5 | [Kerry E. Maloney, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted one

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Mr. Maloney discussed Act 6 of 2018, formerly SB 354, as well as the three regulation packages that were combined into one. He also mentioned that a possible addition to that regulation would be to combine four into one. Mr. Maloney will provide a copy of the Annex to Board members. Board counsel and regulatory counsel will review and answer questions and comments received from the Office of General Counsel.

Mr. Maloney suggested that Board members should raise questions or concerns about a bill at Board meetings, then Board Counsel may analyze and address the bill.

There was discussion regarding Senate Bill 354 as it pertains to expungements.

Mr. Maloney and the Board discussed the meaning of a summary offense, which may include violations

such as a citation, traffic ticket, and disorderly conduct matters, as well as the 30-day reporting requirement with regard to those summary offenses.]

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5 Report of Board Chairperson

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[John E. DeFinnis, D.D.S., reported on his recent attendance at the American Association of Dental Boards Meeting in Atlanta, Georgia.

Dr. DeFinnis summarized the meeting by noting that the President of the ADA, Dr. Gary Roberts, discussed license portability and the Objectivity, Structure and Clinical Exam (OSCE) for 2020. He also noted discussion related to anesthesia regulations and morbidity rates, training competency, importance of (Body Mass Index) BMI, capnography, good medical history and mock drills.

Dr. DeFinnis referred to the mention of the Sunset Bill by a Texas lawyer that allows outsiders to review anesthesia data. Specialty recognition was also discussed.

Dr. DeFinnis further noted presentations pertaining to the future of dentistry and education, opioid use, and the scope of hygienists.

Dr. DeFinnis stated the next American Association of Dental Boards Meeting will be held April 22 and 23,

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2018, in Chicago, Illinois.
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The sharing of this information through
newsletters was suggested to be useful. A regulation
concerning opioid prescriptions and a new curriculum
for schools that would address in-depth treatment and
prescribing of opioids was discussed. It was noted
the regulation would affect six boards including
nursing, podiatry, medical, osteopathic, dentistry and
optometry.]

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11 [Dr. Matta exited the meeting at 10:04 a.m. and re12 entered at 10:06 a.m.]

[There was dialogue related to dental schools reporting to the Board as once used to be the trend. There was also mention of the Board traveling to schools to conduct its Board meetings. The travel bans would need to be considered to continue the meetings at schools. It was suggested that representatives of dental schools be encouraged to attend Board meetings.

Mr. Maloney stated the Board would have the opportunity to comment on Act 6. There was also discussion concerning the opioid prescription training requirement for applicants who are trained outside of

GROODY: 14 15 So we met yesterday in regards to the 16 EFDA programs and the examination, and 17 since the Board's charge is to protect 18 the public, we feel a clinical exam is 19 needed to ensure this. 2.0 Upon reviewing the regulations, the 2.1 EFDA Committee yesterday discussed ways 2.2 to make the testing more comprehensive. 2.3 Plus, this process mirrors the dentist 2.4 and dental hygienist examinations. 25 Therefore, the committee recommends the Board amend the Regulation Section 33.103, which is Examinations (c): Expanded function dental assistants, the way it's worded now, it says candidates for certification shall pass a written examination acceptable to the Board.

So our goal is to match the wording in (a) and (b), which is Dentist and Dental Hygienist Examinations. So our direct wording as a committee to present to you today is that candidates for certification shall pass a written and expanded function dental assisting examination—clinical by CDCA or its successor or similar testing agency approved by the Board.

We also would like to amend (d) to include the EFDA in the clinical section of that wording.

So to that end, I'd like to open discussion and perhaps make a motion to add this to the current general revision package.

There was discussion concerning the suggested language.

You don't have to be in a new one. That will also allow later for public comment on it, so it's not like it's something that's being snuck in at the eleventh hour.

[The committee decided to move in the direction of quality control. There was discussion concerning the addition of a clinical component so that the competency level could be reviewed rather than just the written exam for EFDAs. It was further noted that Ohio was the only state that has the clinical exams.] CHAIRPERSON ERHARD:
