18 Report of Board Counsel - Regulations

19 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a
20 Status of Regulations Report for the Board's review.

21 He noted the anesthesia update for Regulation 16A-
22 4621 and the policy statement regarding the use of
23 botulinum toxin for Regulation 16A-4622.

24 Mr. Rouse mentioned that the Board has a
25 Regulatory Committee that would discuss the

1 regulations at a public meeting and suggested the
2 committee decide on a date before the September 9
3 Board meeting.

4 The Regulatory Committee would decide on a date,
5 develop an agenda, and work in collaboration with the
6 Board administrator and counsel to try to prioritize
7 the expanded function dental assistant (EFDA)
8 regulations moving forward.

9 Mr. Rouse noted the Board voted on the Annex for
10 Regulation 16A-4635 regarding licensure by
11 endorsement. He drafted the Regulatory Analysis Form
12 and the preamble, which is an introductory statement
13 regarding the need for the regulation of licensure by
14 endorsement and the regulation impact on licensees.
15 He mentioned the importance of moving the entire
16 regulatory package forward and having a proposed
17 rulemaking package so stakeholders can see the full
18 package.

19 Dr. Jaspan commented that the Board has
20 determined on a case-by-case basis that a general
21 practice residency is not substantially equivalent to
22 a physical test with criteria and asked whether the
23 language could be revised to make it more definite to
24 avoid problems when a person from New York wants to
25 be licensed in Pennsylvania. He also referred to a

1 current case, where there is an appeal of a residency
2 decision on New York and believed it to be better to
3 head off the appeal process from New York in the
4 future.

5 Mr. Rouse stated, when the Board reviews the
6 application, the Board determines whether that
7 state's regulations are substantially equivalent to
8 Pennsylvania and then makes that determination. He
9 noted the stakeholders would be able to review the
10 document and make written comments once the proposed
11 regulatory package is open to the public.]

12 MR. ROUSE:

6 Report of Board Counsel - Miscellaneous - Follow-up
7 to

8 the Commission on Dental Competency Assessment's
9 (CDCA's) May 13, 2022 Presentation and Review of
10 Typodonts

11 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred to
12 the May 13, 2022 Commission on Dental Competency
13 Assessment presentation by Dr. Benjamin Wall and Ms.
14 Kimber Cobb from the Commission on Dental Competency
15 Assessment-Western Regional Examining Board regarding
16 the American Board of Dental Examiners (ADEX)
17 simulated patient examination for dental and dental
18 hygienists.

19 Chairman Casey commented that the one hygiene
20 typodont and three restorative typodonts that were
21 delivered appear to be acceptable for the
22 examination. Kimber Cobb, RDH, BS, National
23 Director, Licensure Acceptance and
24 Portability/Director of Dental Hygiene Examinations,
25 Commission on Dental Competency Assessment-Western

1 Regional Examining Board, informed everyone that she
2 and Dr. Wall provided performance data and the
3 current acceptance data for the typodont, along with
4 the samples and offered to answer questions
5 concerning the typodonts for acceptable licensure
6 results on a long-term basis.

7 Ms. Murray addressed her experience as a grader
8 three times for the dental hygiene SimProDH and
9 experience proctoring an exam at one of the dental
10 hygiene schools. She referred to the dental hygiene
11 SimProDH and explained that the magnetic piece is
12 mounted and then there is a shield that simulates a
13 head, along with a shroud that is put around it that
14 mimics the cheek and tongue and everything in there.

15 She noted it is up to the hygiene site as to whether
16 they want to utilize ultrasonics or not.

17 Ms. Murray mentioned that students were not
18 utilizing ultrasonics at the site she was at but were
19 hand scaling, noting the calculus definitely did very
20 much mimic an actual patient.

21 Ms. Murray commented that it is the ideal
22 standardized test for dental hygiene students or
23 anybody who wanted to get another license. She
24 reported the failure rate appears to represent what
25 was presented by the CDCA and believed it to be a

1 valid test, where the people taking the exam still
2 had to adhere to infection control and operator
3 positioning.

4 Dr. Sullivan addressed prior Board discussion
5 about including the Objective Structured Clinical
6 Examination (OSCE) with the typodont exam. She
7 mentioned the importance of including the OSCE, which
8 is a written exam, when voting on whether or not to
9 accept the manikin for the hygiene exam because the
10 clinical part is not sufficient.

