30.5 piece of equipment according to the way the Act is written. He is concerned with what was involved in changing it and what other avenues needed to be reviewed, so it would not create an issue later.

Mr. Goulet stated additional requirements, other than the accreditation and OSHA requirements, needed to be clearly listed. He suggested continuing to review the requirement in order to be fair no matter where an individual would receive certification.

23 Mr. Picarella tabled the issue until Mr. Goulet 24 and Mr. Schmoyer examine the matter further and 25 present it at a future Board meeting.

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8 Mr. Picarella noted prior discussion in Executive 1 2 Session regarding the initial license application with 3 certification that the Board would vote on later. 4 Mr. Picarella noted that Mr. Becker, Mr. Haulman, 5 and Mr. Schmoyer will be entering USQ status as Board 6 members on December 8, 2020. He stated Mr. Haulman 7 and Mr. Schmoyer already started the reappointment process, and Mr. Becker may not be rejoining the Board 8 9 but will serve out his USQ until replaced. He also 10 noted one public member position available on the 11 Board and suggested anyone interested in the position to contact their legislators.] 12 * * * 13 14 Report of Board Chair 15 [Michael A. Becker, Chair, Professional Member, noted 16 the need for nominations and election of Board 17 officers for 2021.] * * * 18 19 MR. PICARELLA: 20 At this moment, we would open the 21 nominations to succeed Mr. Becker as 2.2 Board chair. 23 Are there any nominations? 24 MR. GOULET: 25 I would like to nominate Mr. Haulman as

9 1 Board chair. 2 MR. SCHMOYER: 3 Second that. 4 CHAIR BECKER: 5 All those in favor of Mr. Haulman becoming the 2021 Board chair, say aye. 6 7 Any opposed, say nay. 8 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 9 10 Applications MR. PICARELLA: 11 12 Based upon our discussions in Executive 13 Session, I believe the Board will 14 entertain a motion to accept the 15 Application of Marc E. Wilson to become 16 a licensed crane operator. Is there any such motion? 17 MR. HAULMAN: 18 I will make that motion that we should 19 20 accept the Application of Mr. Wilson and 21 approve him for a license. 22 MR. SCHMOYER: 23 I'll second that motion. 24 CHAIR BECKER: 25 All in favor of accepting Mr. Wilson's

10 application, say aye. Any opposed, say 1 2 nay. 3 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 4 5 Miscellaneous 6 Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted 7 tentative 2021 meeting dates for the Board's review. Ms. Li requested Board members notify her of any 8 9 issues with the meeting dates as soon as possible.] * * * 10 11 Report of Commissioner - Act 53 Discussion 12 [Cynthia K. Montgomery, Esquire, Deputy Chief 13 Counsel/Regulatory Counsel, Department of State, 14 presented to the Board to address the Act 53 list of 15 She stated Act 53 was signed into law on July crimes. 16 1, 2020, and slightly alters the way boards consider 17 criminal history record information. 18 Ms. Montgomery referred to § 3117 of Act 53, where 19 Commissioner Johnson, after consultation with the 20 licensing boards and representatives of the business 21 community with knowledge of the respective 22 professions, has the duty to publish a schedule of 23 criminal convictions that may constitute grounds to 2.4 refuse to issue; suspend; or revoke a license, 25 certificate, registration, or permit. She noted there

1 would be 29 separate lists for all of the boards and 2 commissions.

3 Ms. Montgomery referred to the Board's list of 4 crimes, stating that crimes identified by Board 5 counsel working with prosecuting attorneys as directly 6 related to the profession are marked with a number 1 7 next to the crime. She provided a definition of 8 "directly relates." She referred to § 3117, where the 9 schedule has to indicate which offenses the Board 10 deemed directly related to the profession.

11 Ms. Montgomery stated Commissioner Johnson has 12 the responsibility of publishing a notice of the 13 availability of the list of crimes and completion of 14 the schedule to be published in the *Pennsylvania* 15 *Bulletin* and on each board's website, along with 16 promulgating it as proposed rulemaking within 180 days 17 and as final rulemaking within 2 years.

18 Ms. Montgomery referred to § 3117, noting the 19 list is used by the Board for preparing preliminary 20 determinations, where individuals considering to enter 21 a particular occupation or profession could apply for 22 a preliminary determination to determine whether their 23 criminal history record information would be an 2.4 impediment to licensure. She noted the list is also 25 used in determining discipline and in determining

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whether to refuse to issue a license, certificate,
registration, or permit.

3 Ms. Montgomery noted a two-stage process and 4 referred to § 3113 regarding determining whether the 5 criminal conviction directly relates to the profession. She addressed rebuttable presumption, 6 7 where individuals convicted of crimes on the list of offenses directly related to the profession would pose 8 9 a substantial risk to the health and safety of the 10 public or a substantial risk of further criminal 11 She mentioned the applicant or licensee convictions. 12 would have to demonstrate they do not pose such a risk 13 by showing evidence set forth in § 3113(c).

Ms. Montgomery emphasized that the list is to provide transparency in the process, where individuals seeking licensure know upfront what crimes the Board believed are directly related to the profession.

Ms. Montgomery commented that Act 53 will offer a best practices guide for individuals with a criminal conviction to be able to acquire information of obtaining a license and the information needed for a hearing. She mentioned Board counsel worked with prosecuting attorneys to review the crime codes, the statute, and Act 53.

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Ms. Montgomery addressed items listed with a

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number 2 next to the crime and referred to § 3113(e) 1 2 regarding acts of violence. She stated an individual 3 may receive a license if it has been at least 3 years 4 from incarceration or 3 years from imposition of the 5 sentence, the individual has remained conviction-free, 6 and demonstrates significant rehabilitation.

7 Ms. Montgomery stated the Board would need to use the factors provided in § 3113(c) and perform an 8 9 individualized assessment to determine licensure of the individual. 10

11 Ms. Montgomery explained that a crime could come 12 before the Board if it is on the list, and it does not 13 mean the prosecution division could not bring it to the Board's attention if it is not on the list. 14 She 15 noted crimes of violence as set forth in § 3113(e) and crimes identified by Board counsel and the prosecution 16 17 division as those that directly relate to the crane 18 operator profession.

19 Ms. Montgomery requested Board members review the 20 list of crimes to see whether they agree the items on 21 the list identified with a number 1 are directly 22 related to the crane operator profession and would 23 constitute grounds for denial of a license and whether 2.4 the Board has any additions or deletions. 25

Ms. Montgomery noted the list was sent to

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interested parties and stakeholders but did not
receive any written comments. She offered attendees
at the meeting to provide comments.
Commissioner Johnson appreciated Ms. Montgomery's

5 comprehensive overview of Act 53 and offered to 6 address any specific questions from the Board.

7 Ms. Montgomery also offered to answer any 8 questions concerning Act 53 but deferred to Board 9 counsel with any questions regarding specific crimes 10 on the list.

11 Mr. Picarella noted Commissioner Johnson has the 12 duty to continually modify the lists as necessary, 13 informing the Board that the list could be changed in 14 future if they wish to do so.

15 Ms. Montgomery emphasized that just because a 16 crime did not appear on the list did not mean the 17 Board would not see it. She commented that crimes 18 were being identified by virtue of a conviction of 19 that crime representing that the individual would pose 20 a substantial risk to the public or substantial risk 21 of further criminal convictions, where the criminal 2.2 conduct has a direct bearing on the fitness or ability 23 to perform duties and functions of a crane operator. Commissioner Johnson stated future iterations of 24 25 the list would essentially be wrapped into the formal

regulatory process. He commented that future 1 2 additions or statutory changes would involve the 3 formal regulatory process. 4 Mr. Widdowson addressed disciplining current 5 licensees and requested the Board consider identifying 6 the crimes of violence that have been identified by a 7 number 2 on the list to identify some or all of those 8 crimes of violence as being directly related to the 9 practice of the profession. 10 Mr. Widdowson stated it was prosecution's 11 position that some of those offenses are directly 12 related to the practice of the profession and should 13 be identified as such. He also requested that the 14 crimes be identified as directly related to avoid any 15 questions in the future as to whether or not the 16 crimes are directly related.] * * * 17 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 18 19 I would humbly ask the Board to raise 20 the motion to accept this list as 21 presented for publication at the Board's 2.2 earliest convenience so that we may 23 begin the formal promulgation of a 24 regulatory package. 25 MR. PICARELLA:

16 Would any Board member like to make that 1 2 motion? 3 MR. SCHMOYER: 4 I'll make the motion that we approve the 5 list as presented for publication. 6 CHAIR BECKER: 7 I'll second that motion. 8 MR. PICARELLA: 9 We had a motion and a second. Is there any discussion on that? 10 11 [The Board discussed the motion.] 12 MR. PICARELLA: 13 At this point, we are back to the 14 original motion. There was a first and 15 a second to adopt this as stated for 16 publication. 17 Mr. Becker, would you call for a vote on that? 18 19 CHAIR BECKER: 20 We had a first and a second as adopting 21 it as stated. All in favor, say aye. 22 Any opposed, say nay. 23 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 24 25 [Commissioner Johnson thanked the Board for

consideration and allowing the presentation. 1 He also thanked Board counsel, Deputy Chief Counsel 2 3 Montgomery, and the prosecutorial division for all of 4 their work regarding curating the list. He commented 5 that he would put the list in to ensure publication 6 before December 26.] 7 * * * 8 Adjournment 9 CHAIR BECKER: 10 Could I please get a motion to adjourn 11 the November 18, 2020 meeting of the 12 State Board of Crane Operators? 13 MR. SCHMOYER: 14 I make a motion to adjourn. 15 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 16 Second. 17 CHAIR BECKER: 18 All those who approve, say aye. 19 Opposed, say nay. 20 [The motion carried unanimously.] 21 * * * 22 [The State Board of Crane Operators Meeting adjourned 23 at 11:34 a.m.] * * * 24 25