11 Mr. Rouse read a comment in chat from Dr. David
12 Hershkowitz, Division Chief of Restorative Dentistry
13 at the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental
14 Medicine/CDCA examiner, where he believed the
15 typodonts mimic calculus and real caries and are
16 ideal testing metrics when compared to using human
17 subjects. Mr. Rouse read a comment, where Sarah
18 said there is an OSCE/CSCE exam that all dental
19 hygiene students in Pennsylvania take to pass
20 licensure.

21 Mr. Rouse read a comment from Rachel Coffee MS,
22 RDH, Director of Dental Health, Luzerne County
23 Community College, asking whether OSCE would replace
24 the Computer Simulated Clinical Examination (CSCE) or
25 whether there would be four exams for dental hygiene

1 students.

2 The Computer Simulated Clinical Examination
3 (CSCE) is the OSCE, because it is the CSCE/OSCE for
4 dental hygiene and not an additional exam but
5 administered along with the psychomotor clinical
6 section.

7 Chairman Casey referred to the restorative
8 typodont, noting there were no preparations but
9 looked to be acceptable and very similar to the
10 hygiene typodont.

11 Dr. Sullivan addressed her experience observing
12 an exam and agreed that the tooth is very lifelike.
13 She mentioned new developments, where students used
14 to be told which tooth the decay was on but are now
15 given an X-ray and making a diagnosis of which tooth
16 and what surfaces.

17 Dr. Groody commented that having a prep typodont
18 would have been better for people to touch and see,
19 and the decay cannot really be examined because it is
20 not a prep.

21 Dr. Jaspán referred to the hygiene model and soft
22 tissue component. There was a discussion as to
23 tissue lacerations being compared to a live patient.

24 Mr. Rouse noted the matter would be brought back to
25 the next Board agenda.

1 Ms. Cobb suggested the Board inform her of any
2 additional requests from the testing agencies prior
3 to the next meeting, so the information is available
4 for discussion.]

5

6 Report of Board Counsel - Miscellaneous - Scam Alert
7 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed
8 everyone that the Bureau of Professional and
9 Occupational Affairs (BPOA) received reports that
10 persons pretending to be from one of the health-
11 related boards are contacting licensees by phone and
12 mail about the status of their licenses.

13 Mr. Rouse noted scammers are altering information
14 on caller ID to appear to be from the Commonwealth of
15 Pennsylvania and threatening license suspension for
16 failure to act and falsely claiming involvement with
17 federal agencies, such as the Federal Bureau of
18 Investigation (FBI) and the Drug Enforcement
19 Administration (DEA).

20 Mr. Rouse stated scammers are known to threaten
21 license suspension for failure to provide personal
22 information and provided reminders from BPOA
23 concerning contact and personal information for
24 licensees.

25 Mr. Rouse noted licensees would never be

1 contacted by phone for payment. He reminded everyone
2 to not give personal or financial information over
3 the phone. He mentioned that those who are the
4 subject of an investigation or disciplinary action
5 will receive notice by certified mail and/or personal
6 service and are provided with a contact name and
7 phone number. He informed everyone to contact their
8 local police department or the Pennsylvania State
9 Police if they have been a victim of the scam.

10 Chairman Casey recommended providing the scam
11 alert information to dental and dental hygiene
12 organizations to alert their members.

13 Ms. Sizemore informed everyone of the Office of
14 Attorney General Scam Unit and encouraged anyone who
15 experiences a scam to also contact their office in
16 addition to the other resources for further
17 assistance.]

8 participating remotely. She wanted to provide
9 feedback to the folks in administration by reporting
10 difficulty hearing what people were saying because
11 she believed it may be platform-related.

12 Acting Commissioner Claggett explained that the
13 current platform is the only platform approved by the
14 Office of Administration, where there is nothing that
15 can be done and encouraged in-person attendance.]

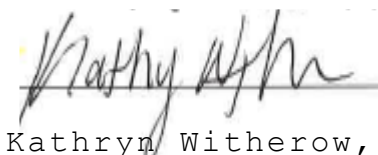
